Litter In The Streets

The new law increasing maximum fines for littering public places and authorising Local Government bodies to issue on-the-spot notices to the public who offend came into force last Friday.

In view of statements earlier this year by the Mayor of Leichhardt, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, an early announcement is expected by this Council as to its intentions in the matter.

A public education campaign has been promised, followed by action to enforce the aw against litter-

This newspaper trusts the results will be effective.

While streets of this district might not be worse than streets in some other parts of Sydney, they appear so to some people who take a special pride in the appearance of the area where they live or work.

Some of the litter would be deliberately thrown down by social misfits. Most of it, though, comes from average people who are simply thoughtless, untrained or

Both sections should take warning that the authorities are adopting a stronger line against offenders.

People should start now—if they don't do so already - to put their litter into litter bins, or simply keep it until they return home.

We know a large section of residents find filthy streets loathsome and eagerly await a strong campaign by the Council to clean them up.

For the sake of its own reputation, however, it is hoped there will be no further need for the public to criticise the Council's own street - cleaning methods, which they have at times brought angrily to this paper's attention.




