

A Roll of Electors and Ratepayers

# MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

First news of the forthcoming municipal election in this area comes with the advertisement in this issue from Leichhardt Council advising us that it is now prepar-ing the roll of electors.

This paper trusts the people of the municipality will take lue note, and do their part of the work involved.

Last general election in the Local Govrnment sphere was in December, 1968, and the interest shown in it by the vast majority of the people of the State was dis-gracefully low.

Only about one in three of persons entitled to vote bothered to go to the polls! -

Yet so many people are heard continually complaining about what goes on in Council Chambers everywhere!

Your democratic duty demands that if you are entitled to be on the roll you should ensure that your name is there, and in due course record an intelligent vote.

Those entitled to vote are ratepayers, some occupiers of non - residential property, and all district residents who are on the Parliamentary electoral roll for the area in which they live. Ratepayers are (or should be) automatically enrolled, although a representative has to be nominated for any company or corporate body owning or occupying ratable property. Ordinary electors on the Parlia mentary roll for the area in which they live are probably already on the municipal roll, but they should check Balmain - Rozelle people have, like those elsewhere, substantial reasons why they should be truly represented on their Council. Enrolment is the first necessary step



will be prepared for the purposes of the triennial ordinary election of the Council, to be held on Saturday, 18th September, 1971.

The roll will be prepared separately for each ward from the list kept by the Council of persons who have the requisite qualifications to be electors for the ward and persons concerned are invited to verify with the Council as soon as possible that their names appear on such list.

Any occupier of a shop, office, factory or other non-residential property within the ward who has been in continuous occupation of such premises as a direct tenant of the owner or ratepaying lessee of the property for the relevant period of one month, may lodge a claim to have his name included in the list. Bodies corporate and trustees similarly in occupation are entitled to nominate a person for inclusion on the list.

Forms for this purpose may be obtained at the Town Hall, 107 Norton Street, Leichhardt, or will be forwarded on request.

For the purposes of enrolment for the abovementioned election, claims for enrolment must be received in the office of the Council on or before 21st June, 1971.
