"Man's Best Friend"

Leichhardt Council's leaflet about the Dog Act, issued to householders, gives a timely reminder of people's obligations in regard to "man's best friend.

From October 1 any dog over six months old must be registered (penalty \$10 maximum). A dog with no registration badge on his collar may be sold or destroyed in the event of impounding.

Last year 419 unregistered dogs were seized by Council, showing the indiffer-ence of many people to community obligations and their dog's welfare.

A legal requirement often ignored is that a dog must be under effective control on streets, in parks and other public places, otherwise he may be seized and impound-

Regular complaints are received regarding the nuisance caused along Balmain's main streets by dogs not under control, who seem to delight in selecting doorways. of shops (particularly food stores) as toilets.

This failure to control dogs is more than mere casualness. It amounts to contempt of other people's comfort and health, and must be rigidly suppressed.

Owners of such dogs no doubt claim they are "dog lovers" But how can such people be lovers of anything — including the dog, since they thereby place his security in jeopardy?

This is the era of war against pollution, by Governments and Councils.

We urge Leichhardt Council to redouble its activities against pollution of the footpaths and parks, and to demonstrate forcibly to the people of the municipality that casualness in regard to control of dogs will not be tolerated.


