

Column The Mother Tongue

A Melbourne survey has found that high schools in industrialised suburbs of Australian cities have far lower English reading and compre-hension abilities than those in wealthier suburbs.

Reasons for this would not be difficult to find. Some are:

• Parents them-selves lack skill in English writing, reading and speaking, producing a home atmosphere unfavou r a b l e for learning.

• Children's slant in employment is often towards the trades and technical careers, ignoring the value of classical education in producing easy understanding of Eng-






