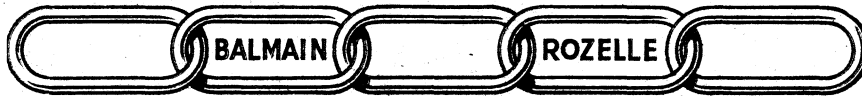

## How Council Keeps Eye On Health

**Many interesting facts and figures, including some specially relating to Balmain and Rozelle, are contained in the report of Leichhardt Council's health administration service, recently presented by the Municipal Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, Mr R. S. Williams.**

For instance, in 1969 positive cases of infectious diseases reported to Council numbered 76.

The incidence of infectious hepatitis increased slightly—57 cases, compared with 54 in 1968. Of these, 20 occurred in Balmain ward and 16 in Rozelle.

There were 4 infantile diarrhoea cases in Balmain and 5 in Rozelle, and one case of paratyphoid in Rozelle.

No cases of diphtheria or poliomyelitis were reported in the year in the municipality.

There has not been one case of polio since 1962. This is claimed to be the result of extensive immunisation procedures against this disease.

Council conducted 48 triple antigen and combined diphtheria and tetanus clinics during the year, 12 of them at Balmain Town Hall. Total number of children attending was 4,824.

Sabin vaccine clinics, for protection against polio, were held on 87 occasions—23 at Balmain, attended by 2,665 persons.

### Home Nursing Volunteers

The Citizens T.B. League, Rozelle, which conducted the home nursing service in the municipality, paid 5,809 visits during the year.

This service is carried out on a 7-day-a-week basis, and fulfils a vital community need. Many inquiries received by Council are re-directed to the League for attention.

Council co-operates in providing a meals on wheels service when required.

A social worker employed by the League two days a week calls

on patients and advises them on pension problems, transport, arranging admittance to homes, social outings, etc.

The service visited 104 patients (29 new ones), and there were 39 on the books at the end of the year.

### On Wheels

The Meals on Wheels Service operated satisfactorily during the year.

Inquiries from relatives, doctors and hospitals for assistance in providing meals for persons requiring this assistance have been constant.

The delivery of a nutritious and well-cooked meal is not the only aspect of this service. The friendly approach by the voluntary helper on each visit helps considerably in brightening an otherwise monotonous existence for the aged and incapacitated.

An average of 74 meals a day were served in the two runs embracing Annandale, Balmain, Leichhardt, Lilyfield and Rozelle, and 37 were served per day in the Glebe run.

### Food Sale

Council made 1,432 inspections at food and other premises licensed by it. It issued 109 notices against food shop

proprietors under the provisions of the Pure Food Act to cleanse and maintain premises in a cleanly condition and to remedy defective and insanitary fittings.

In addition periodical inspections were made of 525 non-licensed food premises.

Milk at shops and supplies carried by milk carters were sampled periodically by Council's health inspection staff. In the main the samples taken conformed to a satisfactory standard.

### Refuse

The collection, removal and disposal of municipal refuse was carried out in a satisfactory manner during 1969, according to the report.

The staff took 10,822 loads of garbage and trade refuse and 2,004 loads of street cleansing refuse to the Garbage Transfer Depot. Contractors' vehicles removed 2,571 loads of this material to the Menai Tip.

The clean-up service was found to be very popular with residents, and 2,567 inquiries were received.

"The constant number of inquiries for appointments to be made for removal of clean-up material is surprising," said Mr Williams, "But very welcome just the same.

"Without this weekly service there would be many instances of accumulations of waste material around dwellings and the consequent harborage of vermin that would ensue".

Removals are carried out on Wednesday of each week, except holiday periods. Four hundred loads were removed in 15 cu. yd. capacity trucks.

### Water Polo Competition

Balmain has again won the pre-season water polo competitions, defeating Bronte 6-5.

It appears that once again Balmain will be the team to beat in the competitions proper, the first round of which begins this Thursday with Balmain playing Parramatta at Balmain pool.

For the second successive year, the three appointed N.S.W. State team coaches are Balmain members. Dave Woods is coach of the men's team, Les Papps of the ladies' team, and Paul Dunford of the Colts.

Anyone wishing to try out for a Balmain team should present himself at the Balmain pool Mondays between 5 and 6.30 p.m., or Saturdays between 2 and 4 p.m.

## ANOTHER TALL BLOCK OF FLATS PLANNED

**Another high-rise home unit development is proposed for Balmain East—this time on the southern side of Darling Street.**

Leichhardt Council at its last meeting dealt with an application for a 7-storey residential flat building by the firm of Leslie Campbell and Associates.

The site is No. 12 Johnston Street and No. 13 Pearson Street, Balmain East.

The block would comprise a total of 46 flats—40 of them two-bedroom, and six single-bedroom, with parking under on two levels.

The maximum height

of the building is shown as 79 ft. 6 ins.

Elaborate landscaping layouts are intended.

The applicant stated that all except possibly two flats would give their owners an unlimited water view.

Since the State Planning Authority is involved in such a development in view of harbour foreshore restrictions, Council decided to refer the application to it for its advice and views before making a determination.

## Column NINE

### Litter In The Streets

The new law increasing maximum fines for littering public places and authorising Local Government bodies to issue on-the-spot notices to the public who offend came into force last Friday.

In view of statements earlier this year by the Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, an early announcement is expected by this Council as to its intentions in the matter.

A public education campaign has been promised, followed by action to enforce the law against litterbugs.

This newspaper trusts the results will be effective.

While streets of this district might not be worse than streets in some other parts of Sydney, they appear so to some people who take a special pride in the appearance of the area where they live or work.

Some of the litter would be deliberately thrown down by social misfits. Most of it, though, comes from average people who are simply thoughtless, untrained or lazy.

Both sections should take warning that the authorities are adopting a stronger line against offenders.

People should start now—if they don't do so already—to put their litter into litter bins, or simply keep it until they return home.

We know a large section of residents find filthy streets loathsome and eagerly await a strong campaign by the Council to clean them up.

For the sake of its own reputation, however, it is hoped there will be no further need for the public to criticise the Council's own street-cleaning methods, which they have at times brought angrily to this paper's attention.
