# Terminal Noise: Combined Meeting

**A meeting was held in Balmain last week between local residents and union delegates on the subject of the White Bay container terminal noise. It was organised by Ald. N. Origlass, supported by his two fellow Balmain ward aldermen.**

The action followed publication in "The Link" of a letter signed by representatives of five trade unions employed at the Seatainer terminal at White Bay.

In this the writers declared their readiness to meet Balmain people to discuss and formulate a common policy designed to alleviate the noise problem.

The letter was written after the ending of the strike at the terminal over the subject of car parking.

Ald. Origlass organised the meeting following refusal of Leichhardt Council to do so, and failure of Mr R. Degen, M.L.A., to take any action in the matter.

About 30 people attended the meeting, including three union delegates from the Waterside Workers' Federation, Federated Clerks Union, and Waterside Workers' Federation (Mechanical).

The union men are participants in a combined unions' committee on the terminal site, as well as being delegates from their own unions.

## Letter

Ald. Origlass was chairman of the meeting. Aldermen I. Wyner and A. Graham also were present.

The meeting authorised Ald. Origlass to write to authorities concerning presentation of

views on the noise problem.

Ald. Origlass has written to 20 different persons and authorities — the Premier (Mr Askin), local Federal and State Members of Parliament, Leichhardt Council, various Government Departments, shipping lines and trade unions.

In his letter he said that the meeting had authorised him to advise of the inauguration of a movement based on co-operation between terminal workers and the Balmain residents for a joint objective: alleviation of the noise problem.

## Urgency

He said the meeting was unanimous in the view that siting the terminal at White Bay made it economically non-viable and therefore subversive of the national interest properly appraised, as evidenced by the fact that the container next wanted was more often than not located at the bottom of a five-high stack.

"No longer is anyone prepared to attempt a justification of the siting of the terminal and the large expenditure of public money sunk in it", he said.

"Consequently the residents, whose special interest is restoration of their living area amenity, assert that early cessation of container terminal

operations at White Bay would serve both the local and the national interest".

Ald. Origlass said the meeting had requested that urgent action be taken to mitigate those noises arising from the terminal operations at White Bay.

He said residents recognised that their long-continuing protest, agitation and petitioning of the local Council had resulted in ameliorative action in respect of some noise emissions.

This encouraged the belief that it was now firmly established that a heavy responsibility for remedial action weighed on violators of the living area amenity.

## Measures

The meeting had called for the following:

- Elimination of the third shift (commencing 11 p.m.).
- Curtailment of crane-driving tuition to daylight hours only.
- Silencing of large diesel vehicle (DEMAG).
- Muffling of noisy bell on new portainer, crane warning sirens, and new internal transfer of vehicles (I.C.Vs.).
- Elimination of hammering at night.
- Fitting of pads on railway wagons, and on

## ARMY'S UNIT IN BALMAIN



The Army's display and information unit is visiting Balmain for eight days, ending next Saturday, July 11.

Led by a Careers Adviser, Warrant Officer Laurie Morrison, the unit includes a 35 ft. long caravan containing an up-to-date display of today's Army.

Major Max Turrell, the Army Careers Officer for N.S.W., said that the displays would cover a wide variety of items, including prestige colour photographs of Army activities at home and overseas.

These ranged from the latest Australian weapons and weapons captured from the Vietcong in South Vietnam, to a selection of military decorations (including the Victoria Cross) on loan from the Australian War Memorial.

It will be located at 275 Darling St., Balmain.

The team will answer questions about the display, and advise on

Major Turrell said that parents generally associated today's Army with the World War 2 concept, and were not fully aware of career opportunities now available.

These covered apprentice, adult trade training and officer careers through Duntroon and Portsea.

In view of this, a special invitation was extended to parents to view the display and discuss with the team their children's career prospects.

top of containers to prevent noise in five-high stacking.

- Elimination of noises associated with use of bolster and/or securing pins in railway wagons.

- Elimination of train coupling and uncoupling noises at night, and of speeding and of revving of motors at night.

- An end to noisy emission of steam from ships, use of shore power to eliminate noise of generators on ships, and elimination of other offensive noises from ships (such as use of public address systems).

The letter said residents would appreciate early receipt of comments on the points made (as well as initiation of remedial action where appropriate) for presentation to a further meeting to be advertised for July 22.

Ald. Origlass said it was resolved also to extend a cordial invitation to the addressees or their representatives to attend that meeting with the assurance that the appropriate courtesies would prevail.

## No Council Action On Workers' Noise Offer

Leichhardt Council at its last meeting refused to show any interest in the offer made by workers at the White Bay container terminal to meet Balmain people to discuss the question of terminal noises.

Ald. Origlass (Balmain Ward) moved suspension of the standing orders to discuss a motion on the subject.

This was: That Council welcome the offer made by workers' representatives (as published in "The Link") to meet local residents to discuss and formulate a common policy to be placed before Seatainer Terminals Ltd. and the Maritime Services Board with the joint objective of alleviating the noise problem.

That Council ask residents of the area to meet with the workers' representatives, under the chairmanship of the Mayor.

The motion was rejected.

Earlier, when confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting was being moved, Ald. Ori-

glass criticised the Town Clerk (Mr E. A. Bassett) on the wording of the minute concerning the motion of urgency proposed by Ald. Origlass.

This concerned the strike by workers at White Bay container terminal over the issue of car parking at the terminal.

Ald. Origlass pointed out that the wording of his motion had not been included, although it had been supplied by him in writing at that meeting.

He said Council would find itself in serious trouble if a proper record of its business was not kept.

## Legacy Art Exhibition

The art exhibition in aid of Five Dock Torch Bearers for Legacy, at the Five Dock R.S.L. Club, was an unqualified success.

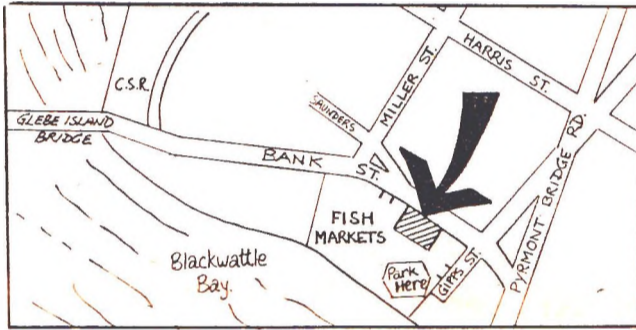

# Part Time Nurses Help Solve Hospital Problem

While Balmain Hospital is still in need of trainee nurses, its nursing staff problem is being overcome fairly well with the employment of additional trained staff, some of whom are married women working part time at the institution.

The matron, Miss J. MacLaren, reports that like all hospitals, Balmain is experiencing some difficulty in securing trainee nurses.

The reasons are varied, but a major one is the introduction of the three-year training period, compared with the four-year training formerly in operation.

At Balmain, however, the new arrangements, which include part-time work by nurses who are now married women with families, are filling the gap fairly well.

Some work for two or three days a week,

others are working from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily, and others are on either afternoon or night duty.

## Defeatist

At one time the hospital would employ only full-time nurses.

Miss MacLaren said that this policy was a way of overcoming the staff problem without closing wards.

The demand "Close some wards" made in some quarters to solve the problem because of lack of trainee nurses was a defeatist attitude.

She added that girls

who enrolled at Balmain Hospital as trainee nurses received excellent training.

The hospital was a successful training school for general and midwifery nursing, and a satisfying place for the enrolment of nursing aides.

As a result of more trained nurses being available, some of the more practical work formerly done by trainees—such as dressings and treatment of patients in the wards—was now being done by trained nurses.

They were giving "total patient care", instead of spending much time on clerical or supervisory duties.

"Many of the trained nurses say 'I would love that' when the position is put to them", said matron.

"Most nurses fundamentally want to perform patient care rather than supervisory work".

## Graduation Ceremony

Balmain Hospital's nurses' graduation ceremony was held on June 24.

Lady Woodward, wife of the former Governor of N.S.W., presented the girls with their certificates and badges.

General graduates numbered 13, midwifery six, and nursing aides 12.

They included Marilyn Davis, who received a silver proficiency medal. She gained third place in the N.S.W. Nurses' Registration Board's final examination.

Mrs J. Wakefield, Vice-president of the Hospital Board, acted as chairman in the absence of the President, Mr W. F. Pinerua (who is recovering from his illness).

Addressing the nurses, Lady Woodward said their aims must at all times be high and the welfare of the patient must at all times be a prime consideration.

# MORE FORESHORE PRESERVATION SOUGHT BY S.P.A.

The State Planning Authority considers that the proposed development of the former Council-owned land at Balmain East should be amended to provide for more harbour foreshore preservation.

A letter to Leichhardt Council giving this view was outlined at last Council meeting.

The S.P.A. was discussing the land now being sold to Karl Developments Pty. Ltd. for high density housing development.

It told Council it intended to purchase one portion of the land in order to extend Thornton Park, and that Council should take action to close the bottom end of Lookes Avenue and to extend the foreshore reserve.

Council decided to inform the S.P.A. that it had agreed to sell the land, and that the Authority's approach should be made to the developers.

A motion by Alderman Origlass, seconded by Ald. Wyner, that consideration of the matter be deferred, was voted down.

Ald. Origlass said the Balmain aldermen expressed disquiet about the manner in which Council had handled this important matter.

He said a copy of the S.P.A.'s letter had not been made available to the aldermen most concerned (the Balmain aldermen), and that its terms had merely been presented verbally to the meeting by the Town Clerk.

He added that Council would find it difficult to proceed with the development in disregard of the S.P.A.

## Play Centre For Balmain In Holidays

Balmain is to have an official Education Department play centre during next midsummer school vacation.

Leichhardt Council last meeting, on the motion of Aldermen Newton and Keating (Leichhardt Ward), decided that this year there would be three play centres in the Municipality.

The Education Department will be advised accordingly.

These will be at Leichhardt School, Jubilee Oval (Glebe) and Gladstone Park (Balmain).

These official play centres have been in operation for some years, and depend upon the co-operation and financial assistance of the local Council.

They will be operating between January 4 and January 22 next, inclusive.

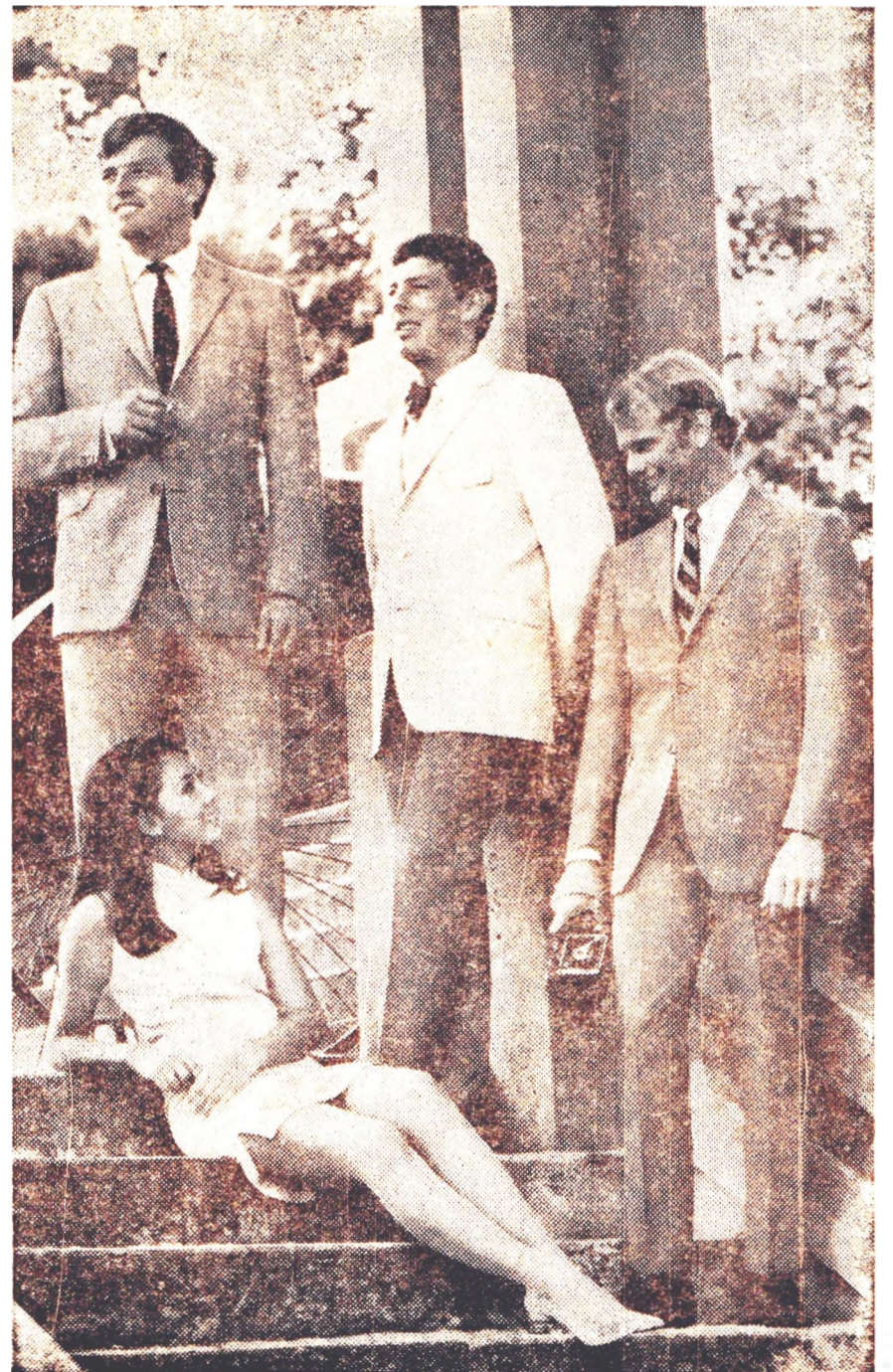
