Plastic Garbage Bags Are Banned

Following the decision by Leichhardt Council at its meeting on April 29 to make a public announcement on the subject of its ban on the use of plastic garbage bags, the Town Clerk (Mr E. A. Bassett) has submitted an advertisement for publication in this issue, together with a copy of the report on the subject by the Municipal Health Surveyor, Mr R. S. Williams.

Mr Williams made the following points in his report:

In August, 1969, the Department of Local Government forwarded Circular No. 2583 to Council stating, inter alia, that Ordinance No. 51 ("Garbage") had been amended.

The amendment provided for the use of plastic bags as an alternative means of garbage disposal to the garbage pans or paper bags then permissible under the Ordinance.

However, whereas paper bags must be supported clear of the ground, the stands and holders for use in conjunction with plastic bags must be so designed that the bottoms of the plastic bags rest on the ground.

The Ordinance added that the question of whether the bags might be used was one for determination in the first instance by the Council.

The choice of the bags as an alternative should be at the option of the individual householder.

Inspection

Mr Williams said that in October last he had received a call from a representative of Union Carbide Aust. Ltd., Sydney, who discussed introduction of his company's product into the municipality.

The plastic bags were sold under the name of "Glad Bags".

He took the representative to the Garbage Transfer Depot to impress upon him the impact the bags would have on treatment of garbage passing through the depot.

Several plastic bags containing garbage were delivered during the inspection, and these did not rupture in the unloading operation, so that the water spray did not reach the contents.

At the depot garbage and refuse was subject to wetting and then compressed in the larger contractor's vehicles to obtain full loads. As the contractor was paid on a ton per mile basis it was important that full loads be maintained.

Mr Williams said that he believed the plastic bags were not immune to animal and rodent attack. Also the householder and the garbage employee were exposed to risk of gashing from jagged glass if contained in the bags.

Disadvantage

He said he could not find any distinct advantage in the use of these plastic bags for standard garbage containers. But he could find disadvantages.

These were that, when placed out for removal and thus not protected by the standard garbage can from which it had been removed, the pack could be ripped by dogs, cats and rats, spilling the contents which in turn could attract vermin such as cockroaches.

There was danger from cuts from broken glass, crockery, etc., in the bags when handling them, and danger of suffocation to small children.

From an economic point of view, they were undesirable in this municipality as their presence in large numbers

would interfere with the efficient handling operations at Council's garbage transfer depot.

After receiving this report, Council (Minute 1891/69) resolved that the use of plastic bags in the municipality be not approved.

In January, 1970, handbills were distributed to householders notifying arrangements for the removal of garbage during holiday periods. A paragraph on this informed householders that the use of plastic bags was not permitted.

Notwithstanding this, the number of residents using plastic bags increased dramatically during March of this year, no doubt the result of TV publicity by the manufacturer.

The company's product was retained in a pack of six green-coloured bags, with plastic strips attached to tie off the bag when full. Each bag cost 7.5 cents.

"Misleading"

Mr Williams said that, according to instructions on the carton, the company was aware that the bags could be damaged.

Its claim that their use was an "approved method" was not a complete statement and was misleading, since Ordinance 51 was quite explicit in its reference to the need of Council approval.

Mr Williams said there was another misleading statement by the company, as its instructions for use made no reference to the requirement in the Ordinance that plastic bags should be used in conjunction with suitable stands or

holders.

The Ordinance said that these should be designed so as to be capable of supporting the bags so that the bottoms of the bags rested on the ground surface, and so that the mouths of the bags could be closed against entry of flies and rain.

The Ordinance also said that the Council might require that stands or holders be fitted with guards to prevent the bags being damaged by animals.

Provision of a stand or holder became an additional cost factor for the user, said Mr Williams, involving probably \$3 to \$5.

Survey

A quick survey of metropolitan councils showed that those who had not approved use of the bags were Marrickville, Leichhardt, and Rozelle.

Woollahra (although accepting paper bags), Fairfield, Hunters Hill, Sutherland, and Sydney City.

Mosman approved, but garbage employees were protesting about their use.

Parramatta would not accept them if they contained broken bottles.

Hornsby approved, but as dogs were ripping them open, Council insisted they be placed in garbage tins.

Botany, Canterbury and Manly would accept only one plastic bag on removal days. Ashfield would remove the bag only when placed in the standard garbage pan.

Mr Williams concluded by suggesting an advertisement in the local newspapers, setting out the full requirements of Ordinance 51 and phrased in a clear message form so that it was easily understood.

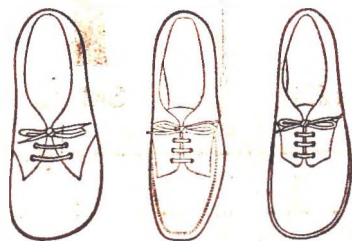

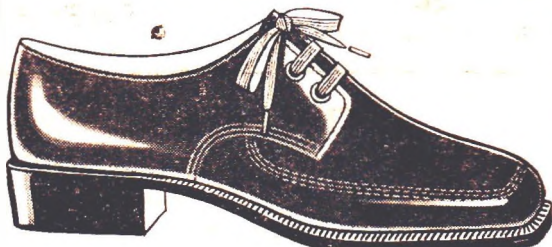

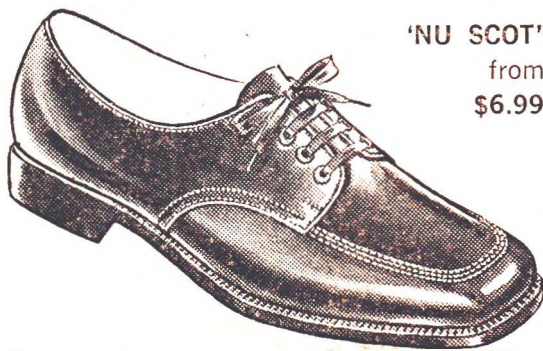

Jaycees Chapter To Be Formed In Balmain Area

Hot on the heels of our critical comment last week lamenting the absence of a Chamber of Commerce in this district comes advice from the organisers that a Junior Chamber of Commerce is now being formed in the Balmain-Rozelle area.

A public meeting to form a local Chapter of the Jaycees is expected to be held in Balmain within the next six weeks.

Mr Robert Colquhoun, solicitor, of Rozelle, has advised "The Link" that discussions have taken place between himself, the relevant area director and the State President of the Jaycees over the past eight weeks in an endeavour to set up the chapter.

He said that a number of young businessmen in the area had indicated that they would be joining the chapter, which should be a boon to the area.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce movement exists in 80 countries and has well over 400,000 members.

There are 20 chapters at the present time in the metropolitan area. The one to be formed at Balmain will be the first one formed this year.

The movement has an age range of 18 to 40, with the bulk of its members being in the group between 21 and 35.

Mr Colquhoun said it provided for self-development of the individual as well as providing for community development.

"The Balmain Jaycees", he said, "intend to survey the area, work out the most pressing needs of the community at the present time, plan a form of action, and strive to have their ideas for the development of the area implemented".

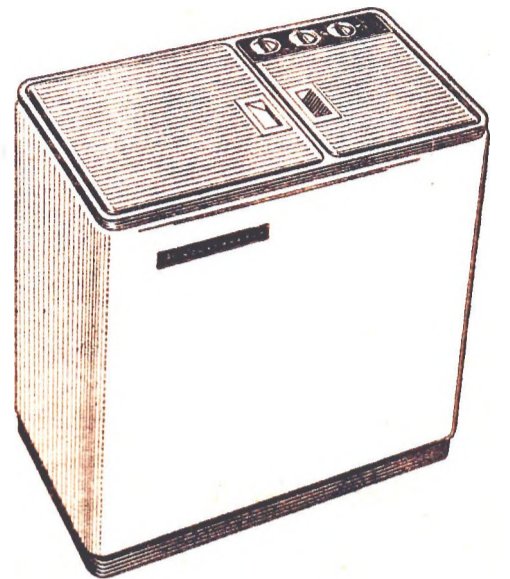

MUNICIPALITY OF LEICHHARDT

Ordinance 51 Garbage Local Government Act, 1919, as amended

The use of plastic bags as garbage pans for the storage and removal of garbage is NOT PERMITTED in the Municipality of Leichhardt.

The packing slip in a dispenser pack containing plastic bags obtainable at retail stores contains misleading information. The packing slip refers to the use of the bags as an APPROVED METHOD under Ordinance 51. The instructions on the dispenser pack make no mention that a suitable stand or holder has to be used if plastic bags are permitted.

Householders are hereby informed that although provision has been made in the Ordinance that plastic bags may be used, such provision is subject to Council approving their use.

Council pursuant to its power under Ordinance 51 of the Local Government Act, 1919, as amended, has prohibited the use of plastic bags as garbage containers.

The standard garbage pan to be used in the Municipality must be cylindrical in shape, water-tight with a cover fitting as closely as possible and not exceed 2 cubic feet in capacity (a garbage pan being 18 inches high and 14 inches in diameter has an approximate cubic capacity of 2 cubic feet).
