# Argument About Big Building Continues

**The question of Leichhardt Council giving permission to storage interests to use the vast empty building at the foot of Church Street, Balmain, which has been strongly opposed by Balmain aldermen and some local residents, is still in the melting pot.**

Despite the State Planning Authority's expressed view that Council should refuse the development application, Council at its last meeting referred the matter to its solicitor for legal advice.

In doing so it defeated a move by the Balmain aldermen to reject the application.

Recently Council approved a development application by John-fletcher (Customs Agents) Pty. Ltd. for use of the property facing the whole of the south-eastern frontage of Church Street, Balmain, between Curtis Road and Cameron St.

The company wants to use this for the storage of ship's stores of a non-toxic, non-hazardous nature in connection with the company's business as Customs agents.

## Approval

On February 3 Council decided to refer the company's application to the State Planning Authority for its views, and to inform the S.P.A. that Council was prepared to approve it subject to the usual conditions regarding working hours and traffic requirements.

At that time Council considered the proposal would not be in the nature of a traffic generator, so that consultation with the Police Department was not required.

However, it would be advisable to refer the app... P.A.

for its views since part of the site was zoned "Waterfront Industrial (W)" in the County of Cumberland Planning Scheme, and a substantial part was in the foreshore protection area under both the C. of C. and the Leichhardt schemes.

On April 14 the State Planning Authority wrote to Leichhardt Council, sending its views.

It noted that any "existing use" rights would appear to have ceased when the previous approved use terminated in 1968.

## Objection

Therefore, as part of the subject land was within a living area zone, where the proposed development was prohibited, it was considered that the Council should refuse the application.

The S.P.A. added, however, that whilst the Council as the responsible interim development authority may have had other desires and approved the use of the building on the suspended portion of the site as a warehouse, due provision should be had of the draft provisions of the Leichhardt Planning Scheme.

In December the Council's Town Planner had stated that Council had decided to formally object to the residential zoning of the area contained in its own Planning Scheme.

In view of the S.P.A.'s

possible appellant role in the event of the Council refusing the application, it would be inappropriate for the Authority to comment on the development proposed.

Commenting on the S.P.A.'s letter, the Council's Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, told Council that it would appear that the question of whether the development application should be approved or not would depend on whether the non-conforming use of the property actually ceased in 1968, or whether it was merely suspended pending the owner's efforts to dispose of the property or obtain a suitable lessee.

In view of the possibility of an appeal to either the Land and Valuation Court or the S.P.A., or both, should Council disapprove the application, it would be advisable to refer the matter to Council's solicitor for advice, and that he be authorised to obtain senior Counsel's opinion if necessary.

He recommended that such action be taken.

## Amendment

Ald. N. Origlass moved an amendment along the lines of the unsuccessful rescission motion in February, that the development application be rejected.

The main points of this were:

The street system linking the wharf areas with Darling Street and Mullens Street would not be capable of meeting the traffic demands of the port facilities in the Mort Bay area.

The applicant company was already a major transporter to and from the A.N.L. overseas Mort Bay terminal, and clearly the proposal would be linked with that.

Noise would be inevitable.

Ald. Origlass claimed that "existing use" did not apply to the owner, and in the circumstances a case could not be built up to the effect that the use was only suspended.

He said it was not a proper case to put to the solicitor because the S.P.A., not the Land and Valuation Court, was the particular tribunal. And the S.P.A. had already given its views on the matter.

The Council majority rejected the amendment, and referred the matter to its solicitor.

## COUNCIL TO MAKE ORDER TO PRESERVE TREES

**To preserve the few trees remaining in the Municipality, Leichhardt Council at its last meeting decided to issue a "Tree preservation order".**

It adopted a Minute recommending such action submitted by the Municipal Engineer, Mr G. A. Wilson.

Mr Wilson said that because of the comparatively few trees still remaining in the municipality he considered Council should take advantage of the provision regarding tree preservation contained in the County of Cumberland Ordinances and Ordinance 41 of the Leichhardt Planning Scheme. This should be done to preserve the existing amenities.

These Ordinances refer to the preservation of any tree, on private property or not, on any land described in such an Order.

The Order would prohibit ring-barking, cutting down, lopping, removing, injuring, or willfully destroying any tree

or trees in the whole of Leichhardt Municipality, except with the consent of Council.

Such consent might be issued subject to such conditions as it thought fit.

The responsible authority issuing such a notice would be required to publish it in the Government Gazette and local newspapers.

Mr Wilson recommended that action be taken accordingly, and his recommendation was adopted.

Observers point out that, while the Leichhardt Planning Scheme is not yet operating, the Court has made it explicit that regard should be had to local schemes even before they have been adopted.

It has leaned heavily in that direction when points have been tested.

## Conditions At Terminal

Recently I had a visit from a lady in Grafton Street.

When I came to Balmain I thought about buying a house in Grafton Street, not because that's my surname, but because in those days it was one of the best streets in the district.

Fortunately the house we wanted was in Vincent Street. From where I live I can see a large part of White Bay (except that blocked by the shed).

My son used to call that "The view blocker".

We are perhaps a quarter of a mile from where the containers are dropped and the steel hammers ring from time to time.

Like many other residents I received the company's list of noise-reducing measures, which came out of discussions with Leichhardt Council.

Now this is quite an impressive document. It sits in my files next to my tape recorder and I wondered when I turned on the tape recorder at 4 a.m. on the day I wrote this what Leichhardt Council had done to make sure these undertakings are carried out.

It's difficult of course to use tape recordings to prove these points, because who can say when and where such recordings are being made? They can be played back loud if you disapprove of the noise, and soft if you want to prove it a mere district rattle of progress.

The lady who came to

see me told me that she had telephoned an organiser of the Balmain A.L.P., who first asked her: "What are the politics of the people in Grafton Street?"

One could ask: what is the religion or colour of A.L.P. members? The people in Grafton Street have only the politics of Grafton Street—"To live and let live". Someone, however, throws things.

These things that go over the fence come down sometimes on workers' cars on the container terminal, and of course, as in all war-like acts, the man whose car is damaged may be a quiet, sober sort of chap who likes fishing on Sunday and beer with the joint.

Just like the folk in Grafton Street.

So the noise gets worse and the maverick throwing, not necessarily by residents of the aforementioned street, gets worse.

Now this affects a much larger group of people in a much more complicated way.

Noise injures industrial efficiency, puts more wear and tear on plant, also leads to protests and wasted paper and promises.

## YOUR OPINIONS

It also leads to industrial deafness, which is a growing problem with some large authorities, in that industrial deafness can in turn lead to expensive compensation claims.

Noise also makes hell of the lives of a few poor souls in Grafton Street, who to my knowledge are Australians like most workers in the port of Sydney.

So it seems that unions should act to protect members from industrial noise by seeing that the aforementioned but now phoney rules be kept—even if it does slow up shipping, and that the men from down below send representatives to a discussion with people of Grafton Street to agree that, if residents reports maverick bombers to the police, the workers on the port will see to it that clangers are not dropped when baby is just getting his early bottle.

## NOISE OVER INNER SUBURBS FROM LOW-FLYING PLANES

The Federal Member for Grayndler, Mr. F. Daly, M.H.R., asked the Minister for Civil Aviation in the House of Representatives recently to investigate the problem of noise from aircraft flying low over the suburbs in his electorate.

The suburbs are Leichhardt, Annandale, Petersham, Newtown, Marrickville, Sydenham, St. Peters, Erskineville and Lewisham.

Speaking to the Adjournment, Mr Daly said the electorate would be right in the flight path of planes entering and leaving Mascot.

He was concerned with the increased traffic over this district recently. It had intensified in a way that was difficult to understand.

He asked the Minister (Senator Cotton) what instructions had been given to pilots regarding their arrival and departure from Mascot aerodrome.

Had they been instructed to fly over residential areas or to avoid them wherever possible? Had they been told to use the entry from the sea, or were they given no instructions at all?

Mr Daly said he had gained the impression from complaints he had received from people living right under the flight

path that if instructions had been given to pilots to safeguard the welfare of people by flying around residential areas, the pilots had ignored these or not carried them out.

The district involved was one of the most heavily populated areas in Sydney, and contained many rest homes, factories, aged persons' homes, schools and colleges.

Mr Daly said that no doubt the House of Representatives' Select Committee on Aircraft Noise in due course would bring down appropriate recommendations. In the meantime the people in this district wanted to stay alive.

## COMMUNITY CLOTHING APPEAL

The Lord Mayor of Sydney's Community Clothing Appeal will be launched on June 1.

To continue for one month, the appeal aims to collect all the unwanted clothing in Sydney.

The Smith Family will then distribute the clothes to needy people throughout the metropolitan area.

The Lord Mayor, Ald. L. E. McDermott, said it was unnecessary to emphasise the plight of many thousands of children and adults in Sydney including the aged, the sick and deserted wives and widows with children.

Aged people and children particularly were vulnerable to the cold and many faced the prospect of a bleak winter.

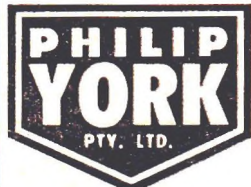

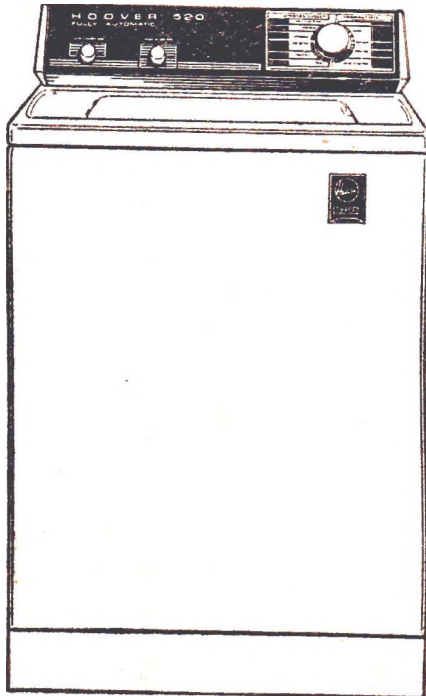

Following Newtown's convincing defeat of Balmain at Henson Park last Saturday, it now seems almost certain that the Tigers can resign themselves to the fact that they will not participate in this season's semi-finals.

At this stage they have only 8 points on the board, and will need to win all but two or three games from here to make the semis.

I can't see them doing it.

Against both Parramatta and Newtown, Balmain lacked penetration and the speed to capitalise on any breaks they did make.

Let's face it: the Tigers simply haven't got the pace in the back line, and without this how can you expect them to

beat teams like Souths and Manly?

Our forwards are on a par with those of any team, but you don't win games now with forwards alone.

### Reasons

The stage is reached now when our selectors will have to ask themselves where the side has been falling down.

Looking back on last season's side you can name players such as "Chicka" Outten, Greg Fryer, Sid Williams, Alan Fitzgibbon, George Ruebner and Paul Cross who helped the Tigers win the premiership.

A few of the players the selectors have consistently chosen in first grade this season have fallen short of the standard expected of them.

These are the men the selectors must now drop, otherwise they'll forfeit any chance they might have of making the four.

### Reminder

Newtown played the more purposeful football and deserved their win.

Even though I, like most other Tiger fans, was convinced that the Tigers would eventually win the game, the Bluebags never gave their supporters any cause to worry.

Balmain had plenty of possession, but couldn't do anything with it.

Being a staunch Tiger supporter, I trust I'll be excused if I don't mention the fine points of Balmain's tussle with Newtown, as it only reminds me of the previous loss to Parramatta.

These are two games we expected to win—yet lost both.
