

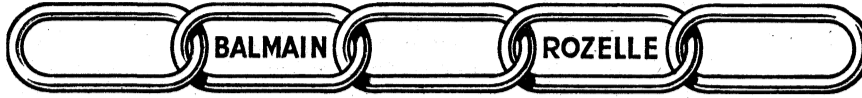

Controversial Development Plans Approved

Two subjects involving objections by residents to commercial development in Balmain were resolved by Leichhardt Council last week in favour of the applicants. One was the controversial plan for the construction of a commercial marina in Iron Cove fronting Tilba Avenue; the other was the construction of a two-storey residential flat building in Wharf Road.

The marina application, made by Mr H. J. Stride, has been strongly opposed by Balmain ward aldermen and a number of local residents.

The proposal was originally referred to Council by the Maritime Services Board in June, 1970, and has been considered by Council several times.

The applicant proposes to extend the existing 77 ft-long jetty to 365 ft into Iron Cove with a row of piles 20 ft from the jetty, and to construct a new slipway about 80 ft long in front of No. 5 Tilba Avenue.

The Council's Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, urged Council to express its opposition to the development of an industrial and commercial nature there.

At last week's Council meeting a report was received from the Works Committee meeting, which recommended that Council should decide that it had no objection to the construction of the marina, and that the petitioners be advised accordingly.

Zoning

A motion to adopt that recommendation was put, and carried without discussion apart from an unsuccessful effort by the three Balmain aldermen to amend it by substituting the Town Planner's original recommendation.

In moving his amendment, Ald. N. Origlass referred to the danger of operating in a way that would be detrimental to Council's bona fides in that Council had already determined the zoning of the area and that the

proposition would be in conflict with that zoning.

He said that when the plan went for final submission to the Minister for Local Government it could open the way for alteration of the zoning. "The fear in the minds of residents", said Ald. Origlass, "is in regard to possible developments at a later date in regard to repair of vessels".

When the amendment was rejected, Ald. Origlass submitted a motion to rescind the decision, which means that no action can be taken by Council on the subject until the rescission motion is dealt with.

Flats Plan

The second subject was a development application by Dreadnought Trading Pty. Ltd. to erect a 2-storey residential flat building in Wharf Road.

The building would comprise eight 2-storey bedroom flats at 2-4 Wharf Road and part lot 15 Ballast Point Road.

The area is zoned 2b Residential B in the Leichhardt Planning Scheme and is included in the foreshore scenic protection area under that scheme.

Although the application is inside the zoning, when Council advertised it there were 108 objections, in the form of a petition signed by 103 persons, plus letters from five others.

The petitioners said they were principally home owners, residents of 76 of the 102 houses in those streets. Only four were in favour of the proposed development.

ered the proposal undesirable because demolition of two houses would alter the architectural identity of the area, which was considered to be one of its principal assets.

The two Victorian semi-detached residences were structurally sound and would no doubt be regarded as highly desirable by the numerous people seeking to buy and restore an old Balmain house.

Effects

They added that construction of a block of eight flats on the site would significantly increase the population of the area without making any contribution to public amenity.

Main objections to the proposed building were as to its design; loss of privacy; loss of sunlight; increase of noise; depreciation of property values; inconvenience during demolition; traffic congestion and possible hazards; and lack of playing area.

The Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna, reported that the objections were not sufficiently substantial to resist an appeal to the Land and Valuation Court if the application were disapproved.

The recommendation for approval was adopted, an amendment by Ald. N. Origlass and I. Wyner seeking deferment being rejected.

Ald. Origlass sought deferment until the next meeting to give an opportunity to examine a project residents had in mind for the establishment of a pre-school play group and a craft and cultural activity centre for the

Column NINE TENANTS' PROBLEM

Major residential development at times produces problems for people who have insufficient resources to swing along with the development.

We refer generally to those without a stake in the real estate they occupy as a home—in other words, tenants.

The current practice of developers purchasing several small adjoining properties in an area like the Balmain peninsula illustrates the problem of tenants whose homes are, so to speak, "sold over their heads".

Unfortunately their problem appears largely unsolvable, at least except by the occupiers themselves on a long range basis.

This article is not an attempt to preach, but a sympathetic effort to point out to such people that in this affluent age they have an opportunity to improve their lot considerably.

We don't wish, for example, to attempt to woo people away from the popular pastimes of smoking and drinking, which are their own affair when they affect only themselves.

However, we would remind young folk who have their life's responsibilities and opportunities at their feet—that the most effective investment of their funds is the purchase of their own real estate.

"Not possible because we are only workers?" some might say.

Well, let's see what the saving of, say, \$8 a week (from tobacco and alcohol especially) could do for a young husband and wife!

After ten years—a short span in your life—this, with other savings possible, would provide a substantial deposit on your own home.

And as a home owner you have some protection (which tenants have not) against both housing problems and inflation.
