Plans For Local Jaycees' Chapter

The Junior Chamber of Commerce movement—commonly known as the Jaycees—will get under way in the Balmain-Rozelle area next Wednesday, July 8, when a public meeting in Balmain Town Hall will be held for the purpose of forming a Chapter.

At that meeting it is expected that more than sufficient support required for launching a local Chapter of the Jaycees will be indicated by those in attendance.

Persons interested in joining, who have not already advised the organiser, may apply for membership then.

Mr Robert Colquhoun, solicitor, of Rozelle, who has had a number of discussions with officers of the movement in an endeavour to set up a Chapter, told "The Link" that indications were for very favourable support from young men in the district.

Support

While at least 20 members were required for a Chapter to be officially accepted, he expected that at least 50 prospective new members would be indicated at the initial meeting.

Business houses in Balmain and Rozelle were being contacted to see whether young men working in the area might be interested in joining.

Also, next Saturday the sponsoring body—the Forest Jaycees—would be sending a truck around the streets of the district containing young men wearing green vests and operating a loud hailer.

They would hand out pamphlets and explain the aims and value of the movement to those expressing an interest.

The Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, has agreed to open the meeting in the Balmain Town Hall next Wednesday, which will commence at 7 p.m.

There will be speakers from the Junior Chamber of Commerce organisation to outline the aims and activities of the movement.

Mr David Compton, National Vice-president, will address the meeting on the value of the movement to the individual, and indicate the types of project carried out and the general programme.

The Area Director, Mr Russell Reeves, will discuss the structure of the J.C. movement and how it operates, and another speaker is expected to outline the method of operating a district Chapter.

The formalities will include a motion from the floor of the meeting that a Chapter be formed.

Programme

First meeting of the new Chapter will be held the following week, when office-bearers will be elected, the programme for the year mapped out, and the first project planned.

First ordinary meeting of the Chapter is expected to take place in another week's time, with the induction of the President and of the new members.

Prominent Jaycees will

attend the latter meeting.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce movement operates in 80 countries of the world, and has well over 400,000 members.

In the Sydney metropolitan area there are 20 Chapters. The Balmain-Rozelle Chapter will be the first one formed this year.

The movement has an age range of 18 to 40, with the bulk of members in the 21-35 age group.

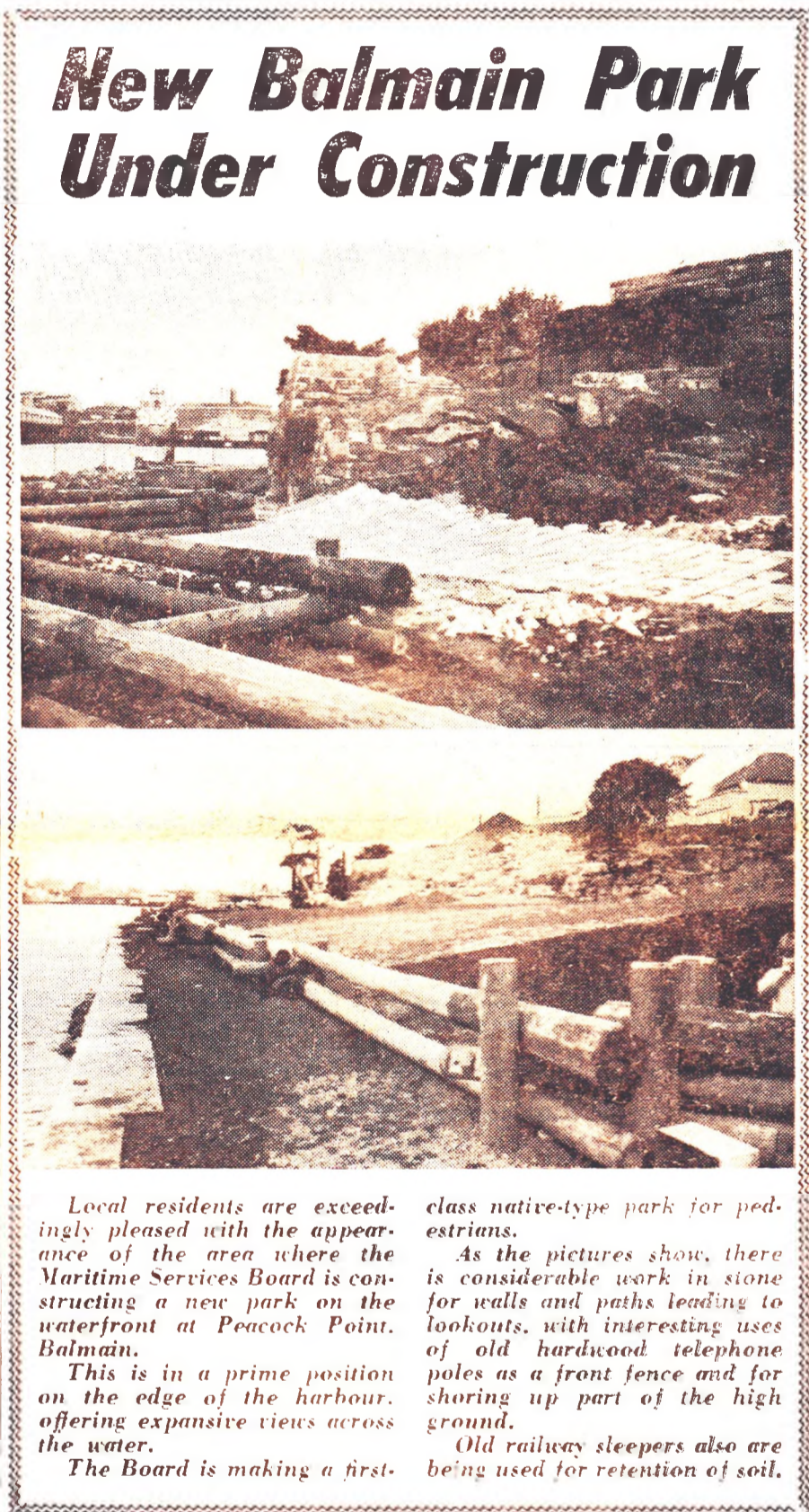
It provides for self-development of the individual as well as for community development.

Mr Colquhoun said the local Chapter intended to survey the area, work out the most pressing needs, plan a form of action, and strive to implement its ideas for development of the area.

CAR TRIALS ON ROADS

Amid tremendous publicity ballyhoo, a large number of cars are being tested over great sections of out-back Australia in yet another so-called Round - Australia Trial.

This sort of thing appeals to a section of the people who regard motor sport involving high speed as their main interest in life.

It appeals especially to young men, particularly before and around the time of acquiring their first car.

While admitting this appeal, this paper desires to ask some pertinent questions on the subject.

Are the Australian police authorities satisfied that this activity on public roads is in the public interest?

Are the various Ministers of Transport aware of the strong antipathy held by many people towards trials involving high speeds on ordinary roads—many unsuitable for such driving?

Are Governments content to see encouragement by the motor industry of the type of driving which acts as a shocking example to young people, and which must kill official safety campaigns before they start?

What is gained by such an event, except publicity for the winning makes of cars and certain brands of petrol?

Isn't it largely luck that brings in the winning car team?

This paper feels that the urge to pit one's driving skill against another's should be confined to race tracks and closed circuits.

Motor sport should spread the spirit of skill with safety. In the round-Australia type of trial the exact opposite appears to be the case.

Council Acts On Traffic And Noise Problems

Protective action on behalf of Balmain residents against industrial nuisances was reported at a recent meeting of Leichhardt Council, when two matters under discussion for some time were mentioned.

These were the use of views. The big derelict building in Church Street, and the question of smoke and noise at the Howard Smith ship repair terminal in Birchgrove.

The big building faces the whole of the south-eastern frontage of Church Street, Balmain, between Curtis Road and Cameron Street.

Council has already approved a development application by Johnfletcher (Customs Agents) Pty. Ltd. for use of this property for the storage of ship's stores.

The application, however, after being referred to the State Planning Authority, is now being considered by the Council's solicitor in regard to the question of "existing use" rights.

Warehouse

Another application for permission to develop the property has been made to Council — by Tradex Transport Pty. Ltd.

This company sought to use it for warehousing, overnight parking of trucks, refuelling of trucks, and light servicing in connection with its business of international and interstate forwarders and Customs agents.

Council had referred the application to the Police Department and the S.P.A. for their

The Police Department urged Council to reject the application on traffic grounds.

It said that although there was no objection in principle to use of the building as a transport terminal, the proposed access arrangements were sub-standard and would create traffic problems on the adjacent street system.

The State Planning Authority drew attention to its letter to Council on April 14 concerning the development application of Johnfletcher (Customs Agents) Pty. Ltd. in respect of the same land.

Its views then expressed would appertain to the Tradex application.

On the recommendation of the Council's Town Planner (Mr A. Kenna), Council decided to disapprove of the Tradex application.

Mr Kenna said that the police views coincided with his own in regard to traffic considerations, and that the proposed use would cause injury to the amenity of the neighbourhood due to the emission of noise and vibration.

He said the proposal would increase the already large volume of heavy transport vehicles using the narrow, quiet residential streets in the

locality. The proposed vehicular access arrangements were sub-standard, and would create traffic problems in the adjacent street system.

Council received a report from its Smoke Abatement Advisory Panel on the subject of conditions at Howard Smith Industries' enterprise in Birchgrove.

It referred to a letter from the Secretary of the Maritime Services Board concerning smoke and noise from vessels berthed at the yards.

He said the recently gazetted Port Authority Smoke Control Regulations covered the question of smoke discharged from ships generally.

As regards noise, the Board intended to include a provision in the company's lease which would require it to comply with a certain standard.

The standard of noise on board a ship located at the leased premises would be laid down as the same standard applied by the Council acting within its powers at land within the municipality contiguous to the leased property.

A Query

The M.S.B. secretary added: "It will be noted that in both cases of nuisance raised, the Board has made decisions which permit of action being taken either under the Board's regulations or by the Council itself, when the level of smoke or noise emission exceeds definite standards".

The attitude of the Panel was that in effect the M.S.B.'s letter sought Council's co-operation in the matters raised.

However, Council thought clarification was required of the last paragraph of the Board's letter regarding action either under the Board's regulations or by the Council itself.

The question seemed to be whether Council was thus being enabled to move into the sphere of action formerly available solely to the M.S.B.

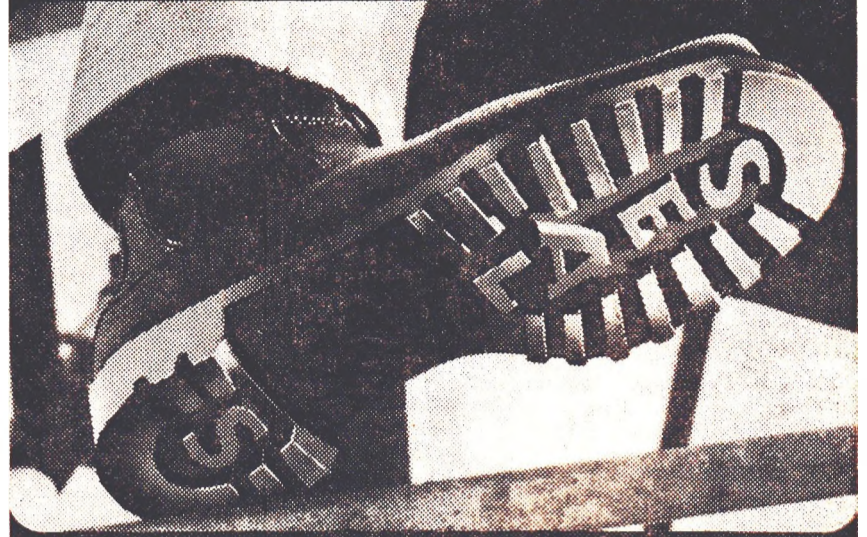
