

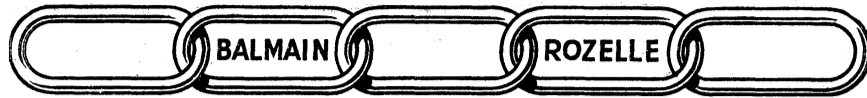

E. BALMAIN HOUSING PROJECT IS UNDER WAY

A start has been made upon Stage 1 of the development of the former Council-owned land at East Balmain—construction of two blocks of home units which will be most interesting additions to the Balmain residential scene. The whole concept is described as being the biggest housing development yet to come to the district.

The land in question has frontages to Darling and Nicholson Streets, and Brett, Gallimore and Lookes Avenues, in a most strategic section of the tip of the Balmain peninsula.

It is in the foreshore protection scheme and can therefore never be built out, preserving uninterrupted harbour views.

The developers are the well-known Balmain company — Karl Developments Pty. Ltd., whose managing director is Balmain businessman, Mr Karl Fischer.

Land Purchase

The company's tender for purchase of the land — for \$267,500 — was accepted by Leichhardt Council last February.

Plans for subsequent stages of the development are not yet finalised, being subject to State Planning Authority consideration.

Mr Fischer told "The Link" that he was advised that according to the policy of the S.P.A. this would be the last waterfront set of units to be made available in the metropolitan area.

The project now under construction is due to be finished by April next.

It consists of two blocks of units—one on the waterfront block of land on the corner of Lookes and Gallimore

Avenues, the other on the corner of Darling Street and Gallimore Avenue.

The former will comprise 20 units (16 3-bedroom and four 2-bedroom); the latter 14 units (ten 2-bedroom and four 3-bedroom).

Both buildings will be constructed in white brick, with a view to blending in with the waterfront landscape and avoiding the heavy appearance of so many blocks of units. Timbering will be stained dark brown.

The waterfront block of 20 units will be in three sections of three stories, four stories and three stories respectively. The lot will be adequately landscaped with rockeries, shrubs and lawns.

Garages in the building will be lock-up, with ample storage facility.

Features

Mr Fischer said that the units themselves would have many interesting modern features.

The 3-bedroom ones would be of about 13 squares, plus two squares for lockup garages. Each would have a big balcony (some up to 20 ft. long) facing the water, with uninterrupted harbour views looking north.

Internal unit features included central hot

water system, gas wall oven with hot plate in the kitchen, dish washing machine, double kitchen sink with waste disposal unit, ample kitchen cupboards rising to the ceiling, and individual laundry.

The bathrooms would have shower recess, separate full-length bath, vanity tables, and king-size shaving cabinet with mirror front. And the 3 bedroom units would have shower room and second bathroom en suite with the master bedroom.

The carpeted staircase would be permanently locked and connected with a security intercom, to enable visitors to contact the residents via a press-button and speaker.

Visitors could then be admitted by residents releasing the front door catch.

The other building — corner of Darling Street and Gallimore Avenue — is to be constructed with two wings—southern, of three stories, plus car park; northern, four stories.

Units will have the same features as those in

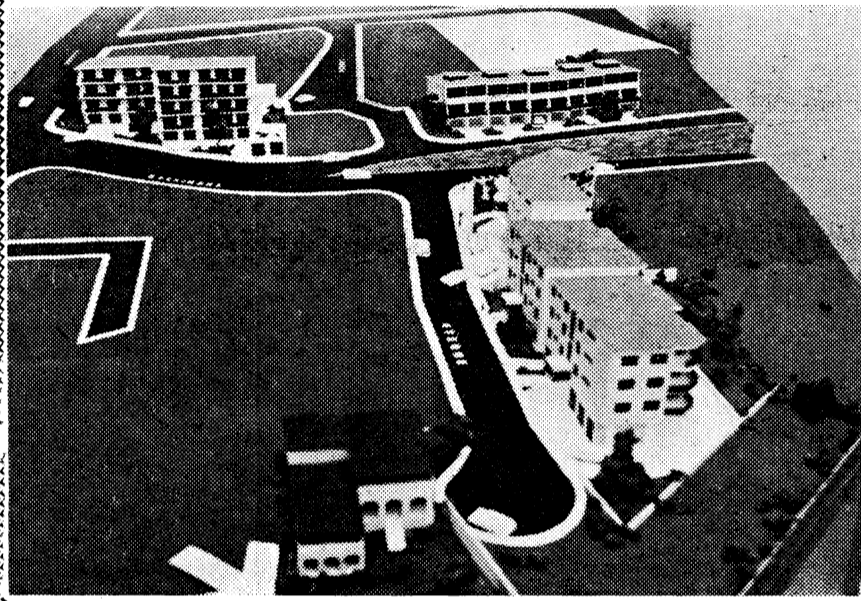
Shoe Store Offers Prize

All units will have Strata title.

HAROLD SIMPSON, FORMER HOSPITAL EXECUTIVE, DIES

A link with Balmain's earlier days was severed last week with the death at Sunnyside Convalescent Hospital of Mr Harold Ward Simpson, Secretary and Chief Executive Officer of Balmain District Hospital for almost 40 years.

Mr Simpson, who was 82 years old, retired in 1960, following the passing of State legislation fixing retirement ages of such executives.

His wife, Hilda Harriet, died about seven years ago, leaving a reputation of a most kindly lady and a persistent worker for the hospital.

Mr Simpson was descended from the first settlers in Australia.

On his mother's side he was the great-grandson of Lieutenant James Rixon, of the N.S.W.

Service Corps, who came to Australia in the first fleet under Captain Phillip.

Dr Balmain, after whom and his grant of land this district was named, was present in their number.

Mr Simpson's paternal grandmother was the first white woman to brave the dangers of aboriginal warfare and to settle at Warren on a selection fronting Macquarie River.

Mr Simpson fought with the A.I.F. in World War I, joining an artillery unit in 1916.

He was a prominent Freemason, having had Grand Lodge rank conferred upon him. He was a member of Lodge Tranmere (Drummoyne).

Prior to joining Balmain and District Hospital, Mr Simpson was Secretary of Gundagai District Hospital.

On his retirement in 1960 he was described by the President of Balmain and District Hospital, Dr H. L. Carruthers, as knowing "The value of human reality of mind and the proper role of materialism and technologies in the hospital life".

Dr Carruthers added: "His enthusiasms for the 'hospital idea' have widened his interests over the whole State until he has come to be well known in most hospitals, and not only in this State but also in others.

"This is not only because of his organising ability, but also from his benign influence over people.

"The influence of his early environment and his association with country people have contributed greatly to his sense of true social values and to his balance and moderation despite an ever-present desire for progress.

"To say 'Balmain Hospital' is to say 'Mr Simpson'. His name will continue in perpetuity on the walls of the building housing the new operating theatres and obstetrics wards.

"Even more importantly it will remain with-

in the memories of people who have been and will be benefited by the modern and scientific facilities which can be offered at all times".

In 1966 Mr Simpson was presented by the Hospitals' Association of N.S.W. with its certificate of long service.

The Association's President, Mr D. O'Connor, said on that occasion that he had travelled with Mr Simpson to zone conferences throughout the State, had seen him attending the Courts, working out problems and putting the case for the Association, and as an advocate "You would not have gone past him".

He had attended deputations and conferences with various Federal and State Ministers and the Hospitals Commission on behalf of the Hospitals Association, and was a member of the various Conciliation Committees.

A service at the funeral parlours at Burwood preceded Mr Simpson's burial at Rookwood Cemetery yesterday.

The service was attended by a large gathering of mourners—relatives, friends, Masonic Lodge associates, many representatives of Balmain and other hospitals, and representatives of the Hospitals' Association of N.S.W.

Balmain Hospital representatives comprised members of the Board, and present and former staff.

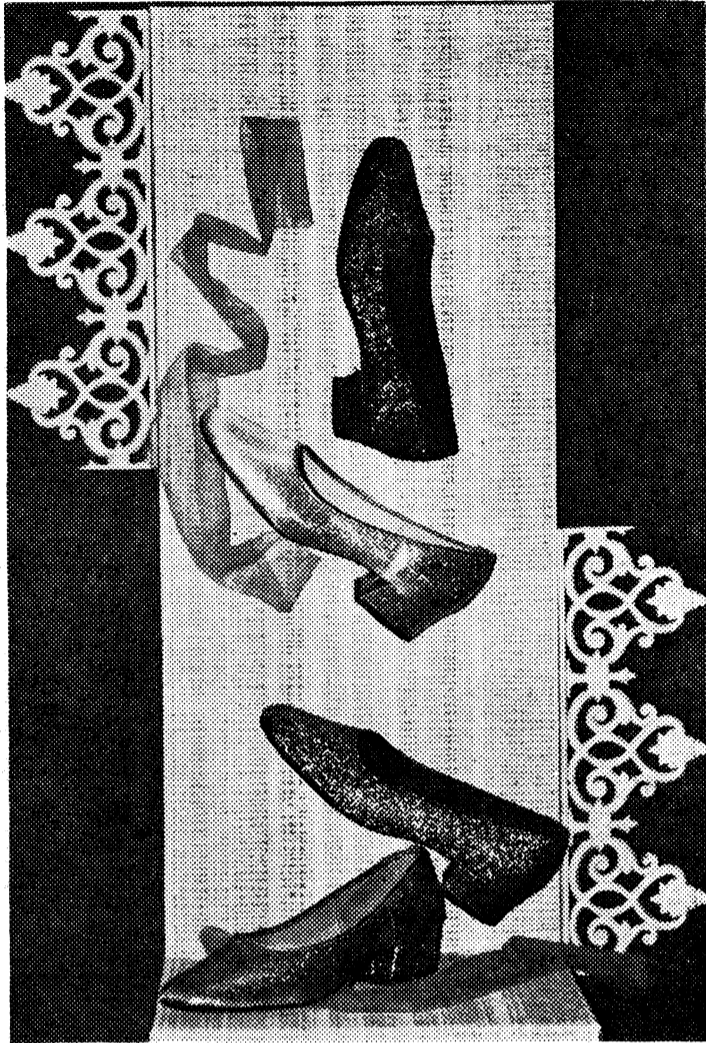

HOW TO PARK SAFELY ON HILLY ROADS

When a car breaks loose on a hill, the cause frequently is careless parking by the driver.

The N.R.M.A. says this happens more often than most people realise.

A few simple precautions are all that are needed when parking on an incline:

- Make sure the handbrake is firmly applied.
- Engage first or reverse gear.
- Aim the front wheels at the kerb (but do not scuff the tyre walls).
- Chock the wheels if the hill is very steep or the handbrake's holding power is suspect.
- With automatics lock the transmission in "park".

The N.R.M.A. engineers say that regardless of whether the vehicle has a conventional gearbox or automatic transmission, it is essential that the handbrake be in first-class working order.

It is well known that with conventional gearboxes an additional parking safeguard is provided by leaving the vehicle in gear.

Some drivers refuse to park their cars in gear because they believe a bump from another car could wreck the gearbox.

While such damage is a possibility, these driv-

ers overlook the chances of a serious accident if the car is not effectively held.

A similar bump to a car not locked in gear could easily spring the handbrake ratchet, leaving the car to run free.

In cars with automatic transmission the situation is a little different.

In most of these a "park" position is provided on the selector quadrant, and with the selector in this position a pawl is engaged with a toothed cog wheel.

The cog wheel is connected to the tail shaft, and when it is locked the tail shaft and rear wheels are automatically locked as well. The vehicle is immobile.

In theory this should be a more positive safeguard than a conventional gearbox held in gear.

The gearbox relies on the reluctance of the stationary engine to be revolved by the car's movement, while the other is a positive mechanical lock.

However, if the automatic transmission "park" device becomes worn it can "jump" the cog wheel on a steep slope.

Similarly the car with a conventional gearbox can move off if the engine condition is below par and the cylinder compressions are weak.

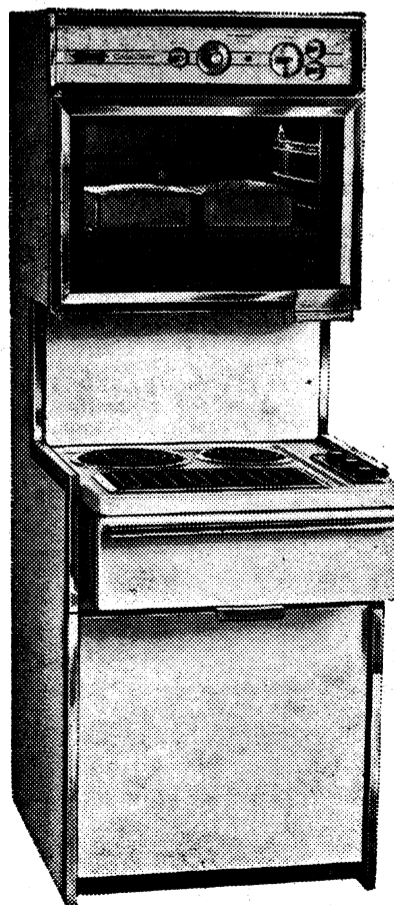
