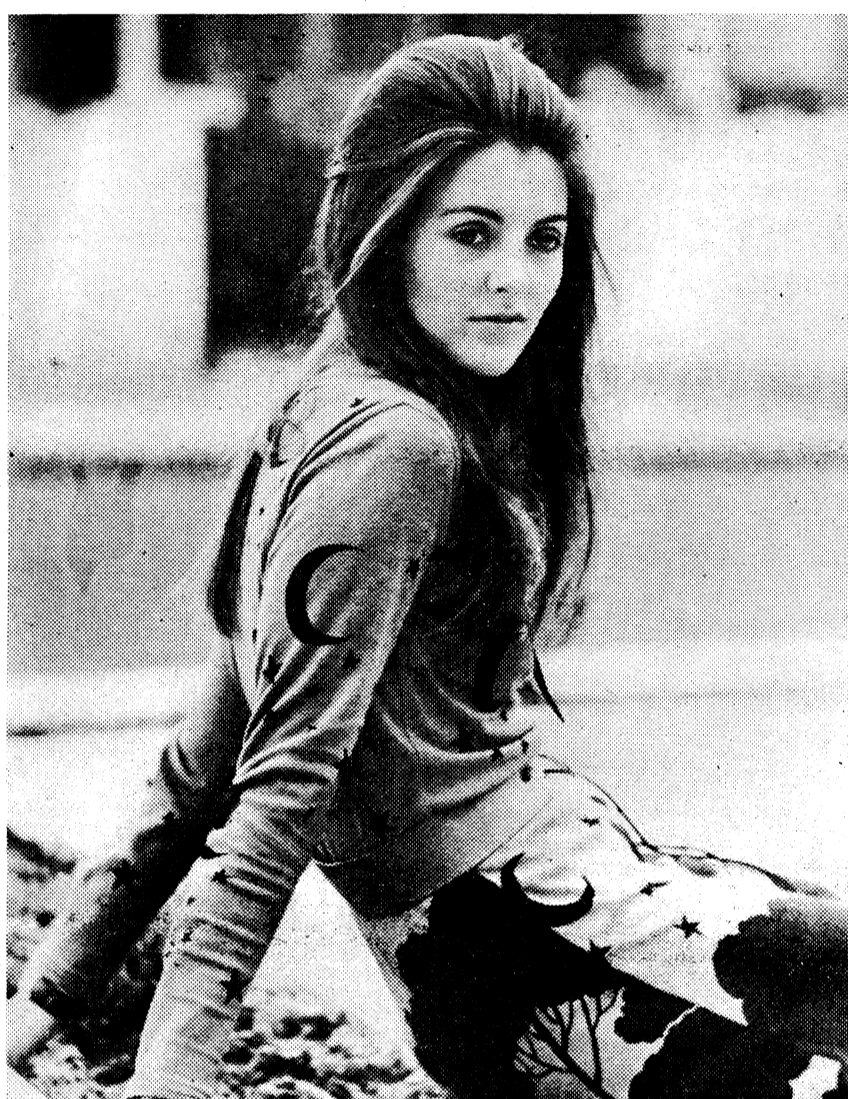

Column NINE

MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

First news of the forthcoming municipal election in this area comes with the advertisement in this issue from Leichhardt Council advising us that it is now preparing the roll of electors.

This paper trusts the people of the municipality will take due note, and do their part of the work involved.

Last general election in the Local Government sphere was in December, 1968, and the interest shown in it by the vast majority of the people of the State was disgracefully low.

Only about one in three of persons entitled to vote bothered to go to the polls!

Yet so many people are heard continually complaining about what goes on in Council Chambers everywhere!

Your democratic duty demands that if you are entitled to be on the roll you should ensure that your name is there, and in due course record an intelligent vote.

Those entitled to vote are ratepayers, some occupiers of non-residential property, and all district residents who are on the Parliamentary electoral roll for the area in which they live.

Ratepayers are (or should be) automatically enrolled, although a representative has to be nominated for any company or corporate body owning or occupying rateable property.

Ordinary electors on the Parliamentary roll for the area in which they live are probably already on the municipal roll, but they should check it.

Balmain-Rozelle people have, like those elsewhere, substantial reasons why they should be truly represented on their Council. Enrolment is the first necessary step

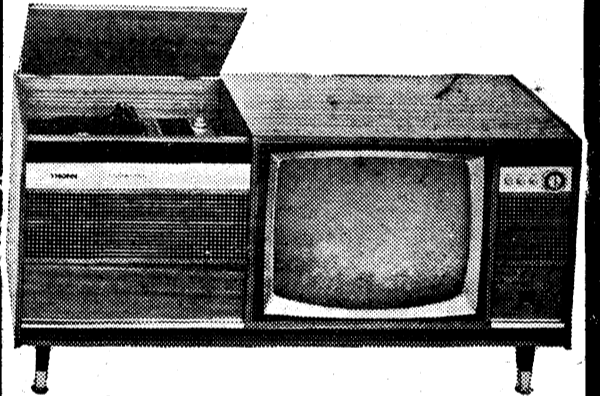

CENOTAPH TO MOVE TO NEW POSITION

Leichhardt Council has agreed to the request of the Balmain-Rozelle R.S.L. Sub-branch for removal of the Balmain cenotaph from Loyalty Square to a more suitable location. Council will ask the Sub-branch to share the cost of removal.

The location decided on is Gladstone Park.

The R.S.L.'s request followed the suggestion made to it by Inspector Len Dingwell, of the Balmain police.

At its last meeting Council carried a motion by Ald. Heffernan (Rozelle ward) that the monument be moved to Gladstone Park; that the R.S.L. and Council jointly defray the cost of removal; and that the Police Traffic Branch be asked its views on channelisation at the intersection.

Council's decision was against the recommendation of the Municipal Engineer, Mr G. Wilson.

In his report on the proposal, Mr Wilson said the war memorial at present served as a traffic separator. Should it be removed, traffic is-

lands would be necessary in Loyalty Square to control traffic flow.

A quotation of \$844 had been received for removal and re-erection of the memorial at a nearby location.

Gladstone Park would provide the most suitable alternative site.

However, in view of the cost involved, and the possible complaints from local residents having ties with the memorial, he did not consider relocation was justified.

Mr Wilson said the supermarket now under construction at Loyalty Square would generate additional traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, and this would necessitate the provision of traffic islands at the intersection, for reasons of safety.

A proposal for channelisation of the intersection had been prepared, as shown on Council's Plan.

The channelisation proposal could serve the two-fold purpose of traffic control and providing safety zones for visitors to the memorial and those crossing the roadway in Loyalty Square.

He recommended: • That the R.S.L. be informed that Council did not favour relocation, but that it had prepared a scheme for channelisation at the spot which would nullify the need for relocation.

• That the Police Department be supplied with a copy of Council's plan of channelisation for comment and approval.

• That channelisation—to cost \$2520—be referred for consideration with other proposed works for 1972.

Inhibiting

Aldermen Origglass and Wyner (Balmain ward) supported Mr Wilson's views and moved an amendment seeking adoption of his recommendation.

They considered the monument was now an inhibiting factor in respect of danger from the movement of big motor vehicles, and stressed the matter of anticipated traffic growth following construction of the supermarket.

Their amendment, however, was defeated.

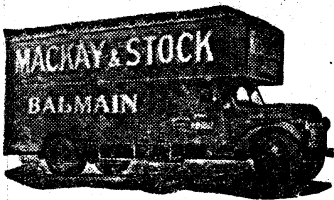
