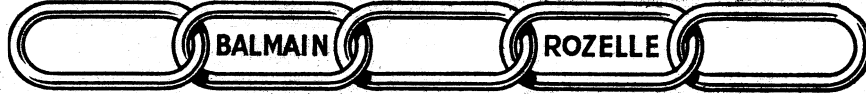

Some Action on Balmain's Traffic Problems

Action is proceeding or about to proceed in several directions aimed at easing some of the traffic problems of the Balmain peninsula.

Some important schemes are dependent upon co-ordination of the traffic light signals in Victoria Road in the neighbourhood of the Darling Street intersection.

This work will be performed by the Department of Motor Transport in the coming year.

Discussions have been proceeding between Leichhardt Council and the traffic police about the problem of the intersection of Robert and Mullens Streets.

Heavy industrial traffic to and from the White Bay container terminal creates difficulties which call for channelisation of traffic at this intersection.

It was expected that the channelisation work

would have been completed before this, but it is now learned that it will be delayed until other work associated with the traffic light co-ordination is tackled.

Cenotaph Location

Discussions and inspections are now taking place about the suggestion to seek a more suitable location for the cenotaph in Loyalty Square.

This suggestion was made last September by Inspector L. Dingwell, second-in-charge of Balmain police.

He said then that he considered the present position most unsuitable because of the traffic

hazard it created.

He respected the position in the hearts and minds of the people, but he said that in the spot in which it was located it could not possibly arouse the respect and reverence to which it was entitled.

Mr Dingwell suggested that consideration should be given to the question of moving the cenotaph to Gladstone Park.

He said that traffic from East Balmain often travelled far too fast at the intersection, and this danger would increase when the Westfield Development scheme of a supermarket was implemented.

So far no objections have been received to the suggestion, and the question has become one of some urgency in view of the approaching demolition of buildings in the area to make way for the supermarket.

Turn At Darling St.

Meanwhile The Balmain Association has been advised, in response to its approach to the Police Department, that the police intend to change the right-hand turn rule at Victoria Road and Darling Street.

There is now a prohibition on a turn to the right into Victoria Road out of Darling Street (from the direction of Balmain) between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

The Association has been advised that this will be altered to prohibitions only in the peak hours — between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m., and between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.

PLAY CENTRE FOR BALMAIN IN HOLIDAYS

The Department of Education has accepted Leichhardt Council's choice of Balmain Public School, Gladstone Park, as an official Departmental play centre during the coming mid-summer vacation.

Three play centres were selected by Council, and the Department has agreed to the selection.

They are at Balmain Public School, Leichhardt School, and Jubilee Oval (Glebe).

These official play centres have been in operation for some years, and depend upon the co-operation and financial assistance of the local Council.

They will be operating between January 4 and January 22, inclusive.

CONTAINER TERMINALS: PREMIER'S ASSURANCE

The Premier (Mr Askin) has told Mr Roger Degen, M.L.A. for Balmain, that the Government would seek the views of Balmain people before any further container terminals were built in the area.

Mr Degen told the Premier that the Balmain people were very concerned about the possibility of more container berths being allowed in the electorate.

He said the Government had decided on the White Bay site after receiving expert advice that it was the only suitable site available.

That advice had been strongly disputed by Balmain residents, who claimed that other sites,

which would cause less traffic congestion and noise nuisance, would be just as suitable.

Mr Degen said the advice given by the experts was now open to challenge following the decision to build terminals at Glebe Island.

Because of this he had sought an assurance from Mr Askin that should another container site be suddenly discovered it would not be in the Balmain electorate.

Mr Askin replied that he understood Mr Degen's concern. The Government would give close consideration to his views, and would make sure the views of Balmain residents were given full consideration.

CHRISTMAS PARKING

For the busy shopper, the tempo of increasing tempo of Christmas purchasing lays accent on the steadily diminishing amount of parking space available in the shopping centres of Balmain and Rozelle.

Space is steadily diminishing because car ownership continues to rise and at peak shopping periods there is a greater demand on the space available — which remains at its miserable worst.

With still no sign of any remedial action by anybody (other than developers of new shopping projects), the public simply has to make the best of conditions.

Unfortunately the Christmas shopping rush coincides with sticky summer weather, which places greater importance upon use of the family car by harassed shoppers.

For this reason "The Link" urges everybody concerned to give a little extra thought between now and Christmas to the needs of others in regard to shopper parking locally.

Side streets should be used wherever convenient when parking for any lengthy period. This applies particularly to business people, some of whom appear to occupy the kerb outside their own premises for far too long.

Thoughtfulness for others calls for sensible and economical use of kerb space in congested areas.

Cars are often left quite a way from their neighbours before and behind — yet too close to accommodate another car.

When this happens a couple of times in an average block several shoppers are denied accommodation.

Yet don't park so close to your neighbour that he can't get out!

Let's make it a real season of goodwill this Christmas.

INFANTS' SCHOOL ENROLMENT

A new regulation for enrolling young children commencing school in 1971 has been announced by the N.S.W. Department of Education.

A departmental statement says that this is designed to provide a more effective enrolment method enabling the best educational advantages to be afforded.

All children who will be five years of age prior to August 1 next will be eligible for enrolment in the infants' grades of public schools as they attain the age of four years and nine months.

Such children may be enrolled on the first Wednesday of the first school term and thereafter until April 30.

With the exception of children transferring from one school to another and those of the statutory age (six years), there will be no enrolment in infants' grades in public schools during the second and third terms of 1971.

The Department has found that children

periods are invariably required to remain in the infants' grades in the following year.

This often has a psychological effect detrimental to their progress during the early formative years in the infants' grades.

Further information may be obtained from the principal of the nearest primary school.

Balmain Infants

The mistresses of Balmain Infants' School, Gladstone Park, advise that children whose

birthday occurs before August 1 next are eligible for enrolment on Wednesday, February 3, 1971.

Girls will be enrolled at 9 a.m., and boys at 10 a.m.

Their attendance will commence when they reach 4 years 9 months.

The mistresses ask parents to see that their child's name is put on the waiting list prior to December 17, to insure

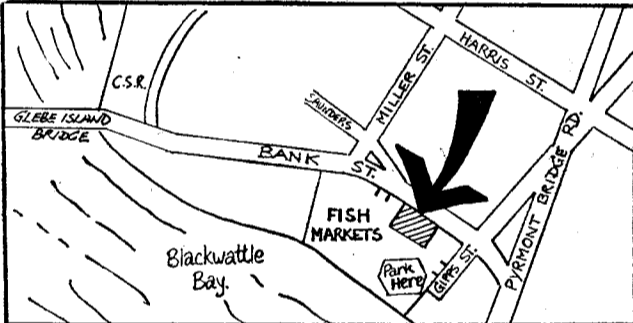

Despite his age, Mr Lang travels daily from his home in the Blue Mountains to his city office, where he takes an active part in the publishing of a newspaper.

The President of Balmain Rotary Club, Mr Warren Cush, when introducing the speaker, expressed the appreciation of the Club in having such a famous personality in attendance.
