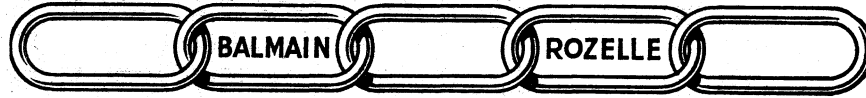

Local Shopping Amounts To Display Of Common Sense

"The Link" wants this week to lay stress upon the common sense of shopping locally, which involves the question of personal convenience as well as that of loyalty to the area in which one lives.

True Balmainites consider that the district's particular appeal as a living area is two-fold:

- It has a peculiar old-world charm, somewhat indefinable at first, but difficult to resist as familiarity with it grows. This is fostered by the existence of so many old-style homes (both cottages and terraces).

- It is conveniently and often prettily located on the edge of the harbour in close proximity to the central city area.

The second appeal — that the district is but a stone's throw from the city — is claimed by some real estate developers to be a major pointer to greater development of the district's residential qualifications.

The two factors, however, could produce some conflict in which the question of loyalty to the local community might be relegated to the background.

This paper feels that many people of the area

are far too slow in showing their appreciation of this community's problems — that they should show more consideration of its needs, and give more support to local businesses.

Clear thinking by the residents should produce a realisation that without support of local enterprise — service men, traders and shopkeepers — they threaten the confident expansion of the district, and tend to convert the area into a mere outer section of the city proper.

This thought would nullify the whole conception of a closely-knit old-world residential area in its own right.

It surely is in the interests of the family man in the Balmain peninsula to help build up local businesses to such an extent that they are able to compete reasonably with the big businesses in the city.

This would enable local shopkeepers to increase their range of goods and thus cater for

most needs, at the right prices and on your own doorstep, so to speak.

The Christmas rush of shopping is now gathering full pace, and real summer weather has arrived with its humidity. Give a thought to the crowds you'll meet in the narrow, tiring city streets if you take your custom away from Balmain and Rozelle.

It is good sense to remember the convenience and ease of shopping locally. Shop here — build up your local community — be loyal to the Balmain spirit, the spirit which brought you to live here and which keeps you living here.

"PAINT-IN" FOR BALMAIN CHILDREN

The Balmain Association has decided to hold another "Paint-In" at the end of the Christmas school holidays — on Saturday, January 30, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Gladstone Park.

At last year's most successful function over 300 children of all ages joined in, resulting in a pile of some 350 works of art.

This time the event will not be in the form of a competition, but the Association will again provide free brushes, paper, easels and paints.

Council's Finances

Consideration of the estimates of income and expenditure of Leichhardt Council for 1971 has been deferred to a meeting of the Finance Committee on December 8.

The estimates, as submitted to a special public meeting of Council recently, would retain the property rate at the existing level — 3 cents in the dollar.

This would occur after elimination of provision for outstanding works valued at nearly \$1 million.

POLLUTION IN BALMAIN: M.L.A.'s CLAIM

The question of pollution in the Balmain area was raised in State Parliament recently by Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain.

Speaking on legislation to set up the Pollution Control Commission, he said that the body would be useless unless it was given adequate powers and facilities to combat pollution. Mr Degen said that one of the greatest problems in his electorate was the recent development of container shipping berths.

"This development took place much against the will of people who live in the area", he said.

"The operator of this terminal, when flushing out these huge containers, shunts them to the eastern end of the terminal and cleans them out with detergents.

"He then employs the 'ultra-hygienic' method of disposing of this detergent waste by allowing it to flow directly into the harbour.

"One wonders what effect this pollution has on the many beauty spots of Sydney Harbour.

"This operator is permitted to do this without interference. I believe

some action should be taken against this practice".

Mr Degen said ships in port were allowed to discharge effluent straight into the harbour.

"The Maritime Services Board allows this to happen", he said. "Yet that same body has recently instructed marine proprietors that they must instal water closets proportionate to the number of vessels for which they cater.

"This authority has shown an awareness to control water pollution in one respect, but is doing nothing to control it in another.

"I hope that following the enactment of this legislation something will be done".

Another problem, said Mr Degen, was the discharge of oil and smoke from ships. The M.S.B. had failed to take positive action to halt these forms of pollution.

He said it was to be hoped the Pollution Control Commission would take much stronger action to protect the Balmain people.

Seat Belt Compulsion

The move by State Governments to make a real effort to persuade motorists and their passengers to use seat belts deserves more than a mere shrug of the shoulders from the man in the street.

There is convincing world-wide evidence that when seat belts are used there is an 80 per cent chance of preventing death or serious injury in a major crash.

The innumerable cases of racing drivers walking away from otherwise fatal crashes should surely impress doubting Thomases.

Some apparently sincere people condemn the move to compel use of seat belts on the ground that it would rob them of their individuality.

What's wrong with that? Isn't that why we have traffic and other laws — to force general adherence to a commonsense code of behaviour?

In view of the appalling road toll and the refusal of so many drivers — especially youthful ones — to admit that their attitude to driving is suicidal, it is essential that Governments should try to save people from their own foolishness.

Those who have not given a proper try to driving in a seat belt should do so before condemning any move to compulsion.

Of course there are problems in making use compulsory, and no doubt the lawmakers will have to consider exclusion of certain classes of drivers (possibly including pregnant women).

However, the real point is: Since we can't drive safely, or can't protect ourselves from the recklessness or stupidity of others, we should be required by law to take advantage of such an obvious bodily protection as a seat belt.

Shipyard Work Hours

Howard Smith Industries Pty. Ltd. has been given permission by Leichhardt Council to continue working extended hours for general engineering, ship repairing and associated activities on its property in Birchgrove (site of the old Balmain Colliery).

The extension of hours sought in the original development application had been agreed to by the Land and Valuation Court.

Council has approved of extension for a further six months, terminating May 15, 1971, or the date of prescription of the conditions laid down by that court.

Scheme, whichever is the shorter period.

Council adopted a recommendation to that effect by its Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, who said that it was emphasised that Council was deeply concerned at the number of complaints being received from residents in the locality about nuisances arising out of the company's operations.

Hence the extension of time was granted without prejudice to Council's referring the matter to the Court if further breaches occurred of the conditions laid down by that court.

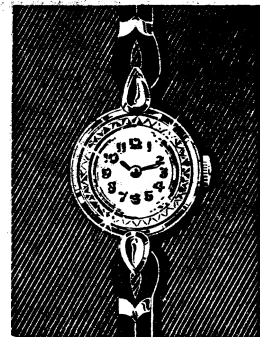

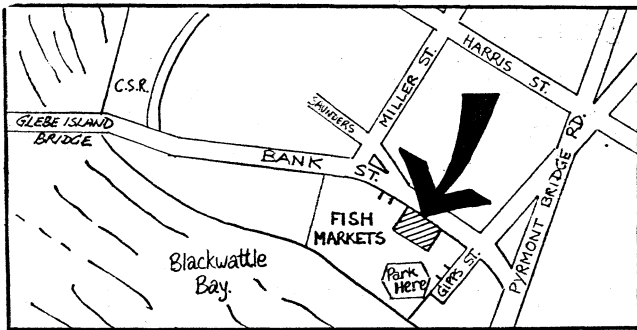

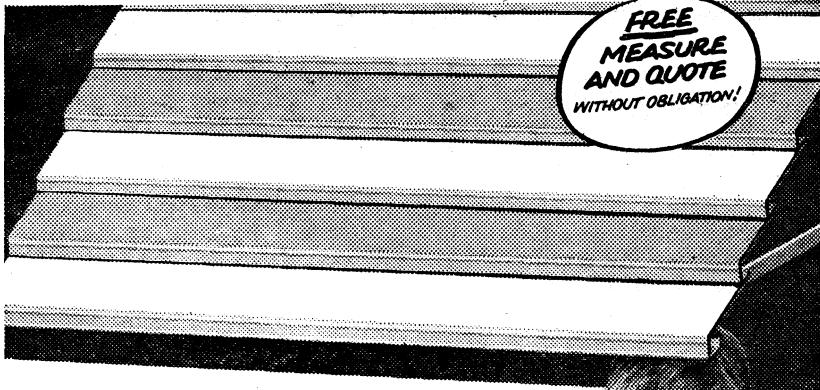

Council Building

Leichhardt Council has decided to accept the tender of J. W. Broomhead (Constructions) Pty. Ltd., of Rozelle, to convert existing premises at No. 4 Marion Street, Leichhardt, to a baby health centre/public library.

The building will have a total floor area of 68 squares. Tender price is \$98,460.

Ald. Origlass (Balmain ward) claimed that, having regard to the stated opinions of the architects, Council's Engineer, and Deputy Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, a wiser course would have been to construct a completely new building.

He said Council had been advised that a new building would cost about the same figure.

COUNCIL NEWS IN BRIEF

Election Of Mayor

A special meeting of Leichhardt Council was fixed for last night (Tuesday) to elect the Mayor for 1971, and to decide as to standing committees.

This issue of "The Link" had gone to press before the meeting was held.

Only Two Aldermen

Each ward in Leichhardt Municipality will be represented on the Council by only two aldermen after the next ordinary election of Council, compared with the present three.

This has been decided by the Minister for Local

Government, Mr Morton.

He has advised Council that the number of aldermen of the municipality will be reduced from 18 to 12, each of the six wards to have two representatives.

Storage Of Petrol

In a minute to Leichhardt Council meeting, the Mayor, Ald. L. J. Rodwell, referred to the application on November 4 by Terminals Pty. Ltd. to extend its current approval to include the storage of all inflammable liquids and dangerous goods Classes 1 and 2, as defined in the Inflammable Liquids Act and regulations thereunder, including petrol.

The Mayor called for an inspection by Council's Works Committee in view of the nature of the application, and the location and level of the depot in relation to closely settled residential development.

Ald. Origlass (Balmain ward) told the meeting that the present situation confirmed the correctness of the attitude of Balmain aldermen in opposing, on behalf of the residents, the Council majority when they approved the chemical farm installation.

He said that appertaining to this question was the fact that the executive of the Local Government Association reported to its 1967 conference the text of Mr Justice Hardie's opinion, given in the Land and Valuation Court.

The executive said that the judge's opinion made it evident that there was no doubt at all about Council's powers to refuse an application on grounds of general public interest, even though it be a perfectly legal and legitimate application in accordance with the Town Plan.

Council approved the Mayor's minute, and set down an inspection for last Saturday morning.

(This matter, of course, is still subject to the appeal lodged by Terminals Pty. Ltd. against the judgment of the Equity Court, which ordered the company to remove all petrol stored at the chemical tank farm.)

No collector will be authorised to accept cash donations.

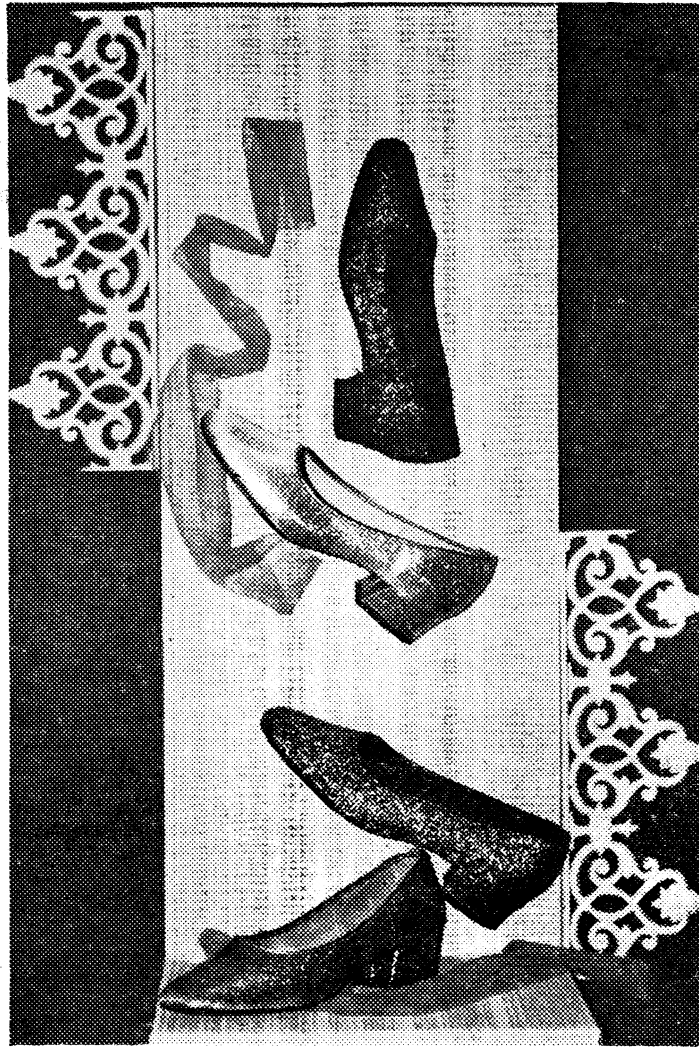
