

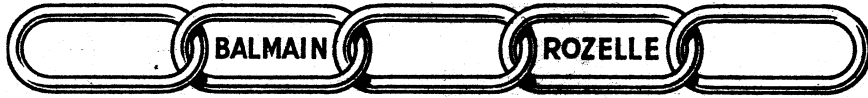

Garden Contest Entries Now Coming In

Entries are now coming in for The Balmain Association's garden competition, which will be judged over the week-end of November 7-8. Entrants are required to complete an entry form, available from the Association or as published in this issue of "The Link".

Closing date for entries—which are free—will be October 31.

The competition is open to any resident or premises, public park and garden in Balmain, Balmain East, Birchgrove and Rozelle, in the area situated on the northern side of Victoria Road.

The entry form should be completed and forwarded to Garden Competition, C/- The Balmain Association, P.O. Box 57, Balmain, 2041.

There are five sections:

Section 1: Private gardens, either in front of or behind homes, in two sub-sections: (a) More than 600 sq. ft. in area; (b) less than 600 sq. ft.

Section 2: Paved courtyards, any size. (The idea is to cater for home areas without any definite garden space, other perhaps than a small border section. Pot plants would be the main feature of such a garden.)

Section 3: Miscellaneous. (This category would cover such displays as window boxes, balcony gardens, ferneries, treatment of laneways, easements, etc., to cater for residents without garden room and who do not qualify elsewhere.)

Section 4: Industrial areas and home unit areas whose gardens are

visible to passers-by.

Section 5: Public parks and gardens. In the cases of Sections 4 and 5 the judges will inspect all areas independently and will make awards for display of civic improvement, attention to footpaths and surrounds, general neatness, etc., as well as for actual garden displays.

No entries will be required for Sections 4 and 5, although advice from management would be appreciated.

Prizes will be an engraved plaque to the winner of each section, plus a cash prize to the winners of Sections 1, 2 and 3.

Subject to approval of the prize winners, public inspection of the winning gardens and runners-up will be arranged by the Association.

A fee will be charged for inspection, and the proceeds will be donated to the Balmain Hospital's building fund appeal.

Footpath Tree Planting

The Balmain Association has started on its project of planting trees in the footpaths of suitable streets, to help give a face-lift to the Balmain scene.

Last Sunday a team of six members, under the supervision of the Vice-president, Mr Bob Beverley, planted 24 trees on the southern side of Curtis Road.

The remaining 14 trees will be planted next week-end.

The trees are being planted between Thames and Church Streets on the southern side of Curtis Road, and between Thames and Darling Sts. on the northern side.

The project has the approval and co-operation of Leichhardt Council, which is providing tree-guards, and is removing the spoil left by the planting operation.

The type of tree being planted in Curtis Road is the broad-leaved Paper Bark (Melaleuca Quinquenervia), which when mature acquire a height of about 25 ft.

The Paper Bark is regarded as very suitable for footpath planting, as it requires very little maintenance and does not continue to spread after maturity.

The trees are being planted fairly close—about 20 ft. from one another.

The Association hopes to continue its tree-planting in other Balmain streets.

Leichhardt Council itself recently embarked on a rather extensive footpath tree-planting project, and young trees will be seen in a number of areas along Darling St.

RESIDENTS OBJECT TO MARINA PLAN

The committee represents the 280 signatories to a petition presented to Leichhardt Council in opposition to the proposal.

It says that the proposed development would be totally out of character with the surrounding residential use and existing zoning and would be detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood.

It would, the petitioners say, be an unsightly intrusion into an area adjoining and overlooked by an important public park, a public reserve, two public recreation marinas, a rowing club, a large public housing complex and private houses.

It would also introduce further traffic of an unsuitable nature into narrow residential streets, already used to capacity for parking.

The committee says: "Direct access streets are non-existent. Steep passageways lead to the nearest traffic way, which is Phoebe Street (18 ft. 6 ins wide), running into Tilba Avenue (16 ft. 6 ins wide).

"Two cars cannot pass if vehicles are parked on one side of either of these streets.

"In fact parking is taken up day and night. Residents park at night, and during the day parking space is taken up by

Cockatoo Island workmen who travel to the island by ferry from Elliott Street, and by boating people using the present marinas.

"Both these streets are used daily by children from the Housing Commission flats in Elliott Street, to go to the Birchgrove Public School and to Elkington Park, one of the more attractive parks in Sydney, and the adjoining swimming baths.

"Residents claim that any increase in traffic or installations in the present crowded bay and environs would be a threat to their reasonable enjoyment of their homes and living area."

TREES IN FOOTPATHS

Balmain residents should appreciate the efforts of both Leichhardt Council and The Balmain Association to give a face-lift to the streets of this district by planting ornamental trees in the footpaths of selected thoroughfares.

Always assuming that the resultant growth does not constitute a nuisance in regard to interference with household drains or unwanted shade of nearby homes, the community must agree that footpath trees as a rule bring a graciousness to an area which cannot otherwise be matched.

Their presence helps to cool the air, the greenery helps protect the eyes from mid-summer glare, they attract desirable bird life, and their general appearance lifts the neighbourhood aspect considerably.

It is a tragic aspect of the inner suburban scene that so few trees have been preserved in private properties. The smallness of many of the home lots constitutes the main reason for this.

However, we cannot understand why it has taken so long for some Local Government bodies to help remedy the situation by planting their own trees in footpaths.

Leichhardt Council has seen the light, and must be congratulated upon its policy of footpath planting, as well as its new policy of tree preservation.

These are further straws in the wind to indicate a subtle change in the atmosphere of the Balmain peninsula, to match its upgrading as a residential area now well in evidence following recognition of its value owing to its proximity to the city.

Let's coin a new phrase: Watch Balmain grow smarter!

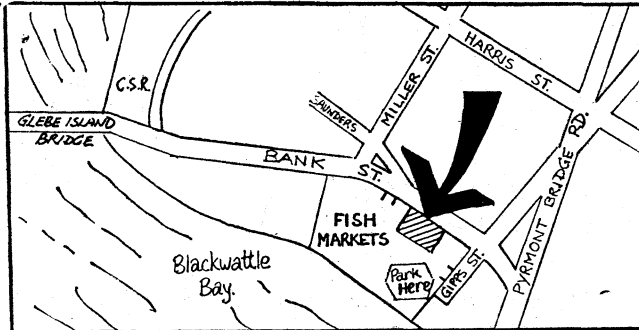

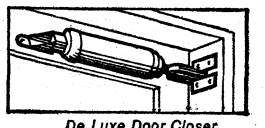
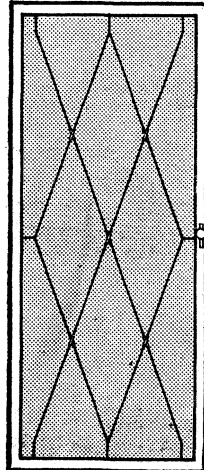

COUNCIL'S LIBRARY PLANS SOUGHT

The question being asked by many people—What does Leichhardt Council intend to do about municipal libraries?—has now been directed to the Council by The Balmain Association.

The President of the Association, Mr W. J. Haesler, has written to the Town Clerk, saying that the Association still awaits the outcome of the Council's Library Committee report on its activities.

"This subject, we believe, is a vital one for the residents of this area," he said.

"We know from the various reports that the Council has intentions of setting up a branch library in Marion Street, Leichhardt, but beyond this no information has been made available so far as we know."

Mr Haesler asked that Council advise the Association regarding the following:

1. Has Council adopted the Libraries Act?
 2. Has Council made application for a library subsidy?
 3. Will Council appoint a Chief Librarian shortly?
 4. Under what conditions does Council operate the Glebe Library, acquired from the City of Sydney?
 5. What are Council's plans for future branch libraries within the Municipality?

"As you will no doubt know, the Association is about to open a Children's Library for all children up to high school age in the area."

EAST BALMAIN FLAT PLAN

Leichhardt Council has adopted a recommendation by its Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, concerning a proposal to erect a 3-storey residential flat building at No. 8 Clifton Street, Balmain East.

Council had received a letter from the State Planning Authority objecting to the proposal because it was contrary to the draft Leichhardt Planning Scheme, and suggesting Council lodge an objection against its own proposal involving road widening in the area.

Mr Kenna thought an objection by Council to the road widening and extension of Gallimore Avenue would fail.

He recommended Council obtain an up-to-date valuation with a view to acquiring the property for local road purposes, and in the meantime secure legal advice regarding legal complications of the matter.

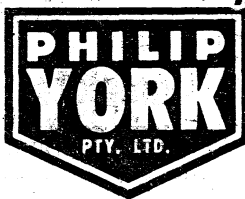

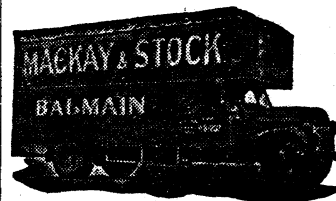
