

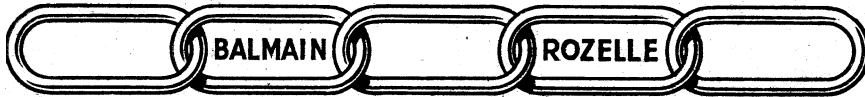

New President of Balmain Hospital

Mrs D. J. Wakefield, the newly elected President of the Board of Directors of Balmain Hospital, is a well-known and respected resident of the district, having been born in Birchgrove Road, and living in Wharf Road all her life.

Mrs Wakefield (pictured) was appointed to the Board in June, 1960, and served as Vice-president since 1961.

Her active association with the hospital dates back to 1952, when as a member of the Hospital Auxiliary she embarked on a very successful hobby of fund-raising activities.

In this capacity she has been seen almost every Friday evening conducting a raffle in the hospital's entrance foyer. Both Mrs Wakefield and her late husband have been active in the district's civic affairs, being outspoken in their endeavours to increase the area's residential status.

Mrs Wakefield says that the Balmain peninsula has every scenic advantage of more prosperous suburbs, and with far-sighted development could be one of the premier waterfront suburbs in Sydney.

Unfortunately, she



adds, the dream of a civic drive around the peninsular foreshores has not been appreciated by the appropriate authorities, and such a dream now seems far from reality.

Mrs Wakefield deems her appointment as President to be an honour.

"For some considerable time the Board of Directors have been planning the future development of the hospital," she said, "Having in mind the large increase in the population

of the district expected during the next decade.

"I sincerely hope to see the commencement of the first stage of this development, our new Out-patient-Casualty Department, during the next 12 months.

"I am confident that, given the support of the community as a whole, we will be able to provide the very best of care and service expected of such institutions."

Mrs Wakefield said she would like to express congratulations to Mr Francis Turner on his tenth consecutive appointment to the position of Honorary Treasurer, and to the Vice-presidents, Messrs Ward and Anderson.

Leichhardt Town Hall

Leichhardt Council at its last meeting decided to take the necessary action by purchase or resumption to acquire for civic purposes Nos. 3-15 (inclusive) Wetherill Street, Leichhardt (in the Town Hall block).

Council decided also to call for tenders for lease of the Leichhardt Town Hall site for development, to include provision for a civic centre and the like to meet the administrative and civic purposes to Council's requirements.

The majority defeated a motion by Aldermen Origlass and Graham (Balmain ward) to eliminate calling for tenders at this stage, to provide that the main hall be used for staff accommodation at this stage, and that the views of residents be sought on this major problem.

Speaking to the motion Ald. Origlass said the subject had not been mentioned at the last election, and was a matter which should be communicated to the people.

He said that the calling for tenders indicated that they had already decided on the site of another civic centre, in an area which was on the extremity of the municipality.

NEW FERRIES TO CALL AT BALMAIN

Two new ferries, to be in service on Sydney Harbour by the end of this year, will be allocated to the Sydney Ferries routes servicing Balmain, Hunter's Hill, Cremorne, Mosman and Taronga Park.

Each of the new ferries will carry about 510 passengers, and will replace existing units (carrying 350 passengers).

The ferries will be named Lady Woodward and Lady McKell.

No information is available, however, as to the impact of the new vessels on the Balmain service.

Sydney Harbour Ferries' chief, Mr Butterfield, told "The Link" that no alterations in service had yet been discussed.

ART AWARD

A big response has been received from artists throughout Australia for the annual art award exhibition of the Drummoynne Municipal Art Society.

The exhibition will be held at the Civic Hall, Drummoynne, from September 20 to 27, with the official opening on Sept. 21 at 8 p.m.

Boys' Club

Balmain Police-Citizens' Boys' Club's Under 7 soccer team was beaten in the semi-finals of the Woodfield Trophy. Under 8 beat Maroubra 1-0 to qualify for the final next Saturday.

The bi-weekly Housie afternoon will be held next Saturday at 1.30 p.m., and the Club's chocolate wheel at 9 a.m. Saturday at the corner of National and Darling Streets, Rozelle.

BETTER POSITION FOR BALMAIN CENOTAPH URGED

Acting officer-in-charge of Balmain Police, Inspector L. Dingwell, said last week that he intended to approach the R.S.L. and the traffic authorities on the question of moving the Loyalty Square cenotaph to Gladstone Park.

Mr Dingwell told "The Link" that he considered the present position was most unsuitable because of the traffic hazard it created.

"We respect the position it occupies in the hearts and minds of the people," he said, "But in the spot in which it is located it cannot possibly arouse the respect and reverence it is entitled to do.

"When flowers are placed on it, they appear to become dejected in a matter of minutes."

Mr Dingwell said the main problem was that the layout of the intersection resulted in obscuring of vision for motorists entering the square from side streets.

Traffic from East Balmain often travelled far too fast at the intersection, and the situation was fraught with danger.

This would increase when the Westfield Development scheme of a supermarket was implemented.

He had asked the Traffic Facilities sergeant to investigate the question of installing islands in the intersection.

Mr Dingwell thought removal of the Cenotaph to a more dominating but less hazardous position in Gladstone Park would be a most desirable move.

Column NINE

LOYALTY SQUARE

The views of Inspector Dingwell, acting Balmain police chief, regarding the unsuitability of the position of the cenotaph in Loyalty Square, Balmain, are challenging.

They deserve very close consideration by the people of the district, especially R.S.L. members, who no doubt could be regarded as speaking for the relatives of those whose sacrifice for the nation is commemorated by the cenotaph.

Nothing must be done to bring the slightest discredit on their memory.

However, it would appear obvious to even a casual observer that present traffic considerations take away much of the reverence to which the cenotaph is entitled.

Traffic past it along Darling Street is often too fast for safety, and much too fast for a national memorial.

The structure seriously interferes with the vision of drivers entering Darling Street from the two side streets there. This will be accentuated when the new supermarket is built nearby.

Whether or not the cenotaph is removed to a quieter, more dignified and safer area is for the community to decide, but obviously Loyalty Square cannot be allowed to remain as it is, from a traffic standpoint.

The square should be closed to traffic altogether, and Beattie Street taken through to Darling Street in a more westerly direction.

This would realign its intersection with Darling Street in a straight line with Mort Street, paving the way for a successful one-way scheme for heavy vehicles across Balmain, thus solving the increasing container traffic problem.

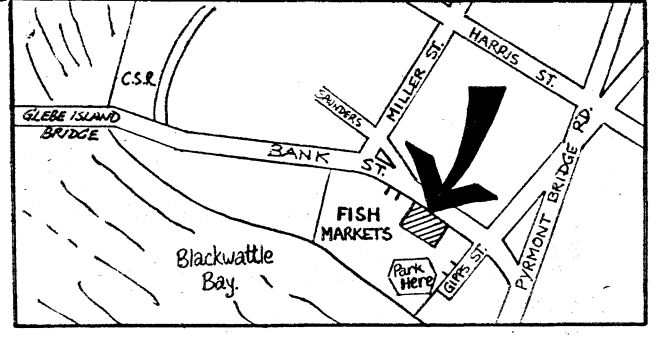

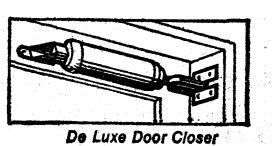
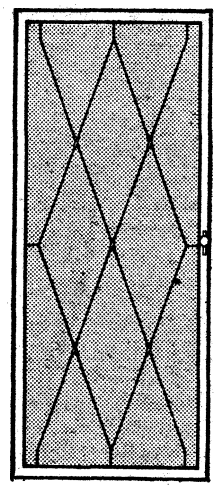

Hospital Would Like More "Pink Ladies"

Ladies with some time on their hands and who would appreciate simple but important honorary community work are being sought by Balmain Hospital.

They are needed to swell the numbers of the "Pink Ladies", so-called because of the pink smocks they wear, provided by the hospital to distinguish them from the regular staff.

The Pink Ladies are a voluntary band of workers who make themselves available at selected times (suitable to themselves) for such work as helping in the wards and clinics, feeding

patients unable to feed themselves, assisting with flower arrangements, washing and setting patients' hair, etc.

This scheme operates with great success in several big N.S.W. hospitals. The hospital matron, Miss J. McLaren, said that the Pink Ladies of Balmain had proved themselves invaluable.

More were required for special work.

The matron said there was a special need for Pink Ladies to assist in the various clinics at the hospital—the occasions when doctors saw a group of outpatients to attend to their medical needs.

At these clinics medicine might be prescribed or a visit to the X-ray Department arranged.

It was most desirable, said Miss McLaren, that the patient should be accompanied from the

clinic to the dispensary or, say, for an X-ray appointment, and in the absence of honorary helpers this would be done by a nurse.

The Pink Ladies were able to do this work and thus save the time of the nurses for professional work.

This was valuable assistance, and was needed particularly these days because of the big growth in the size of outpatients' clinics.

The matron added that ladies who were diffident about performing any particular type of honorary work allotted to them would surely be able to find some niche in the Pink Ladies' scheme where they could be happy.

In that way they would be performing admirable work on behalf of their sick fellow be-

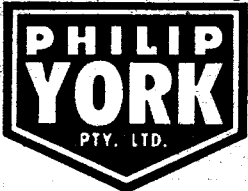

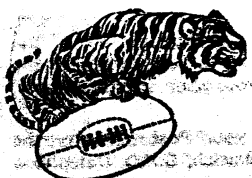

COUNCIL NEWS IN BRIEF

Marina In Iron Cove

Leichhardt Council at its last meeting further deferred the application by Mr H. J. Stride for permission to construct a 300 ft. marina at 3/5 Tilba Avenue, Balmain. Deferment was made to await reports from the Maritime Services Board in regard to two existing marinas, from the Health Surveyor on the health aspects of the existing marinas, and from the Town Planner on use of burning and welding equipment and boat-building activities of those marinas.

The resolution was opposed by the Balmain aldermen, who claimed that investigation of existing marinas was extraneous to the application.

Library Building

Leichhardt Council decided last meeting to call fresh tenders for the conversion of the existing building at No. 4 Marion Street, Leichhardt, and part of Nos. 1-3 Day Street, to a baby health centre/public library.

Aldermen Origlass and

Graham unsuccessfully sought to call tenders for construction of a new building for the purpose.

Ald. Origlass pointed out that construction of a new building had been recommended by Council's engineer (Mr Wilson), by the architects for the project (Messrs Davey, Brindley and Vickery), and by Vale Constructions Pty. Ltd.

He said the evidence was that a completely new building would cost about \$102,000, which was less than the lowest tender received for conversion of the old building (\$103,720).
