

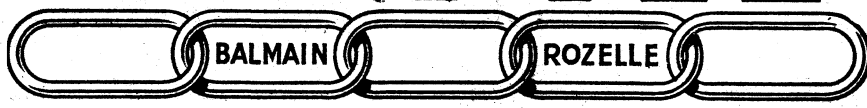

Get-together Of District Workers

An unprecedented attack on community problems in the Balmain area appears to be approaching, with a further extension of activity by The Balmain Association and its approach to the two newly formed organisations (Rotaract Club and Junior Chamber of Commerce) in a move to prevent duplication of effort.

In an interview with "The Link", The Balmain Association's President, Mr W. Haesler, enthusiastically forecast his organisation's future. He said the management committee had adopted in principle a plan whereby the Association would become more involved in community work.

While the details of this had to be worked out, they intended to expand the Association's role of "Balmain Watchdog".

However, they did not wish to cut across the activities of the Rotaract Club and the Junior Chamber of Commerce, which had just commenced community work in the Balmain area.

Hence they had written to both these bodies and asked for a discussion on community activity plans.

"We have had a lot to do with this district", Mr Haesler said, "And we would like to assist them in any way we can with our advice. We would

welcome discussion on any matter of common interest".

Mr Haesler said the Association's management committee felt there would be mutual benefit if the Association were to make close contact with old people, the young, and newcomers to the district.

The Watch House, which had recently been officially opened after its restoration, and was now the Association's headquarters, would be a focal point of their community activity.

Activity

It was felt that the building should become a place for the holding of special functions to interest non-members as well as members.

The following ideas of likely activity were suggested by the committee:

- Talks in schools on the history of Balmain. These have already commenced, at the hand of Mr Robert Irving, Past-president of the Association, who is an authority

on Balmain history.

- Painting competition for children as an annual event.

- Outings for elderly people, and provision of transport for them to hospitals. Also regular functions for old people in the Watch House, say at afternoon tea once a month.

- Garden competition for Balmain residents.

- Children's library (due to open shortly).

- Art and historical exhibitions in the Watch House.

- Lessons on motor vehicle maintenance and road courtesy for youth (with the co-operation of the N.R.M.A.).

- Cooking classes for children.

- Morning meetings for mothers and babies, with speakers on mothercraft and similar subjects.

Mr Haesler suggested that the Watch House should be open regularly for inspection by the people of the district, who should be encouraged to attend.

NEWS IN BRIEF

APPEAL

The appeal by Mrs Catherine Morris, of 34 Grafton Street, Balmain, against her conviction by Mr Price, S.M., in Balmain Court, on a charge of offensive behaviour, was heard by Judge Bruxner in the Court of Criminal Appeals, Sydney, on August 4.

Mrs Morris had been fined \$15, in default 8 days' imprisonment with hard labour, in connection with an incident in Grafton Street above the container terminal.

Judge Bruxner dismissed the appeal, and found the offence proved.

However, he decided that, without proceeding to conviction, the information should be dismissed under Section 556A of the Crimes Act, having regard to the appellant's previous good character.

SIZE OF COUNCIL

The Department of Local Government has advised Leichhardt Council that the Minister for Local Government has decided to proceed with Council's recommendation that the present six wards of the municipality should be maintained.

The Council's decision was that each of the six wards should be represented by two aldermen

(instead of the present three).

A period of one month has been allowed (from July 17) during which any elector may make written representation to the Minister.

Last September an alternative proposal to reduce the present six wards to five, with three aldermen to each ward, was made by Ald. N. Origlass (Balmain), but was defeated by the Council majority.

REMODELLING TOWN HALL

Consideration of plans for remodelling Leichhardt Town Hall, prepared by an outside architect, has been deferred for 28 days pending consideration of an alternative scheme submitted by senior Council officers.

LOAN BY C'WEALTH

The three securities originally offered in the May Commonwealth loan are again issued in a new cash loan which opened on August 11.

A conversion offer is made concurrently to holders of \$244 million of Commonwealth securities maturing August 15.

The three securities being offered are: 6.5%, July, 1973; 6.8%, August, 1978; 7.0%, May, 1989.

Series "U" Special Bonds will remain on sale and be available for conversion from the maturing August, 1970, securities.

Full details of the terms and conditions for securities offered are set out in prospectuses circulated to banks and stockbrokers.

Column NINE

Maintaining A Park

Balmain people will be delighted when the present work by the Maritime Services Board at Peacock Point will have transformed an eyesore area into one of the finest harbourside parks in Sydney.

Leichhardt Council would not have had the finances or possibly the desire to produce such an impressive effort.

Undoubtedly the Council's engineer is right in saying that the park will be expensive to maintain, and the question is whether Council should be expected to do so, out of its own resources.

Should Council accept the offer to take out a lease, it would have to do a proper maintenance job and never allow a repetition of the conditions which caused the complaints some months ago of slummed work by its maintenance staff.

Those complaints fortunately have ceased, and the new policy of making one man responsible for each area appears to be thoroughly successful.

Nevertheless the new park would add considerably to Council's maintenance bill, and the M.S.B. would be realistic in recognising that.

Reading through the lines of the Council's engineer's report, it seems obvious the Board had little confidence early in Council's ability to handle the project.

To put the picture right, satisfy any Council umbrage at the Board's earlier attitude, and complete its idea of a handsome gift to Balmain, why not a token M.S.B. donation to Council for maintenance?

The Board is not noted for making friends in Balmain. Such a move could help to overtake past defects in policy.

M.S.B. Asks Council To Maintain Park

The Maritime Services Board has asked Leichhardt Council to take over a lease of the Board's park now being constructed at Peacock Point, Balmain East, for maintenance purposes.

In a report adopted by Council, the Municipal Engineer, Mr G. A. Wilson, recommended that Council inspect the area before making a decision.

He gave a resume of correspondence on the subject between the Board and Council, which commenced in 1965.

In 1968 the M.S.B. of-

ferred a 20-year lease subject to several conditions, including the stipulation that the land be used only as a park and not as a sports ground or boat launching ramp. That there would be no vehicular parking, and that no building or structure be erected thereon.

The lessee would carry out developmental work, and the lease would be terminated on six months' notice.

Withdrawn

Two months later Council asked for a conference regarding the conditions, but the Board then withdrew its offer of a lease and said it would proceed with development of the park at its own cost.

The Board said it was motivated entirely by safety considerations and would not permit the point to be used for boat launching because the location was in the busiest commercial section of the harbour.

Council then told the Board it was satisfied with the decision, but asked whether the Board would undertake the park's maintenance.

The Board replied that the park would be maintained by its own staff.

In July this year the Board advised Council that the reserve had been designed to a high standard for pedestrian use only, utilising Australian botanical features, and would be named "Il-loura Reserve" (an aboriginal name for "Pleasant Place").

It suggested that Council take out a lease of the park.

In his report to Council, Mr Wilson said administration and maintenance of the area would involve considerable labour cost because of the nature of the development.

Had Council developed the area the maintenance would have been an important design consideration.

Council had had no share in the design, despite its suggestion that the Board confer with him on the subject.

However, he had a favourable feeling for the design, which in some respects was excellent, but thought it a pity that opportunity had not been taken to use the place name "Peacock Point", with its local historical significance.
