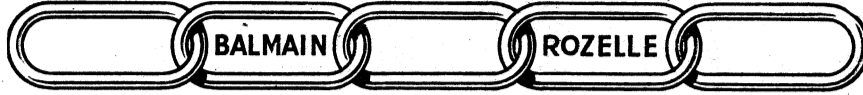

NEW TRAFFIC PLAN FOR BALMAIN STARTS SOON

The problems experienced by motorists entering and leaving the Balmain peninsula are expected to be solved in about a month's time with the initiation of traffic lighting co-ordination at intersections with Victoria Road of the various cross streets in the neighbourhood of Darling Street.

The Department of Motor Transport reports that the work should be completed and the whole system in operation by the middle of May.

The new system is designed to give a smooth run alternately to traffic along Victoria Road and to traffic crossing or entering it between Moodie Street in the west and Lilyfield Road in the east.

The work involves installation of light signals at the intersection with Victoria Road of the following streets: Moodie Street, Wellington Street, Evans Street, Gordon Street, Robert Street, and Lilyfield Road.

The Median

Included in the work is the re-opening of the median strip in Victoria Road at Evans Street, and the closing of the median at the intersection of Lilyfield Road and Victoria Road.

"Walk" and "Don't Walk" signs are being introduced into the signals at the Darling Street intersection.

Just how the system will operate will depend upon experience.

The Department's traffic engineers will draw up experimental programmes to control through and cross traffic, and will adjust them as the necessity arises.

The intention at the moment is to operate the network of signals on a time basis. Any "bugs" developing will be ironed out as they occur.

Traffic signal co-ordination, although not without its problems, has proved of major importance at trouble spots throughout the world.

Parts of Sydney already being controlled in this way are Brisbane Street, city, and Broadway.

The steady increase in heavy traffic to and from the Balmain container terminals has made this plan essential for the Balmain peninsula.

A small brick structure in Graham Street, Rozelle, at its intersection with Victoria Road, will house a master control to handle the situation.

It will be entirely automatic.

A major problem which should be solved by the system is the hazard now facing drivers who wish to leave the Balmain peninsula and turn west along Victoria Road.

A right-turn is not permitted from Darling Street into Victoria Road at peak hours.

Hence drivers wishing to go west along Victoria Road have to go either via Wellington Street, or cross Victoria Road at Darling Street and go the round-about route via Waterloo and Moodie Streets.

In the industrial peak hour there is considerable bank-up of traffic in Wellington Street desiring to turn to the right into Victoria Road, and split-second decisions are often called for in making the turn.

Cross Routes

The route via Waterloo and Moodie involves a right-turn across Balmain-bound traffic in Darling Street, and heavy traffic streams in Victoria Road (which have the right of way, being on the right) at the Moodie Street intersection.

East of Darling Street in Victoria Road, the installation of lights at both Gordon and Evans Streets should permit easy access to and departure from the Balmain peninsula in that area.

In addition they will help the overall scheme by relieving Darling Street of a certain amount of traffic forced into it by the closing of the Victoria Road medi-

Lighting In Mullens St. Criticised

Balmain police have received several strong complaints from motorists, including visitors to the area, about the inefficiency of street lighting in Mullens Street.

It is pointed out that the street is one of the busiest in the district, but the nature of its lighting puts it into the category of a country lane.

One complaint said that the lamps were very old-fashioned, and that it was time they were replaced with something more sophisticated.

The lights at the Robert Street intersection, of course, will be of major importance in controlling the movement of heavy trucks to and from the White Bay container terminal.

Two Balmain Men To Join Peace Force In Cyprus

Two of Balmain's top-ranking police officers have been selected as members of the Commonwealth peace-keeping force on the Mediterranean island of Cyprus.

They are Inspector Len Dingwell and First-class Sergeant Neville Carmady.

Inspector Dingwell, who lives in East Balmain with his wife (well known as an authoress), is one of this district's best-known citizens. He is second in charge of the Balmain police district.

Sergt. Carmady and his wife live at Five Dock. A first-class sergeant for about three years, he was engaged in licensing duties before being transferred to his present position of general duties.

The two officers will be part of the eight-man contingent from New South Wales, which will join contingents from other states and the A.C.T. to comprise the Australian section of the Commonwealth peace

force. They were selected from a list of police officers volunteering for this duty.

The contingent will do 12 months' duty on the island, supplementing contingents from other United Nations member nations, to police the island so as to ensure peaceful co-existence between the Turkish and Greek members of the population.

This work calls for physically fit, clear-thinking men with a sense of diplomacy.

Their year's duty also is intended to give them overseas experience which will benefit them in their work here.

Present intention is that they will leave for Cyprus early in May. They will not be accompanied by their wives.

Boys' Club Needs Help

Readers cannot have failed to notice the constant appeals in "The Link" by the Balmain Police-Citizens' Boys' Club for help from people ready to give a few hours weekly to act as instructors or supervisors.

These have been supported by two recent letters to the editor deploring lack of public support.

This paper believes the situation calls for more enthusiasm from the community.

Also, activity such as a Boys' Club is needed particularly in less opulent districts, and in this respect the Balmain-Rozelle district must be included.

The police are to be congratulated on their initiative and enthusiasm in creating and operating the Boys' Club movement.

We want to be able to congratulate the "Citizens" as well. So let's give the Club all the support it requires.

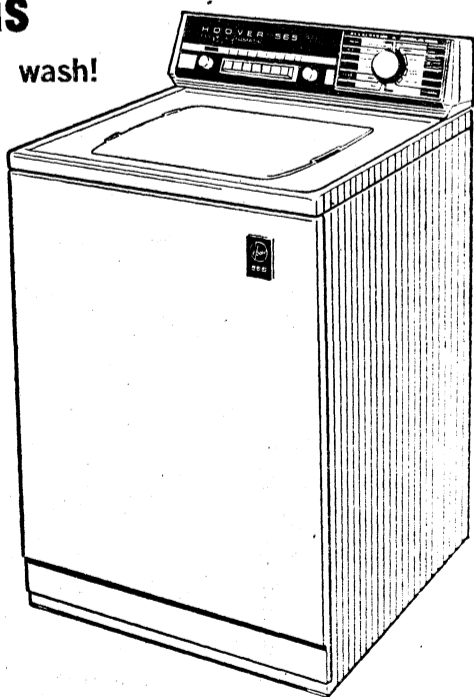

Sale Of Pharmacy Breaks Link With Early Days

Another link with the early days in Balmain has been broken with change of ownership of the Darling Street pharmacy of Washington H. Soul, Pattinson & Co. Ltd.

It has been purchased by Mr A. H. Corkill, manager of the store since 1944.

Mr Corkill told "The Link" that the Pharmacy Act of N.S.W. prevented the company increasing the number of locations at which it traded.

When the company decided to open a new store in Penrith recently, it was required to dispose of one of its existing chain, and the Balmain store was selected for sale.

The Darling Street shop, said Mr Corkill, was the birthplace of this prominent Australian company.

It was opened on December 5, 1883, by Mr L. M. Pattinson, who formed a company known as Pattinson & Co. among mainly Balmain businessmen, and extended into other suburbs as business boomed.

One reason for early success was the policy of keeping prices of goods low by maintaining supplies (from England), instead of raising them as shortages occurred through short-sighted failure to maintain them.

About 1899 the company bought out its opposition, Washington H. Soul & Co., and the two names were combined.

The founder's grandson, Mr J. S. Millner, is now Chairman of Directors.

The founder's son, Dr. W. F. Pattinson, who recently died, was born over the Darling Street shop.

The new owner, Mr Corkill, is a descendant of Balmain people several generations back.

He said he hoped to continue the good service of the past. He remains an agent for the Soul-Pattinson products.

BALMAIN P. & C. MEETING

At the annual meeting of the Balmain Parents and Citizens' Association Mr R. Nelson was elected President, Mrs G. Sterrey Secretary, and Mrs H. Mallett Treasurer.

In her annual report, the Secretary, Mrs Sterrey, said that the main concern had been the drop in attendance at the monthly meetings to an average of 11.

She said that this restricted the variety of ideas for functions to be planned and worked for each year.

It was vital that public schools should have active and well patronised P. & C. Associations, since the \$2.80 Government allowance per year for each child was hardly sufficient for even the most essential school needs.

It was certainly insufficient for the extras which helped towards a better education.

Nevertheless the members had worked hard and had had a full and exciting year.

The school fete had produced \$900 for the P. & C., which hoped to make part of it available for erection of a badly needed weather shed in the kindergarten playground.

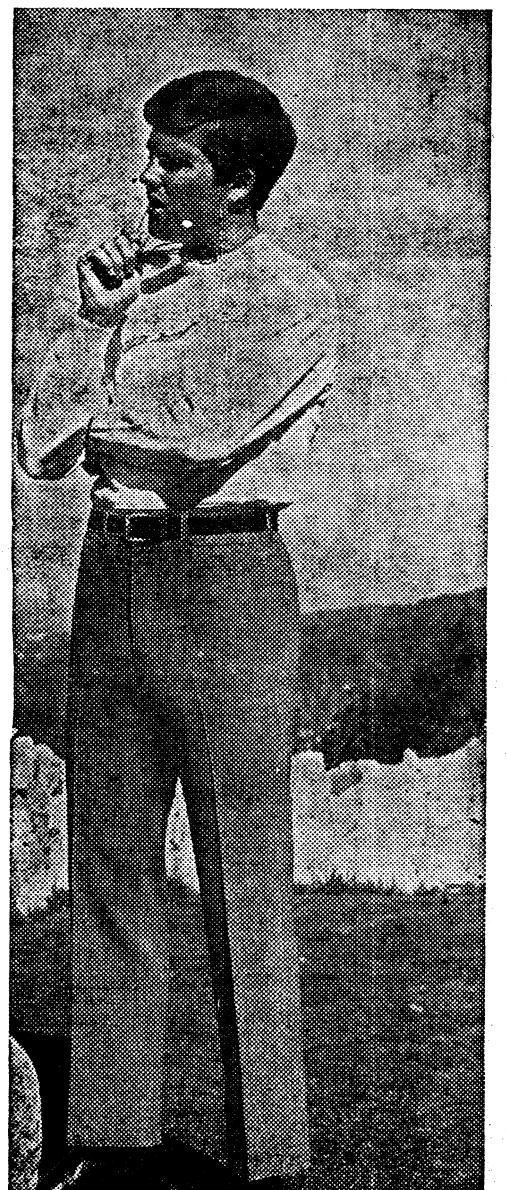

MOTORISTS' BAD HABITS GROWING

The N.R.M.A. legal section reports that many motorists are becoming indifferent in signalling their intention to turn right.

Most drivers are aware that when stopping or turning right they can now show their intentions by using their brake lights or signalling devices rather than by hand signal.

However, when stopping, turning or diverging to the right the Traffic Regulations still insist that a driver must give a clear signal of his intention, if practicable, at least 100 feet before turning or stopping.

The signal must be "continued by the driver as long as is necessary to give other users of the road clear indication of his intention".

One bad habit which appears to be increasing, says the N.R.M.A., is the tendency for drivers to delay their signal for a

right hand turn right up to the point where the turn is to be made.

This completely ignores the regulation's requirement that the signal be given at least 100 feet beforehand.

The N.R.M.A. says this habit is becoming particularly noticeable at intersections controlled by traffic lights.

Many drivers approach the intersection, stop on the red signal, then wait until the green appears before flashing their turn signals.

Not only is this against the rules, but it can cause confusion and congestion amongst the traffic building up behind.

Another source of confusion is the driver who signals a turn and either forgets later to cancel the signal or who drives for a long distance without turning.

The Association says that while the traffic laws make no provision for left turn signals, most vehicles now are equipped with signals for both directions.

Use of a left turn signal is wise, as it is a useful guide to following traffic and pedestrians.

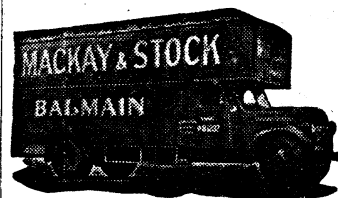
