

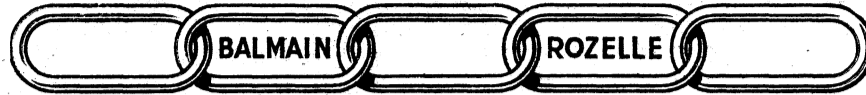

BALMAIN GETS ANOTHER SOOT SHOWER

Balmain residents were "hopping mad" — as one put it to "The Link" — when the suburb was again showered with soot early last Friday morning, allegedly from a ship berthed at a Balmain wharf.

The visitation was reported to be as bad as any of those late last year which caused the Government to introduce the Smoke Control Regulations.

So far no official action has been taken by the Maritime Services Board over the affair.

A spokesman for the Board said they had not been able to obtain any witness to the discharge of black smoke from a ship in the Goat Island-Balmain area.

However, they would continue to see if any such witness could be located.

He said the master of the Encounter Bay, berthed at the container wharf, had been interrogated. From the engine room activities of the vessel he denied that there could have been any black smoke discharged from his ship.

Eye Witness?

Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain, said he had written to the Premier (Mr Askin)—Ministerial head of the M.S.B.—urging that if it could be proved that a vessel was responsible for the emission, the owners should be prosecuted.

Mr Degen said he had received two serious complaints from Balmain

residents about the smoke—one living in Grafton Street and one in Campbell Street.

One of them claimed to be an eye witness of smoke being emitted from a berthed ship between 5 and 6 a.m. on Friday.

The conditions were reported to be as bad as anything that had yet occurred in regard to smoke emission.

Balmain police have advised that they did not receive any complaint from residents regarding the affair.

Leichhardt Council's Health Administration Service in Balmain received a number of complaints, and passed these on to the Maritime Services Board.

The complaints to it indicated a major smoke blow-out. The Council is making representations to the Maritime Services Board in the matter.

Reports received by "The Link" indicated that a rain of soot fell for about 15 minutes about 6 a.m.

One lady resident said it fell just like rain.

"It was dreadful," she said. "It settled on everything, and the yard had to be hosed to get rid of it."

"My husband was returning home at the time.

He said that the tops of all the cars in the street were covered in black carbon".

Mr Peter Robinson, of Thames Street, said that when he went outside his home about 6.30 a.m. there was soot all over the road and the cars in it.

Windows

It was even blowing through the windows of his house. The discharge was much the same, and every bit as bad, as on two previous occasions when ships at White Bay discharged from their funnels.

He went to the White Bay terminal and saw soot on cars in about a 50 ft. belt in line with the funnel of the Encounter Bay, which was berthed there.

He said that that was the only place at the terminal where he saw the soot.

M.L.A. URGES REMOVAL OF TERMINAL

The Member for Balmain, Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A., has called for removal of the Balmain container terminal.

He also wants the

Mr Degen made the request in a question to the Premier (Mr Askin), who is Ministerial head of the M.S.B.

His question followed a statement by the retiring President of the Australian Road Transport Federation (Mr W. V. Rowe).

Mr Rowe said that the container cargo system had been of no benefit to anyone except shipping companies because of inefficiency at container terminals.

Mr Degen said that this inefficiency was caused by traffic congestion in the Balmain area, which had been shown to be unsuitable for container operations.

SCHOOLBOY HIT ON CROSSING

A five-year-old boy leaving Rozelle infants' school was knocked down by a motor cyclist on the pedestrian crossing in Darling Street outside the school.

He was Jason Hogan, of Crescent Street, Rozelle.

Suffering from lacerations and contusions, he was taken to hospital but was released after 24 hours.

Police reported that at 2.55 p.m. traffic in one direction had stopped to allow children to cross the street.

A motor cyclist from the opposite direction braked at the crossing but was unable to stop before striking the boy.

An 18-year-old rider has been reported as not giving way.

HOLIDAY TRAGEDY

Many reasons could — and will — be advanced for the tragically high death roll in road accidents in N.S.W. over the holiday week-end.

And just as many excuses could — and will — be advanced in reply.

Governments past and present have tried many ideas to try to arrest the rise in the road toll. Some have had success, others have notably failed.

Still the toll rises.

Some authorities say this is to be expected in view of the ever-rising population and consequent use of the road.

This last-mentioned thought unfortunately is adopted by many drivers and pedestrians as their excuse for failing to put careful action into a higher groove of priority in their own minds.

There is a school of thought, well substantiated by the success of the idea in U.S.A., that the greatest hope for the future lies in universal training of young people in both practical and psychological aspects of road use.

This could well be the responsibility of the schools, before and just when boys and girls are becoming drivers.

So far the Government of N.S.W. has bowed to the opposition of educationists and refrained from introducing universal driver-training.

A generation from now (if we're still alive) the rate of road accidents will be so frightening that no responsible Government will neglect this obvious course.

Why not start it now, and see the saving of life snowball as the years pass?

LABOUR WOULD CUT COUNCIL RATES 15%, SAYS M.L.A.

State Labour Party policy would mean an immediate reduction of 15% in Local Government rates, according to Mr. Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain.

Mr Degen called for a State Government subsidy on interest payments made by Local Government. He said the recent increases in interest rates—forced on Councils by the Federal Government—would add substantially to the financial problems facing Councils. "Unless the State Government takes positive action to lessen this burden, rates will be forced higher next year and will continue to increase every year", he said. "The only alternative is for Councils to curtail essential works". Mr Degen said the reduction of 15 per cent in Council rates would—as a result of Labor Party policy—be achieved by relieving Council of contributions for main road, fire services and street lighting.

Two Balmain Bodies Co-operate In Community Service

A preliminary discussion was held last week between two of the three Balmain community service organisations — The Balmain Association and the newly-formed Balmain Chapter of the Junior Chamber of Commerce — on how they could help each other in their community service.

The discussion had been sought by the Association so as to prevent any overlap of community activity.

The meeting between The Balmain Association and the Jaycees was held at the Watch House, Darling Street, and was between members of their executives.

Of immediate practical benefit was the offer by the Jaycees to assist the Association in the day-to-day running of the children's library, due to be opened shortly.

The Association gladly accepted it, in view of the strain which would have occurred on its stalwarts without promise of additional assistance.

One subject discussed with considerable agreement was the movement aimed at securing a chain of municipal libraries through Leichhardt Municipality, this being one of the Association's keen policies.

The Association's President, Mr W. Haesler, congratulated the Jaycees' secretary, Mr Robert Ward, on the Chamber's plan to try to overcome public apathy in regard to Local Government.

He said the Association, too, felt that there was a very great need of this in the Balmain area

and in other wards of the municipality.

The Association was prepared to give the Jaycees the benefit of its experience in the Local Government field.

It would provide the background material it had available, and would give their move practical support.

Three reports prepared by the Association on district affairs have been supplied to the Chamber. These are on containerisation, objections to the Leichhardt Planning Scheme, and residential development on the Balmain peninsula.

NEW HIGH SCHOOL

The first stage of the new co-educational High School at Rozelle will possibly be completed during 1973-74.

Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain, received this advice in reply to a question in State Parliament.

He was told that more than eight acres of land had already been acquired for the school, and further land was being acquired.

The school would provide accommodation for between 600 and 800 students.

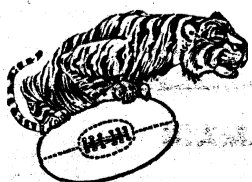

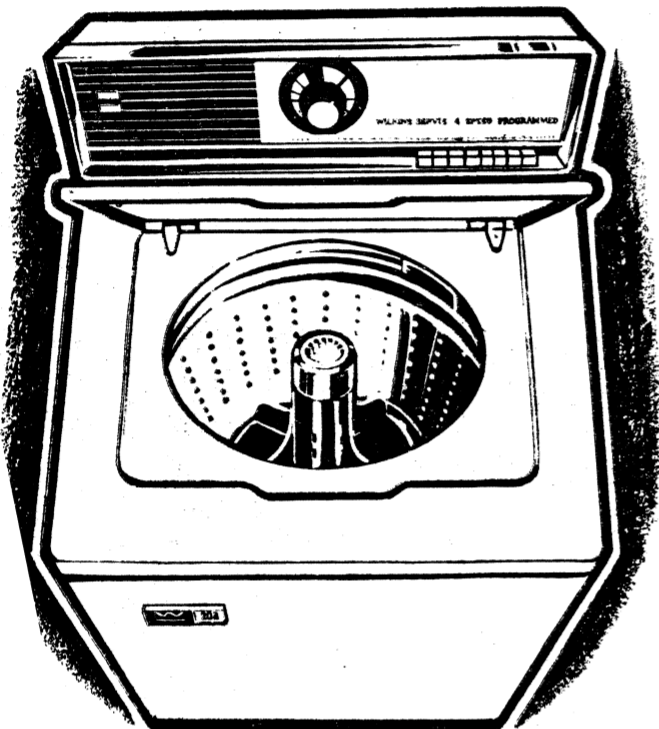

COUNCIL NEWS

Tenancy

Solicitors for Karl Developments Pty. Ltd. have been given authority by Leichhardt Council to take any action required under the Landlord and Tenant Act within 12 months of completion of the company's purchase of property from the Council at Balmain East.

This is in place of waiting for the expiry of the period of 12 months.

Involved in this proposal are the tenants of eight properties in Brett Avenue, Lookes Avenue and Nicholson Street.

Council's decision was against an amendment by Aldermen Wyner and Graham (Balmain ward). They sought that the effect to Council's policy that suitable alternative accommodation be found authority be granted sub- by the company for the tenants affected.

Building

Leichhardt Council has adopted a recommendation from its Works Committee to accept suggestions from its architect employed to design the Baby Health Centre/Public Library in Leichhardt.

These suggestions are for pruning costs of

some items involved in renovating and modernising the old building on the site; submitting the revised work to the three original tenderers for the contract for amended tenders; and including a "rise and fall" clause in the contract in place of a lump sum tender.

An amendment by Balmain aldermen, Ald. Wyner and Graham, that tenders be called for demolition of the present buildings on the site and for erection thereon of a new Baby Health Centre/Public Library, was defeated.

Noise

The new refrigeration procedure at the Mort Bay A.N.L. container terminal, designed to reduce noise at night, is expected to be put into effect within a week or so.

The procedure involves of the A.N.L. property, installation of power points for refrigerated containers along the Cameron Street frontage and not running refrigeration during night hours (between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.).

Council has decided that further representations be made concerning the noise from fork lift brakes.

by the White Bay con-
tainer terminal operators
— Seatainer Terminals
Ltd. — to reduce the
level of noise from the
terminal were reported
on at a meeting of
Leichhardt Council.

The Council's Noise
Abatement Advisory
Panel reported discus-
sions with Captain M. J.
Butcher and Mr D.

Captain Butcher said:

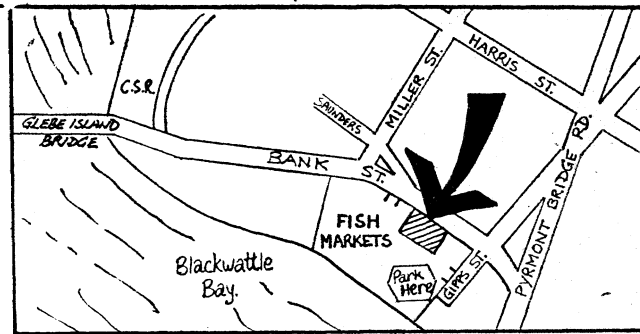
