

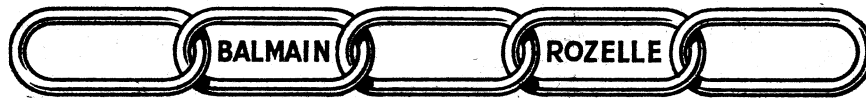

## NEW-STYLE LUXURY HOME PLAN FOR EAST BALMAIN

Two blocks of land at Peacock Point, East Balmain, which were sold recently at auction for \$110,000, are intended to be used by a Balmain developer for a new type of high-quality integrated single-home development.

The land was sold by Bruce Shaw Real Estate in conjunction with W. J. Laws & Flowerdew.

About 40,000 square feet in area, it is in William and Edward Streets, with extensive water frontages.

The purchaser was Mr David Ashton, of Darling Street, Balmain.

Mr Ashton told "The Link" that precise plans had not yet been evolved, as the type of development proposed had yet to be submitted to Leichhardt Council for approval.

It was based on a scheme which had proved most successful in Melbourne — "Cluster housing" — and would upgrade East Balmain as a quality living area.

The proposal was to build a number of high-class homes on the land.

The land was not extensive enough to carry homes with large individual spaces around each.

The scheme depended for its effect upon building the houses fairly

close together, but leaving a large area around the group.

This could be enclosed by a wall, and would be cleared and landscaped.

The houses, of course, would have their own privacy.

"We want to retain the character of this area," Mr Ashton said.

"The buildings would be of superior quality—possibly colonial-style sandstock brick houses with stained timber, or even Spanish-style homes.

"The buildings would be designed by architects, and I would possibly call for submissions for unified development of the area—subject, of course, to Council requirements.

"The reason for thinking along the lines of quality development of this spot is that the position is among the best fronting Sydney harbour.

"Also a lot of housing development is pro-

posed for the East Balmain area.

"Housing here is being keenly sought because of its proximity to the city.

"Those interested in acquiring property here include many persons who have the finance to purchase good quality homes but who cannot now find these among the older type residences available."

### Drummoyne Art Award

About 300 paintings of great variety and of very high standard are on exhibit at the annual art award exhibition of Drummoyne Municipal Art Society.

The exhibition is at the Civic Hall, Drummoyne, daily from noon to 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9.30 p.m., Saturday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday 2-5 p.m. until Sunday, Sept. 27.

## PENSIONERS "DENIED"

Pensioners in N.S.W. are being denied improved welfare centres and home care and nursing home services because of the State Government's refusal to accept a Federal Government scheme, according to Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain.

He said the new State Budget contained no provision for funds to match grants set aside by the Commonwealth for pensioner services.

Mr Degen said it was hard to reconcile the Premier's public expression of sympathy for pensioners, following the 50 cent increase in pensions, with his refusal to provide funds for welfare services.

## SEWERAGE WORKS PROGRAM

Sewerage and drainage works estimated to cost \$155,000 have been programmed for the Leichhardt district in the 1970-71 financial year.

This was announced by District Water Board Member, Ald. D. W. Sutherland.

He said that the main sewerage works would be amplification of the sewage pumping stations in Lilyfield Road, Rozelle; in Mort Street, Balmain; and in Birchgrove Park, Birchgrove.

The old relief sewer in Nelson Street would be renewed at a cost of \$3,000.

Ald. Sutherland said a further \$58,000 would be spent on the Hawthorne Canal improvements, the funds being provided by Leichhardt and Ashfield Councils and the Water Board.

## DOG OWNERS ARE REMINDED OF LEGAL DUTIES

A leaflet being issued to residents by Leichhardt Council reminds them that under the Dog Act, 1966, dog registration must be renewed every year, effective from October 1 to September 30 the following year.

Every dog owner must apply to the Council for registration of all dogs over six months of age. Penalty for failure to register shall not exceed \$10.

Upon registration of the dog, a numbered registration badge will be issued for attachment to the dog's collar.

The owner is required to provide a disc with name and address inscribed thereon, to be attached to the dog's collar or inscribed on the back of the Council's tag.

A dog which is seized and does not have a collar with a registration disc will be kept 7 days, and may then be sold or destroyed.

Dogs on streets, roads, lanes, parks, reserves, jetty or wharf, being public places, must be under effective control by some competent person, otherwise they may be seized and impounded.

Greyhounds must have a muzzle securely fixed to the mouth and be under effective control by some competent person using a chain, cord or leash.

Alsations are not required to be muzzled, but must be under effective control by some

competent person using a chain, cord or leash.

Last calendar year 3,396 dogs 6 months' old and older were registered by Council, and 551 dogs were seized and impounded at the R.S.P.C.A N.S.W. Dogs' Home, Moore Park.

About 76% of the impounded dogs were unregistered.

The Municipal Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, Mr Ron S. Williams, in his annual report said:

"It is important to stress that an owner benefits by registering a dog. If the dog wanders onto the street and is seized by the Dog Controller, then the identification disc guarantees his safe return to the owner"

Council received and processed 1,952 inquiries and complaints in regard to a variety of matters, such as owners reporting dogs missing, dogs molesting children and adults and savaging cats and other dogs, and injured and diseased dogs.

An interesting sidelight of Dog Controller activities is the abandonment of puppies by persons. The controller found new homes for 33 unwanted puppies.

## Column NINE

### "Man's Best Friend"

Leichhardt Council's leaflet about the Dog Act, issued to householders, gives a timely reminder of people's obligations in regard to "man's best friend."

From October 1 any dog over six months old must be registered (penalty \$10 maximum). A dog with no registration badge on his collar may be sold or destroyed in the event of impounding.

Last year 419 unregistered dogs were seized by Council, showing the indifference of many people to community obligations and their dog's welfare.

A legal requirement often ignored is that a dog must be under effective control on streets, in parks and other public places, otherwise he may be seized and impounded.

Regular complaints are received regarding the nuisance caused along Balmain's main streets by dogs not under control, who seem to delight in selecting doorways of shops (particularly food stores) as toilets.

This failure to control dogs is more than mere casualness. It amounts to contempt of other people's comfort and health, and must be rigidly suppressed.

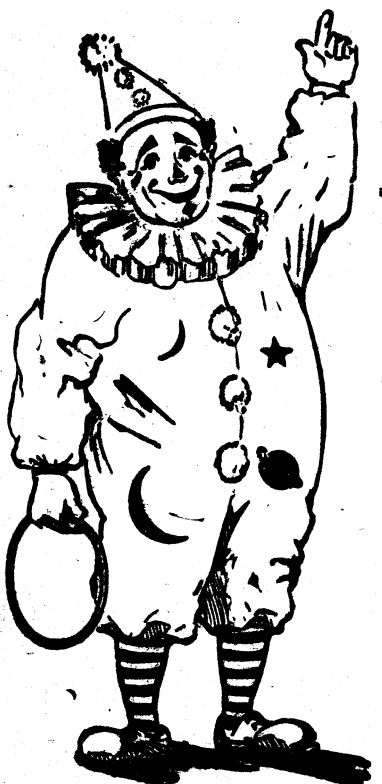
Owners of such dogs no doubt claim they are "dog lovers". But how can such people be lovers of anything — including the dog, since they thereby place his security in jeopardy?

This is the era of war against pollution, by Governments and Councils.

We urge Leichhardt Council to redouble its activities against pollution of the footpaths and parks, and to demonstrate forcibly to the people of the municipality that casualness in regard to control of dogs will not be tolerated.

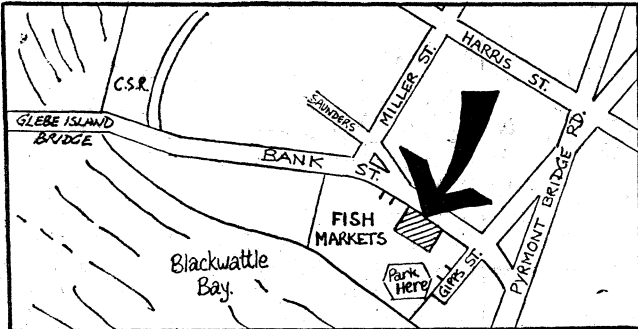

## COUNCIL NEWS IN BRIEF

### Launching Ramp Offer

An offer by Brambles Pty. Ltd. to construct a boat launching ramp for Leichhardt Municipality has again been before Council.

Council had rejected the King George Park (Rozelle) site as unsuitable, and asked the Municipal Engineer, Mr Wilson, to submit a report on other sites.

Mr Wilson's report said that after a detailed examination he was unaware of any other suitable site within the Municipality.

Council decided to make an inspection of a site at the foot of Grove Street, Balmain.

### Container Depot

Leichhardt Council has received the views of the Police Department and the Department of Main Roads regarding the proposed development by McArthur Shipping and Agency Co. Ltd. of land on the outskirts of Rozelle as a depot for stuffing and unstuffing containers and flats.

The land in question is owned by the Maritime Services Board, and is on the southern side of Victoria Road, between The Crescent and Glebe

Island Bridge.

Both departments raised no objection, but the police said all access to the site should be by way of the intersection of The Crescent and the access road.

The D.M.R. preferred that all vehicular movements to and from the proposed depot be by way of the Port Road from The Crescent.

However, if Council so desired, the Department would not object to an entry point where the Port Road met Victoria Road opposite Sommerville Road, provided entry was suitably restricted to vehicles travelling west along Victoria Road only, and exit to Victoria Road was prohibited.

Council decided to approve the development application, subject to ten conditions, including submission of detailed plans of the alternative access and egress proposals.

### Baby Health Centre

Leichhardt Council was confronted at its last meeting with a new development in regard to its decision of September 1 concerning the proposed baby health centre/public library in Leichhardt.

The earlier decision

was that the architects, Davey, Brindley and Vickery, be requested to modify the plans and specifications prepared by them for the conversion of the existing building at the corner of Marion and Kenwick Streets, Leichhardt, to a baby health centre/public library.

The architects now advised that the Master Builders' Association had instructed its members not to tender or re-tender, as its stipulated time for calling fresh tenders was six months, and that the radical redesigning of the project would be the only acceptable reason for calling fresh tenders.

Council decided to seek an interview with the Association in regard to the matter.

Ald. Origlass suggested that the deputation should listen to any alternatives that might be suggested by the Association, such as construction of a new building, which had previously been suggested as costing no more than the conversion job.

The Mayor, Ald. Rodwell, said they would listen to any proposal that might be forthcoming.
