

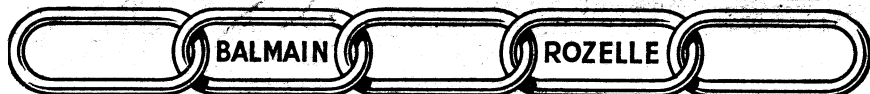

# Specialist Teaching Of English To Migrants

**The N.S.W. Education Department is increasing the attention it has been paying to solving the English language problems of migrants in Sydney's inner suburbs, including Rozelle and Balmain. One plan being implemented is the appointment of specialist teachers of English where the need arises.**

Mr E. C. Colman, Director of Education for the Central Metropolitan Area, was asked by "The Link" to comment on the result of a survey of the English reading and comprehension abilities made recently by high school teachers in Melbourne.

The author of that survey, Mr T. Roper, said it showed a need for intensive English language courses for students of inner suburban high schools.

Most students in these schools came from migrant homes where English was not spoken, or poor homes where reading was not encouraged.

### Urgency

The author concluded that English programmes were an urgent necessity for many migrant students, and inner suburban schools required special language courses.

High school students in industrialised suburbs were found to have far lower English reading and comprehension abilities than those in wealthier suburbs.

He added that that finding applied to all Australian States.

Mr Colman said he was loth to make a statement about conditions in Sydney unless he had completed a survey himself.

However, said Mr Colman, the N.S.W. Education Department was very active in tackling the migrant problem in Sydney.

It had appointed specialist English teachers to 21 high schools and 38 primary schools in the central metropolitan area.

These were teaching English to migrants who were either non-English speaking when coming to the school, or had language difficulties.

### At Rozelle

Rozelle Boys' Junior High School was the only one on the Balmain peninsula to be so serviced, one full-time specialist teacher being employed to instruct migrants in English.

The pupils concerned were mainly in the primary school.

Mr Colman said, however, that the need for help in this respect was growing in Balmain.

He was keeping a close eye on the matter, and would supply a specialist teacher wherever the need for one was demonstrated.

Any formal request for assistance would be met.

However, when there were only two or three pupils needing special help, it was felt that the class teacher could cope, with the help of the book produced by the Department for the situation.

This book is titled "English For Us" (Book 1), produced in the central metropolitan area under the supervision of Inspector Miss Olive Nichols, who was recently appointed inspector in charge of migrant teaching in N.S.W.

A guide to teachers accompanies the book, which costs \$2 to produce, and becomes the pupil's own property.

Book 2 of "English For Us", a more advanced text book, will be available some time in 1971.

Mr Colman said that improvement of the children's English was most dramatic under the specialist teaching system.

It was not "Just a show", for the teachers did a really good job.

### For Mothers

He said it was most disappointing that the experiment at Rozelle Junior Boys' High School to teach English to foreign migrant mothers had failed through lack of support by the migrants.

He did not know the reason for failure.

However, the class could be restarted should there be a demand for it. A similar class held at Marrickville had gone "pretty well".

## STATE LIBERAL CANDIDATE IS ROBERT WARD

**Mr Robert Ward, a young Balmain businessman, has been endorsed by the Liberal Party of Australia as its candidate for the Balmain electorate in the forthcoming State elections.**

Mr Ward is 24 years old, and is a partner in a Balmain Public Accounting firm.

He holds a Bachelor of Commerce degree (specialising in accountancy) from the University of New South Wales, and is a member of the Australian Society of Accountants.

For some years he has been active in the Junior Chamber of Commerce (Jaycees), a young men's organisation designed to train them for leadership and community responsibility, and is currently Secretary of the Balmain Jaycees Chapter.

He is a member of the Balmain Branch of the Liberal Party, and was local campaign director in the 1970 Senate elections.

Mr Ward told "The Link" that he learned a good deal about the machinery of politics and the role of the politician in public life while working on the administrative staff of the Legislative Assembly at Parliament House, Sydney.

During his association with the Jaycees movement he had formed a political affairs committee in the Sydney Chapter, where he arranged for guest speakers and topics on political problems.

Mr Ward said he would welcome meeting the present Member for

Balmain, Mr Roger Dege-

en, at a public meeting

where they could debate their respective policies regarding local problems. Asked what his policy was towards these local problems, Mr Ward said that he kept a close eye on what the people of the electorate were doing and saying, and on the effect of Government and Local Government activities upon the lives of the people.

He was exceptionally interested in the question of the effect on living amenity of industrial activity, such as containerisation and resultant problems of pollution and traffic worries.

Mr Ward said that of course the Jaycees were a non-political body.

However, they did try to bring home to people of all parties the necessity to overcome public apathy in public matters.

For instance, one of his current major activities on the Balmain Jaycees Chapter was an effort to fight people's apathy towards Local Government matters.

The Chapter's committee of which he was chairman — the Local Government Action Committee — had started a campaign to arouse public interest in Council affairs, a report of which had already been published in "The Link".

A pilot survey had now been completed, and the results of this would be used as foundation for the campaign.

## Column NINE

### The Mother Tongue

A Melbourne survey has found that high schools in industrialised suburbs of Australian cities have far lower English reading and comprehension abilities than those in wealthier suburbs.

Reasons for this would not be difficult to find. Some are:

- Parents themselves lack skill in English writing, reading and speaking, producing a home atmosphere unfavourable for learning.

- Children's slant in employment is often towards the trades and technical careers, ignoring the value of classical education in producing easy understanding of English language makeup.

- Family incomes may be insufficient for provision of adequate books for study, and lack of room for quiet home study may stultify effort.

How much the Balmain peninsula qualifies for the term "industrialised suburbs" we would not know, but it must be involved to some extent.

And now we see the real point of the free municipal library movement.

Leichhardt Municipality is one of the more industrialised parts of Sydney, yet is one of the few without a Council library.

Can any alderman explain why? Aren't our representatives as interested in people's English - communication problems as those in wealthier municipalities?

One bright ray on the scene is the opening of The Balmain Association's children's library. This must help youngsters, and deserves fullest support.

Meanwhile, how about sowing a seed for your youngster's future by making an English reference work — encyclopaedia or Thesaurus — his or her Christmas box?

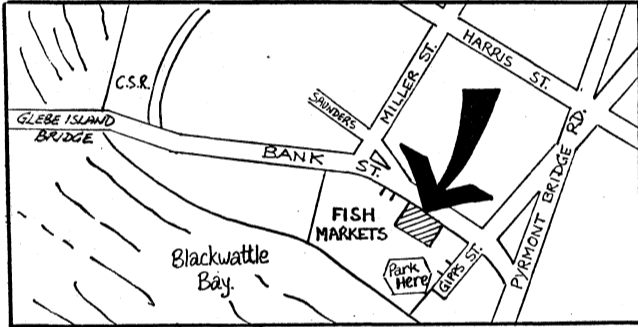

**Container  
Terminals**

In "The Link" (Dec. 9) you referred to assurances given by the Premier to Mr Degen, M.L.A., in connection with the possible construction of further container terminals in the Balmain area. Mr Degen is reported to have said that the decision to build additional container terminals at Glebe Island raised a doubt as to whether the siting of the present terminals at White Bay was a correct decision.

This statement by Mr Degen is very difficult to follow, and if he is correctly reported one can only conclude that he is unaware of the progress made in the handling of containers through the Port of Sydney.

A notable omission from his Press statement is the further comment of the Premier in referring to the White Bay terminals: "The consensus is that these terminals have been a success . . . I believe that N.S.W. is leading the other States in this modern type of shipping development".

This remark sums up the position.

One million tons of the cargo moving through the port last year was carried in containers and moved through the White Bay container berths.

By the end of 1972 as much as 3½ million tons, or 70%, of the five million tons of general cargo now handled at the port will be moving in containers.

The building of a further two container berths at Glebe Island is designed to cater for this expansion.

The extension of container operations in this way was predictable and the further development of Glebe Island was planned to be undertaken as soon as the wharves in that area could be

# Two Petitions To Council Being Prepared

The Balmain aldermen are circulating two petitions for public signature — one in regard to the system of voting at the next Council elections, the other in regard to the storage of petrol at the Vincent Street chemical tank "farm".

Ald. N. Origlass said that the Balmain ward aldermen had initiated a petition to have next year's Leichhardt Council election conducted under the system of proportional representation.

Under this system, he said, strong minorities would have an opportunity of having their opinions represented on Council.

Ald. Origlass said that 500 electors had signed the petition as a result of a week-end canvass of one-tenth of the Balmain ward.

"About 90 per cent of the electors interviewed have signed", he said.

"While some 5,000 signatures throughout the municipality are required, the favourable response so far has indicated that if all groups interested in civic affairs are willing to do a little leg-work on the petition they could achieve a new deal in the coming election, particularly for the forgotten Balmain and Rozelle wards".

Ald. Origlass said the form of the petition as

required under the Local Government Act was a simple one, as follows:

"We enrolled electors of the Municipality of Leichhardt pray that a poll be taken on the question of adopting the system of election according to the principle of proportional representation".

The petition is addressed to the Town Clerk of Leichhardt.

Elections are now conducted under the system of preferential voting.

At next election, according to the decision of the Minister for Local Government, the number of aldermen to be elected for each of the six wards of Leichhardt Municipality will be two, compared with the present three.

The second petition is again to Leichhardt Council, and is being circulated in the area around the Vincent St. tank farm.

the present use of the premises "To store some 390,000 gallons of petrol with the low flash point of minus 40 deg. Fah., and to the aim of the company, Terminals Pty. Ltd., to continue such storage (up to one million gallons) for a further 13 years".

The petition adds: "We must now live in constant fear of a disastrous fire and/or explosion, with possible terrible consequences.

"The action of the company only confirms our attitude that the chemical tank farm should never have been approved by Council on lands previously zoned as Residential Class A, and scenic protection area under the Leichhardt Planning Scheme".

The petition asks Council to rectify past mistakes by placing a ban on the storage of petrol at the "farm".

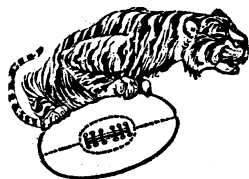

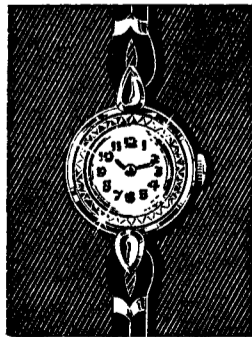

## TRAFFIC CHANNELS AT TRICKY CORNER

A system of channelisation is being operated at the intersection of Robert and Mullens Streets, Rozelle, following placing of a sandbag emplacement in the intersection.

The work has been carried out by the traffic police in conjunction with Leichhardt Council.
