# GARDEN CONTEST JUDGED

## Exceptional Support From Balmain District Residents

Fully justifying the confidence of The Balmain Association in the value of a district garden competition, the contest decided last week-end was considered really successful in all aspects, and a bright pointer to the horticultural future of the area. Residents of the district gave the contest exceptional support.

There were 71 entries all told, in Sections 1, 2 and 3—large and small gardens, paved courtyards, and miscellaneous.

The number was hailed by the Association as excellent and really encouraging.

There were 23 large gardens, 24 small gardens, 15 courtyards and 9 miscellaneous.

No entries had been called for in Sections 4 and 5—industrial and home unit areas, and public parks and gardens—these being inspected independently.

The judges' panel declined to make any award in Section 4—industrial and home unit areas—not being able to find any worth-while gardening activity in those two spheres.

The judges expressed their disappointment at lack of effort there.

Of the public parks and gardens, the new Maritime Services Board effort at Peacock Point stands out with its interesting conception. Elkington Park was considered the best of the Council areas.

As for home gardens, while many residents in the Balmain peninsula

find their hobby to be a battle against odds of various kinds, they are not daunted by this.

They have bravely come up with answers to the problems of small spaces, uninviting aspects, lack of sun and closeness of buildings, in the form of pleasant green and colour-filled spots around their homes.

In addition, a number of residents have shown love of their fellowmen with garden activity not seen in more orthodox gardening areas—such as tidying up ugly parts of streets alongside and leading to their neighbours' homes.

This is specially the case in three streets—Paull, Datchett and Gow.

In Paull Street, Mrs K. Harding (winner of this "Miscellaneous" section) has transformed a public right-of-way into a delightful little walk, with imaginative use of many shrubs and perennials.

Her neighbours, who use the right-of-way to enter their homes at the back, must appreciate the loving care by the lady "next door".

Similar commendation is given to Mr and Mrs

S. J. Reid for their construction and care of a garden bordering tiny Datchett Street, East Balmain, and fronting several neighbours' homes; also to Mr S. Dunford for his simple clean-up of an ugly part of the bottom end of Punch Street.

This amounts to good-neighbourliness.

Home gardens showed considerable variety, with many aspects typical of the area. How their owners responded to the difficulties of the district was of major interest to the judges.

The considerable number of mini gardens entered aroused one comment from the panel—"Mini houses—mini gardens—but large hearts of the people!"

This feature of the small gardens could possibly cause addition of genuine "Mini gardens" to the private garden sections in future competitions.

The courtyard section also is of major interest, showing how garden lovers living in terrace homes in particular respond to the urge to commune with their own little patch of nature.

The winning large garden—Mr Waterfield's—was a charming green space, nicely balanced between year-round foliage and open areas which complemented the harbour view.

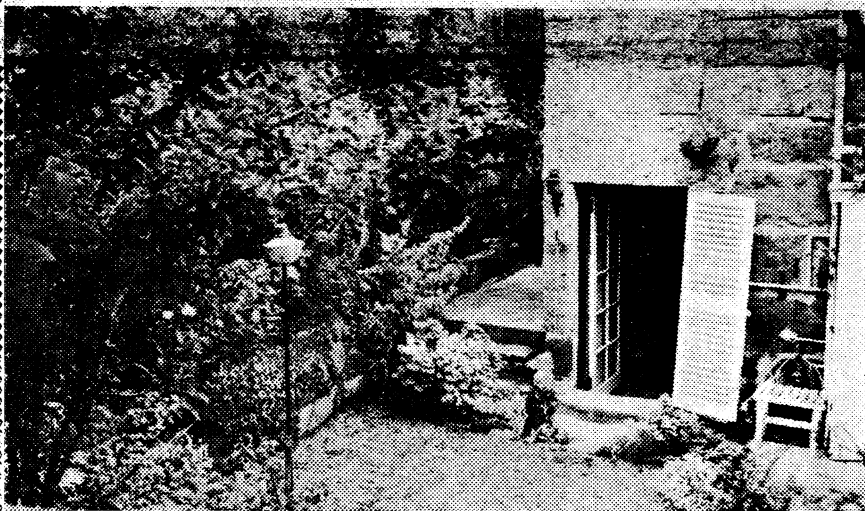
Mr and Mrs Janzen had a more intensive garden design to promote

## Column NINE

### THE LEAKY HYDRANT

A telephone call from "The Link" to the Water Board last week saw repaired within 24 hours a foot-path fire hydrant in Darling Street, Balmain, which had been leaking for weeks.

Green slime had formed on the foot-path, and it was not a pretty sight.

The spot is close to the fire station, police station, Post Office, Town Hall, and important private business premises.

Our informant urged us to publish the facts without reporting the matter to the Board, but we felt that a sense of civic responsibility demanded direct action.

The incident calls for answers to several questions:

• Since the period of the leak was a matter of weeks, why was it not picked up by the Board's own staff, especially since it occurred in a central position in Balmain's main thoroughfare?

• Was not the leak seen by any employee of other Government authorities with headquarters nearby?

• Thousands of ordinary citizens must have walked past the spot during the period of the leak. Did anyone (including occupiers of nearby business premises) take the trouble to report it to the Board?

Some people believe that reporting such conditions is not the duty of an ordinary citizen. This we feel is wrong. We suggest that a citizen cannot divorce himself from some sense of responsibility in these matters.

The incident, of course, is only minor, but minor incidents at times develop into major ones.

This is our community, and its interests should be protected in every way possible. A greater sense of awareness of one another's comfort would seem to be called for.

## Comment On Top Entries

Chief of the judging panel, Mr Gordon Sykes—well-known North Shore landscape designer—asked "The Link" to offer entrants congratulations on behalf of the judges.

He said that all gardens visited had extremely challenging sites, which involved either lack of soil or reduced sunlight due to adjacent buildings.

Each householder, he said, had tackled the in-

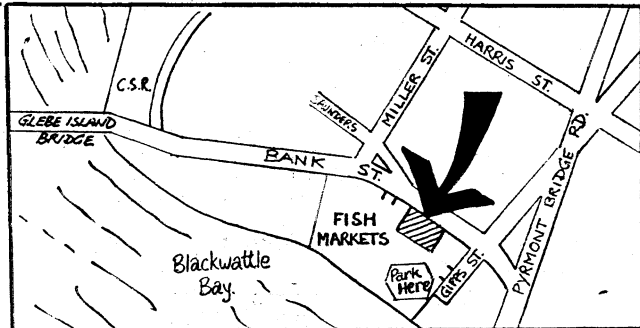

The judges thought that a visitor to Balmain looking for interesting gardens would find only a few areas where beauty was obvious to the casual observer.

However, the visitor should not ignore Balmain's heritage as an old-style home area, chockfull of small homes, and should not dismiss the scene as uninteresting and uncared for horticulturally.

He should look behind the fences and the stone walls and if possible into interior courtyards, when he will (as the judges did) get some really pleasant surprises.

The judges believe Balmain will be a better suburb in respect of its outward appearance as the impact of this competition and future ones is fully felt.

### Inspection

The winning gardens may be visited by the public next Sunday, November 15.

Tickets for the inspection will be available at the Watch House, Darling Street, Balmain, at 1 p.m. that day.

A charge of 50c will be made, proceeds to go to Balmain Hospital's building fund.

Mr W. Haesler, President of the Association, said they were grateful to all the people who had entered their gardens in the competition.

"The support given to the contest was exceptional", he said.

"While there could be only one winner in each section, I was particularly impressed by the loving care shown in so many other gardens.

"I hope the public inspection of the winning entries will have the added result of making a worth-while financial contribution to Balmain Hospital's building fund".

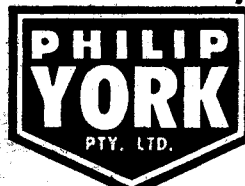

# NEWS IN BRIEF

## Watch House Neighbour

The newly-renovated Watch House, headquarters of The Balmain Association, is to have a new neighbour, on the vacant land adjoining it at 181 Darling Street.

Leichhardt Council has approved a development application by Messrs S. C. Van Breda and Vaughan, architects, to erect a two-storey residence on this lot.

The plans show a structure of approximately nine squares plus a garage on the Darling Street alignment.

The applicants will be required to splay the corner, and use the residence as a single dwelling only.

## Fears Of "High-Rise"

Leichhardt Council considered a petition by P. R. Horrobin and 65 other residents of Balmain East, and a letter from D. A. Deeves, making submissions against possible high-rise development on land lying between William Street and Edward Street, at Peacock Point.

Council resolved that they be advised in the terms of Town Planner Mr. A. Kenna's report, which confirmed that:

- The land is zoned 2A (a) Residential A in the Leichhardt Planning scheme.
- Rebuilding in connection with an "existing use" is permissible in such zoning.

- Section 309 of the Local Government Act applies only to proclaimed residential districts.

- There is no indication at present that an application will be made

for permission to erect a residential flat building, but inquiries have been made regarding Council's requirements for subdivision for erection of single dwellings.

- Council acknowledges the wishes of residents that future development be carried out in accordance with the Leichhardt Planning Scheme.

## Marina Opposed

Leichhardt Council has told the Maritime Services Board that it would strongly oppose an application for construction of a commercial marina fronting No. 91 Louisa Road, Birchgrove.

It made this decision following receipt of a letter from the Board seeking Council's views on the proposal.

The proposal is to extend the existing 71 ft. long jetty to 215 ft. into Snails Bay.

## More Flats

Leichhardt Council has approved an application by Bruce S. Smith, architect, to erect a two-storey colonial-type residential flat building at Nos. 2 and 4 Clifton Street, Balmain East.

The building will comprise eight single-bedroom and eight 2-bedroom flats, with parking under.

Among the conditions laid down by Council is that part of the subject site, required for the widening of Simmons Street in connection with the extension of Gallimore Avenue, as shown in the Leichhardt Planning Scheme, shall be dedicated to Council for road purposes.

Council will meet the transfer costs involved.

## Building Applications

Leichhardt Council has received advice from the Local Government Department of new procedure to be followed in regard to applications for permission to erect residential flat buildings.

This is required under the new Division 7A of the Local Government Act, effective September 30.

When applications are made to Council for permission to erect residential flat buildings, Council shall notify the adjoining land-owners, such other owners of land which the Council thinks will be detrimentally affected, and all strata lot owners adjoining the proposed development.

Council must also exhibit a notice on the land, and place a notice in the newspaper circulating in the area.

The notices must say that the application and plans and specifications may be inspected at Council's office for 21 days, and the land-owners mentioned may lodge an objection within 21 days.

Council shall consider such objections, and after dealing with the application shall notify every objector in writing of its decision.

Where Council refuses the application, and the applicant has right of appeal, Council shall notify every objector of the facts.

In any such appeal the objectors may apply for and be granted leave to appeal and be heard.

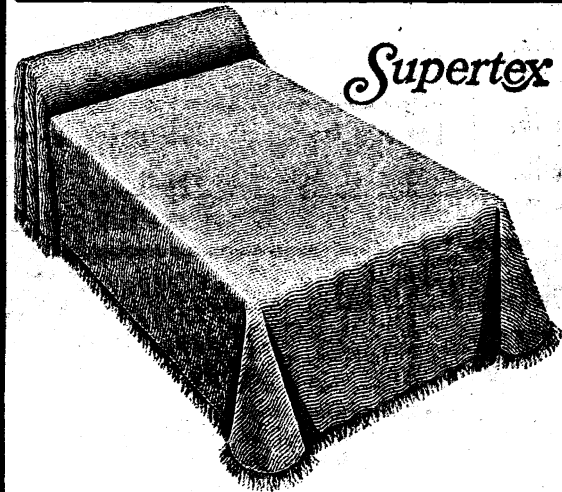

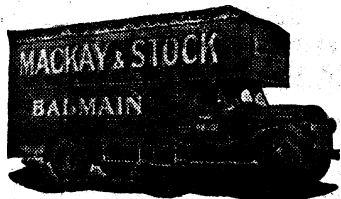
