

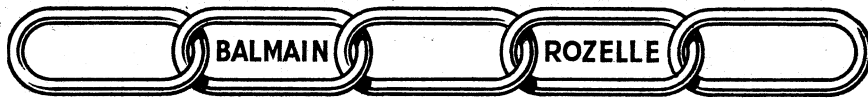

# New Container Venture On Edge Of Rozelle

News of a proposed development in container shipping facilities on the outskirts of Rozelle has been given to Leichhardt Council by a shipping company which plans to open a "stuffing and unstuffing" depot on the southern side of Victoria Road.

The company is McArthur Shipping and Agency Company Pty. Ltd., which is forming a subsidiary, to be known as Consolidated Cargo Services (N.S.W.) Pty. Ltd., for the purpose.

The company made a development application to the Council for permission to use land owned by the Maritime Services Board between The Crescent and Glebe Island Bridge.

It proposed to construct a depot for stuffing and unstuffing containers and/or "flats" of cargo received from, and to be delivered to, ships.

The site would be used as one integral area and contain offices, amenities, repair workshop, a shed for stuffing and unstuffing, and a loading or crane area, with two 25-ton levelling cranes.

There would also be three 27-ton capacity electric gantry cranes, each of 43 h.p., plus mobile fork lift trucks of various sizes powered by diesel, petrol or L.P. gas.

The depot would operate five days a week from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and employ 48 persons. Its estimated cost was \$300,000.

It might be necessary

to work some overtime until 9 p.m., or at a later date to fall into line with existing practice and work three shifts of eight hours each.

Function of the depot would be to provide an inner city facility for the receipt and distribution of cargo coming into and out of the port of Sydney in containers and/or unutilised form.

Containers could come to the depot by road, rail and possibly lighter, and be stacked by gantry cranes.

The contents would be unpacked in the shed and delivered to consignees' wagons as required. Outward cargo would be received, put into units and delivered to vessels for shipment.

### Traffic

It was proposed to close the existing roadway leading to Victoria Road.

Traffic would enter and leave the area via the Port Road adjacent to the rail line leading to The Crescent. Rail traffic could come on existing tracks from Rozelle or Glebe Island wharves.

The volume of road traffic would be about 60 to 90 movements per day. The type of vehicle to be used would be the

normal open wagon or semi-trailer at present used in association with container movement.

Reporting on the application, the Council's Chief Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, Mr R. S. Williams, said that although the site was remote from residential areas the problem of noise emission was one which should receive greater consideration.

He said it was possible that residents of Annandale and Glebe might be affected by noise from the activities of the industry.

Council decided to forward the application to the Police Traffic Branch and the Department of Main Roads for their views, and to inform those authorities that it was prepared to approve the application subject to compliance with health office conditions.

The application was opposed by Aldermen Origlass and Wyner (Balmain ward) on the score of the general principle of the undesirability of proliferation of this type of installation in the inner Sydney area when the various authorities were concerned with the general slowing down of traffic.

## NEWS in brief

### MARINA PROPOSAL

Leichhardt Council has decided to defer for another 14 days the application by Mr H. J. Stride for permission to construct a commercial marina in Iron Cove fronting Nos. 3/5 Tilba Avenue, Balmain.

This action followed consideration of two petitions, signed by 284 residents, strongly objecting to the proposal.

The petitioners contended the proposal was totally out of character with the surrounding residential use, and would be detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood.

Deferment was unsuccessfully opposed by Aldermen Origlass and Wyner, who claimed that, having regard to the petitions and the history of the matter, there was sufficient evidence to justify rejection at this stage, and that no further submissions could alter the essential nature of the project.

### INDUSTRIAL NOISES

In answer to Ald. Origlass, the Mayor (Ald. L. J. Rodwell) said no advice had yet been received regarding the A.N.L.'s undertaking to switch off the power to these boxes at night.

In reply to Ald. Wyner, the Mayor promised to contact A.N.L. regarding the continuing fork lift noise, despite A.N.L.'s assurances on this matter.

He said it was not disputed that Capt. Menzies had said that he had made an inspection and ordered one fork lift to be serviced.

The noise, however, had persisted since then.

## LEADERSHIP PLAN FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

Balmain Rotary Club seeks to sponsor the attendance of two Balmain residents, (young men or women aged between 18 and 25), or young persons working in the area, at the 1970 Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) seminar, to be held at Otford from October 10-17.

RYLA is a Rotary service to youth, conducted by Rotary District 275 with the active participation of all Rotary Clubs in the district.

Each club selects awardees to attend the Youth Leadership seminar, and later presents awards at a club meeting.

The purpose of RYLA is:

- To demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth.
- To recognise publicly the high qualities of the many young people who are rendering service to their communities as youth leaders.
- To encourage continued and stronger leadership of youth by youth.
- To provide a leadership training experience.

The award will comprise attendance for one week at a residential seminar, with all expenses paid. A carefully balanced educational and social programme includes intensive leadership training and inspirational occasions.

This will be followed at a later date by a gala occasion in the Rotary Club when the two young people who attended the seminar will be presented with their RYLA certificates.

The awardees will be eligible for membership of the District RYLA Association and continue

ing youth-group activity resulting from knowledge and inspiration gained at the seminar.

Experienced adult leaders are selected as resident honorary staff at the seminar. A medical officer will attend daily.

While awardees are treated as responsible young adults, adherence to certain basic rules is expected.

A varied theoretical and practical programme will include lectures and group discussion, with all awardees participating. Lecturers will be carefully chosen for their special qualifications.

Basic subjects to be handled will include the following:

Study group leading, public speaking, conduct of meetings, group dynamics, individual psychology, emotional problems in children and adolescents, interpersonal relationships, community responsibility and moral problems.

Other subjects will be bushwalking, campcraft and survival, elementary First Aid, games and games leading, youth club programming, social programmes, and physical education.

## Column NINE

### Anti-Litter Campaign

State Parliament has introduced legislation to implement its decision to increase penalties for littering, and to permit Councils to impose on-the-spot fines.

The Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. Rodwell, has already announced that Council will join in any widespread anti-litter campaign, commencing with education of the public, and imposing on-the-spot fines (even in minor cases) on those who refuse to cooperate.

It is presumed, therefore, that the stage is set for such a campaign, and that the Balmain peninsula, along with the rest of the municipality, will before long see Council's anti-litter activities.

It goes without saying that the public must improve its approach to the problem of keeping streets and other public places clear of litter.

Most people can be expected to cooperate in a campaign conducted with vigour and along common-sense lines.

Nevertheless such a campaign will fail unless the authorities themselves realise that they, too, will be on trial.

This applies particularly in the Balmain area, where there have been well-founded complaints of gross inefficiency in Council's work of cleaning the streets.

The position has improved markedly, but even last week we received another complaint, regarding an unswept street leading off Darling Street.

While parked cars make street rubbish removal difficult at times, it's still Council's duty to solve that problem, and not offend the public's sensitivities with evidence of slummed work.

An anti-litter campaign? Certainly—but let's see a lead set, and maintained, by the Council.

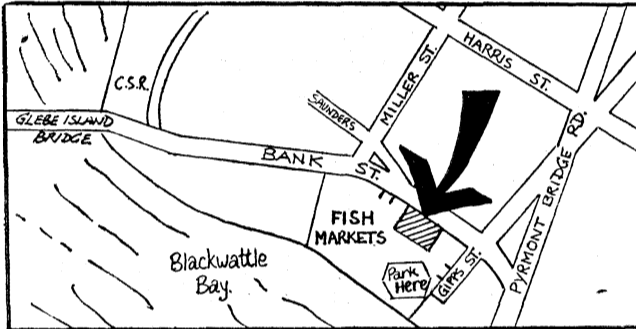

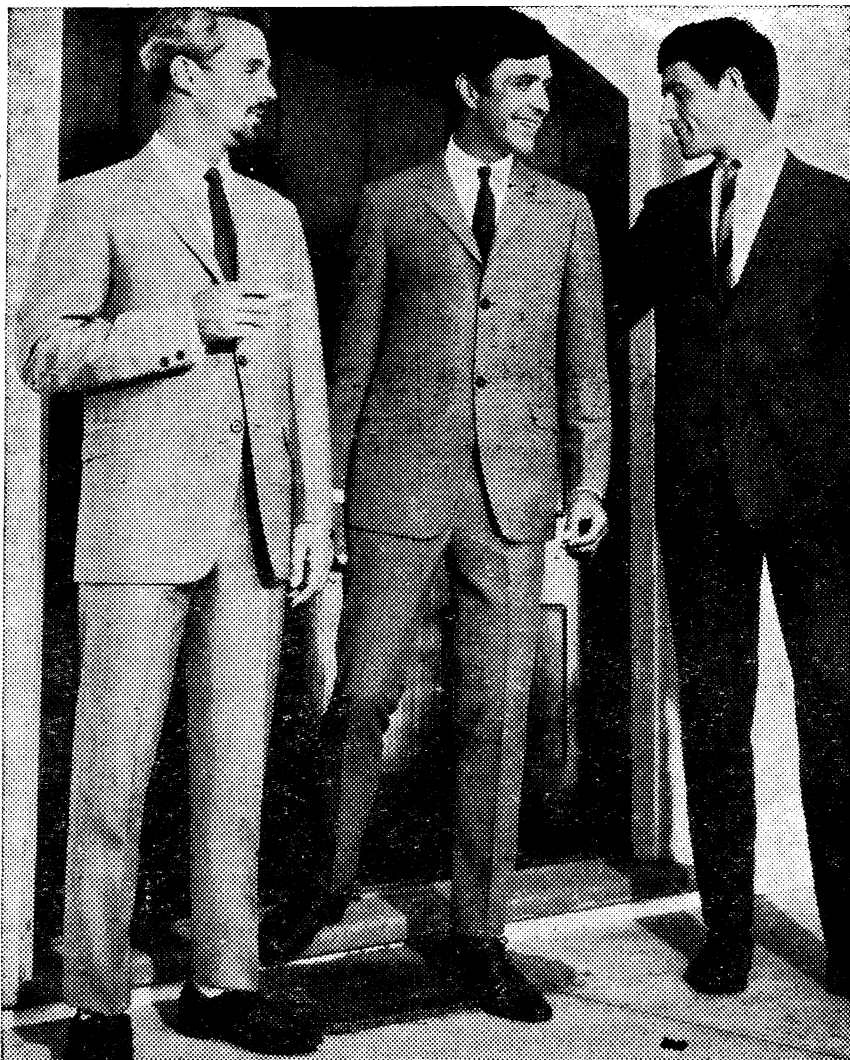

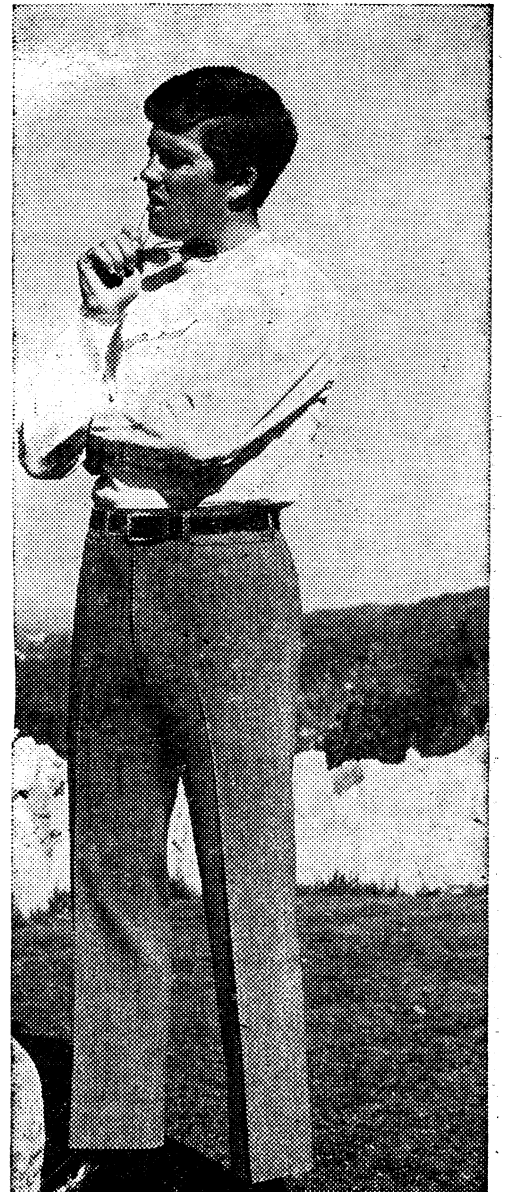
