Jaycees Set Up New Chapter In Balmain

The Balmain-Rozelle Chapter of the Junior Chamber of Commerce was formed at a public meeting in Balmain Town Hall last Wednesday night, with an indicated nucleus of 30 members. A provisional committee of ten local young men was elected to set procedure in motion.

The support given at the meeting and that promised by some who had forwarded apologies for not being able to attend is regarded by the sponsors, and by the organiser, Mr Robert Colquhoun, as a reasonable foundation.

It is anticipated that the first general meeting of the Chapter members will be held within a fortnight. Information regarding membership may be secured from Mr Colquhoun, who is a Rozelle solicitor (phone 82-0419), or from Mr Brian Walshe, Immediate Past President of the Forest Jaycees, and chairman of the Extension Committee sponsoring the formation (phone 28-2431).

The provisional committee is holding its first meeting this week, with the whole plan for the future activities of the new Chapter will be worked out. It is expected that the Chapter will have a dinner meeting once a month. Other than the joining fee, it is anticipated there will be no costs associated with membership, as

funds for the Chapter's community projects will be raised from outside sources.

Meeting

About 40 persons attended the meeting in the Town Hall when the Chapter was formed.

It was opened by Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain, who recommended the Jaycees' aims to the community and to those present.

He stressed the two main platforms of the movement, which were self-development of members, and community service.

Mr Degen quoted specifically from the Jaycees' creed, that service to humanity was the best work of life.

The meeting was then addressed by Mr David Crompton, Executive Vice-president for Development of Australian Junior Chambers of Commerce, one of the four top Jaycees in Australia.

He spoke of the aims and ideals of the movement and what it had done for him personally. He acknowledged that he would not have been in the business position

he now held—a senior executive with an aircraft building company—without his attachment to the Jaycees.

The meeting was then shown a film, "Young Men on the Move", produced by the Australian Jaycees, in which all the actors were Jaycees.

A colour film, it ran for 26 minutes and traced the progress of one Jaycee from the time he joined until he went to his first national convention.

Projects

Those attending were impressed by the account in the film of some major world projects undertaken by the movement.

These included aid provided in Hong Kong for refugees from China (in aid of which the Australian Jaycees raised funds for the provision of a floating clinic and two mobile clinics).

The meeting was then addressed by Mr Garry Allen, Past Zone President of Forest Jaycees and a national office bearer.

He spoke of Chapter activity and achievements that could come from the ideas of one young man. These included the introduction in Australia of the system of provisional motor car drivers ("P" plates).

The Balmain-Rozelle Chapter of the Junior Chamber of Commerce is the first Chapter formed this year in the Sydney metropolitan area. There are 20 chapters in the

Column NINE

Industry, Or Homes?

Leichhardt Council had no option but to swallow its pride and accept the legal advice it sought on industrial use of the great derelict building in Church Street, Balmain.

This was that most of the site (a prime spot for residential development) could not be used for industry, and the remainder should not.

Use of this site for major home development was urged precisely two years ago by "The Link", without support from anybody (including local aldermen or Mr Degen, Member for Balmain).

There have been some extraordinary gyrations in Leichhardt Council policy on this matter—a yes-no attitude that the local aldermen have been quick to attack.

The Balmain aldermen are naturally cock-a-hoop at the Council's unwilling endorsement of their "Homes before industry".

While the faceless men of Leichhardt Council's Caucus apparently say this is an industrial area and will have to put up with considerable intrusion of industry, they still flirt with local opinion by actively encouraging residential development in the more favoured sections.

The Balmain aldermen, of course, should now pull up their socks and stifle the criticism from some quarters that their role remains deeply negative (for removal of big industry) rather than positive (active work to interest housing developers).

Mr Degen must do the same thing, to overtake two years of failure to take action on this very matter.

We hope the sorry business will soon be settled finally by rezoning, followed by major housing moves.

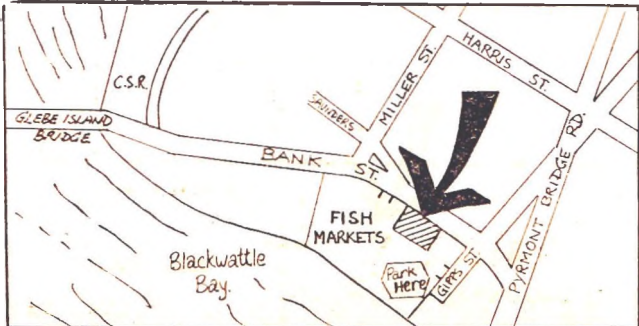

COUNCIL DISAPPROVES PLAN TO USE BIG BALMAIN BUILDING

Leichhardt Council has decided, after receiving legal advice, that it will not approve the development application by Johnfletcher (Customs Agents) Pty. Ltd. for use of the vast empty building at the foot of Church Street, Balmain, which has been strongly opposed by Balmain aldermen and some local residents.

This question has been in the melting pot for some time.

The company wanted to use the building for the storage of ship's stores of a non-toxic, non-hazardous nature in connection with the company's business as Customs agents.

Recently the Council ignored the expressed view of the State Planning Authority that Council should refuse the application, and rejected a move by the Balmain aldermen to have the application refused.

Having previously advised the S.P.A. that it was prepared to approve the application, Council decided on May 19 to refer the matter to its solicitor for legal advice.

"Existing Use"

It did so after receiving a report from the Council's Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, suggesting that course in view of doubts about any "existing use" rights.

Mr Kenna said the question to decide was whether the non-conforming use of the property actually ceased in 1968, or whether it was merely suspended pending the owner's efforts to dispose of the property or obtain a suitable lessee.

At its last meeting, Council decided to disapprove of the application for reasons stated in the legal opinion by barrister Mr B. O'Keefe, forwarded by the Council's solicitor, Mr V. M. Pike.

Mr O'Keefe pointed out that the land in question was previously used by Morts Dock, which went into liquidation in 1959; then sold to Albert G. Sims Ltd.; and thereafter part of it was leased to B.M.C. The premises were vacated in 1968.

Residential

Mr O'Keefe's view was that "existing rights" had ceased. He agreed with the opinion of the S.P.A. that Council should refuse the application.

He said it seemed that the subject land had much to commend it as a site for comprehensive residential development. It was a significant but isolated industrial salient intruding into an otherwise residential surrounding.

The structures on the land were not so valuable as to prevent redevelopment for residential purposes being effected within the limits of proper economics.

The ultimate removal of the high structures on

the land, he added, would open up the view of the water for the land behind the subject land and result in a vast improvement in the residential amenity of the neighbourhood and help in the visual amenity from the water.

Council might not, and should not, approve the application on that part of the land at present zoned "Living area" under the County of Cumberland scheme.

Further, the proposed development would conflict with the draft local scheme when adopted, and it would be inconsistent with the public interest.

"Persistence"

The three Balmain aldermen, while supporting the proposal to reject the development application, vainly sought in an amendment to go further.

The amendment, which was moved by Ald. N. Origlass, asked that it be placed on record that Council was seriously disturbed and scandalised by the persistence until then of the non-Balmain aldermen in approving a big company's development application.

That application, the amendment said, was for a project that would be detrimental to the interest and likely future amenity of the neighbourhood, and inconsistent with the public interest, as well as being irrational in face of the facts.

There were only three votes for the amendment—those of the Balmain ward aldermen—and it was defeated.

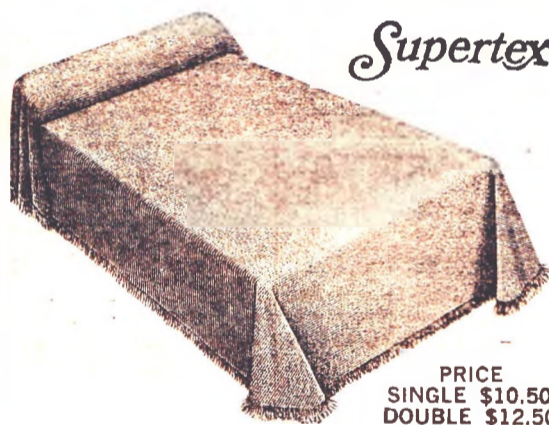
