

Children's Library Plans For Balmain

A library available to all children in the Balmain ward of the municipality will be opened shortly in the restored Watch House, Darling Street, by The Balmain Association. To be conducted by voluntary workers, it will in effect be a gift by the Association to the community as a whole.

A registration fee of 40 cents—which will include automatic two-year membership of the Association—will be charged each child wishing to become a borrower.

The Association's management committee has adopted a report on the subject by the library sub-committee.

The Association is striving to make the opening of the library—to be known as the Balmain Children's Library—coincide with Children's Book Week in August.

Details

In the beginning, the library will be available to all children in the Balmain ward up to the age of entry into High School.

It is hoped to make books available to be read on the premises and to be borrowed for home reading, and to provide story sessions for very young children.

The aim is to build a collection balanced to provide reading for recreation, comprising factual and imaginative literature, and reading for information, at all levels of comprehension from pre-school to the beginning of High School.

The Association believes that this age-limit should be raised as soon as possible.

To begin with, it is proposed to open the library for reading and lending for three hours each Saturday morning.

Later on it is hoped to have after-school sessions several days a week and during school holidays.

Selection

The proposals include the offer of help to readers in use of a library—to give personal aid in the selection of books to delight or teach, or both, and to encourage interest in imaginative literature through informal story sessions and readings.

Books for reading on the premises will be shelved in the cell of the Watch House, where there will be a card catalogue and control desk.

Readers will be able to browse there and take books to read in the exercise yard, where simple furniture will be provided.

Readers will be able to register as borrowers, and then be eligible to borrow one book at a time each for one week. These limits may be changed as experience dictates.

It is proposed to vest the general management of the library in a committee appointed by the management committee.

The library committee will be responsible

for day-to-day running of the library, control of voluntary staff, and selection and care of books.

The staff will be recruited on a voluntary basis.

Ex-library workers and teachers who have knowledge of library techniques would be an asset on the panel of volunteers.

It is hoped also that others of both sexes interested in libraries, books, and above-all in children, will also offer help.

There will be a continuing need for helpers.

The supervisory staff will be rostered according to hours of opening. The others will organise regular working parties for cataloguing and preparation of books at times convenient to them.

Fills Gap

Mr W. Haesler, President of the Association, said the move filled the gap created by failure of Leichhardt Council to honour its election promise to adopt the Libraries Act and establish free libraries in the municipality.

The Association would donate all the books in its library to the Council if and when Council adopted the Act and incorporated in a library in Balmain all the things for which the Association had been striving.

The Mayor (Ald. Rodwell) could not be contacted for comment.

BOY'S CLUB CANTENEN IS OPENED

Thanks to the efforts of its Women's Auxiliary, Balmain Police-Citizens' Boys' Club now has a canteen on its premises.

The boys will no longer have to rely upon a dispensing machine for their drinks, and will not have to leave the Club to buy snacks for themselves.

The canteen, which cost nearly \$4,000, was officially opened on June 17 by the officer in charge of Balmain Police District, Inspector Rasmussen, who unveiled a plaque recording the event.

The Club's secretary-manager, Sergt. George Stone, paid a tribute to the work of the Auxiliary committee (consisting of 14 women), which resulted in the necessary funds being raised.

The canteen will be staffed by volunteers (mainly from the Women's Auxiliary).

Mrs Boykett Is Honoured

All associated with the Balmain Police-Citizens' Boys' Club were delighted when the Queen, in her birthday honours list, awarded the British Empire medal to Mrs Violet Boykett, of Mort Street, Balmain.

Mrs Boykett is secretary of the Club's Ladies' Auxiliary.

She has been working for other people all her life and, in addition to her work at this Club, has worked for the Balmain Hospital, Birchgrove School, and St. John's Church for some years.

Mrs Boykett has been very greatly assisted by her husband, Bob, in all of her charity work, and her award has been well earned.

Column NINE

LIBRARY DISGRACE

Congratulations to The Balmain Association on its children's library plan. It fills part of the gap in community services—although only part.

It really should have been housed in the Balmain Town Hall, say, and provided by Leichhardt Council—not only for young children, but for everybody.

Failure of the aldermen to fulfil their pre-election promise is a disgrace.

All we have got is a Council's Library Committee. "No-Library Committee" would be a better term, it seems.

When it was formed we questioned whether it, along with the "No-Parking Committee", was merely a front to stall off criticism of Council inaction.

It seems to have turned out that way.

Some time ago the Mayor (Ald. Rodwell) said some people were saying they really didn't want a free municipal library.

If they expressed the views of the majority, then people in this municipality are strikingly different from those in the rest of N.S.W., since this is one of the very few areas without a municipal library system.

There are so many families in this municipality on low incomes that it should have been one of the first in the State to make free reading available to the people.

Council denies it has a financial problem (preventing adoption of the Libraries Act.)

Well, what IS the problem? Is it lack of political honour? Cold indifference to the people's needs? Or something we haven't been told.

Come, Mr Mayor, it's time you emerged from your retreat and said something on this matter.

Season's Best Display By The Tigers

**At Kogarah Oval last Sunday Bal-
main unleashed their best display
this season when they thrashed an
under-strength St. George team 26
points to 8.**

Although Artie Beetson was out of Balmain's side, I thought St. George suffered most through the withdrawal of Graeme Langlands and Barry Beath.

Shortly after the start of play Billy Smith was also forced to withdraw.

No doubt these injuries helped weaken St. George, but can't possibly detract from the improved performance of the Tigers, who only the week before had held competition leaders, Manly, to a draw.

Had Balmain displayed this type of football early in the first round there's little doubt they would have been amongst the competition leaders at this stage, instead of having only 11 points to their credit.

Quick Work

St. George were never a threat at any stage. Trailing 10-5 at half-time, they were quickly put out of business in the second half when the Tigers put on two quick tries.

One of these was converted, giving Balmain an unbeatable 18-5 lead.

From this point the Tigers poured on the pressure, and added two more tries to make the tally 6 tries to 2.

I thought the despised full-back Bob Smithies played a blinder. He gave the St. George defence more headaches than a dozen kegs of beer could have.

It was indeed a pleasure to watch his uncanny footwork and acceleration, which time and again cut the Saints' defence to shreds. His passing to supports never once was off line, and all round he had a great game.

Until an injury forced his departure, Terry Parker showed a clean pair of heels to the defence in a number of penetrating runs, and was always looking for his supports.

Impressive

I was very impressed with Olaf Prattl, who had his best game this season. Olaf's low tackling jolted many St. George attacks, and he made some long, penetrating runs, one of which gave George Ruebner a good try.

Peter Fardell at five-eighths gave good service to his back-line, and was responsible for some good backing up. His defence was excellent.

Gary Leo and Barry McTaggart got through a lot of work, as also did Geoff Connell, but all three died with the ball on too many occasions.

Peter Boulton got his team a 50-50 share of the ball, and had his usual strong game in the open.

Although Jack Spencer had a very strong game in both attack and defence, he disappointed me a little by trying to do too much himself.

Quite often he had no chance of getting through the defence, but instead of passing the ball out, he elected to go himself, which is not good team work.

Joe Walsh and "Chicka" Outten did a tremendous amount of tackling, as well as running hard in attack.

Goal-kicking

Another good game by Len Killeen augurs well for the future, although his goal-kicking left a lot to be desired.

A big improvement was noticeable in George Ruebner's game. If he could only regain some of his old determination he'd go a long way in helping Balmain in their almost impossible task of reaching the semis.

Paul Cross wasn't in the game for long, but while there he showed

the selectors what his speed could do by nearly scoring a great individual try.

He kicked ahead after a great run, and narrowly failed to toe the ball over the line for what would have been the day's best try.

The defeat of Balmain's reserve grade team eliminates any chance they had of making the semis. The great pity of this is the consistent try scoring of winger Paul Cross, who added two more to his tally against Saints.

Third grade suffered an unexpected loss, but are still certainties for the semis.

Next week-end Balmain come up against a hot and cold Norths, who could on their day give the Tigers a hard game. Naturally we expect to win this game and so keep alive the slender chance of making the four.

Balmain Property Values Change

Current developments in Balmain, both residential and industrial, are having their effect on the values of residential properties, according to Mr George Parly, a director of the Balmain real estate firm of Boland & Parly Pty. Ltd. Containerisation in itself, he told "The Link" was not detrimentally affecting the values of living areas.

It was the noise of traffic in the Mort Bay area which had its adverse influence on property values there.

On the other hand, values of Balmain properties generally were increasing sharply, for two reasons:

• The "discovery" of the suburb by professional people, artists and students as a desirable place to live in because of its proximity to the city.

• The demand for locations suitable for extensive home unit development.

Mr Parly said there was a very large increase in the values of property of the traditional type—houses which were part of Sydney's and Balmain's history.

These were the two-storey terraces with iron lacework, and big stone houses.

He believed there was a chance of the resumption of the ferry service to Cove Street, which would be of much importance to the area it served.

Boland & Parly Pty. Ltd. has been operating in Balmain for the past 11 months, and has recorded the impressive total of 62 residential property sales valued at over \$1,000,000.

Largest of the sales were home unit sites in Louisa Road and Clifton Street.

WESTERN SUBURBS FOOTBALL

OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOUR JUDGMENT

In a deferred judgment last Friday, Mr Price, S.M., in Balmain Court of Petty Sessions, convicted Mrs Catherine Morris, of 34 Grafton Street, Balmain, on a charge of offensive behaviour in Grafton Street above the container terminal.

She was fined \$15, in default 8 days' imprisonment with hard labour, and was allowed 21 days to pay.

Mrs Morris has lodged notice of appeal.

In evidence at an earlier hearing the Court was told by the arresting constable, Constable Hodgekiss, that about 12.10 a.m. on January 17 he had seen defendant standing near the cyclone fence in Grafton Street, overlooking the terminal.

He saw her bend down, pick up something, and make a round-arm throwing motion towards the fence. He did not see anything leave her hand.

In evidence, Mrs Morris said she was preparing to retire for the night when she heard a noise from the terminal, of the type that took her breath away.

She had gone to the footpath adjoining the wire fence and had called out to the terminal employees "Let up, or I'll send for the police".

Later someone yelled out that the police were coming.

Her cats had followed her out of her home.

She denied throwing anything over the fence, or of making a round-arm throwing motion. She had merely bent down to pick up one of her cats.

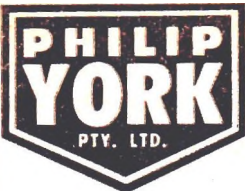

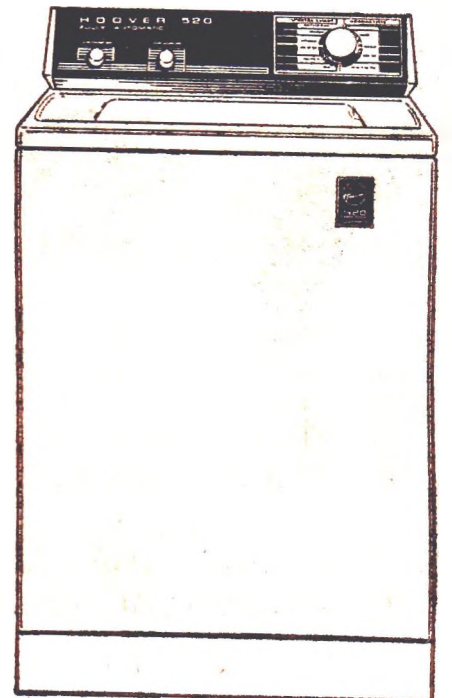
