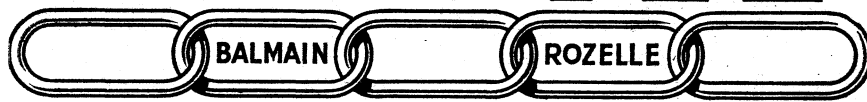

The Choice Was: Independent Thought, Or Party Politics?

IT'S INDEPENDENT THOUGHT: A.L.P. CONTROL ENDED

The people of Leichhardt Municipality in their voting at last Saturday's municipal elections threw off the yoke of A.L.P. party politics, and elected a new Council controlled by independent thought.

Official results of the election were given yesterday morning by the Returning Officer, Mr E. A. Bassett (Town Clerk of Leichhardt). The new aldermen are:

BALMAIN WARD: N. Origlass and I. Wyner (Independents).

ROZELLE WARD: P. O. Bray (Campaign For Better Council), D. P. Casey (A.L.P.).

GLEBE WARD: D. B. Young (C.B.C.), E. L. Sandblom (C.B.C.).

ANNANDALE WARD: P. J. Wilson (A.L.P.), W. S. Hume (A.L.P.).

LILYFIELD WARD: L. J. Rodwell (A.L.P.), E. R. McIlveen (C.B.C.).

LEICHHARDT WARD: W. B. Dougherty (C.B.C.), V. L. Smart (C.B.C.).

Declaration of the poll is being made at noon

today (Wednesday). Date of the first meeting of the new Council will be fixed by the aldermen themselves.

Convenor of the Campaign For Better Council, Mr Philip Bray, told The Link yesterday that he was happy with the overall result, and looked forward to serving the municipality for the next three years.

He added that he was somewhat disappointed with the result in Rozelle Ward, where other independent candidates' preferences had brought re-election of one A.L.P. representative and not the second C.B.C. candidate.

The Link, of course, is pleased that its attitude towards the election was endorsed by a majority of electors and that the rule of party politics will not be felt for the next three years.

Composition of the new Council is: Campaign For Better Council candidates, 8. Independent Balmain team, 2. A.L.P., 4. This compares with 14 A.L.P. and four independents in the last Council.

We find it a comforting thought that the majority of candidates elected are pledged to open discussion in Council on matters of policy and that the man in the street, persons carrying on official business, and the Press are likely to find the new Council not so difficult to get on with!

At this stage it is not clear who is likely to be Mayor, and how independent of one another the C.B.C. candidates are. However, their convenor, Mr Philip Bray, has defined them as "A co-operative group of independents" who are against party politics in Local Government.

The Link considers that for the first time for many years there is an opportunity for public issues to be discussed in open Council and dealt with on their merits.

SCHOOLBOYS COLLECT

Rozelle Boys' Junior High School has formed a committee which has been given the responsibility for collecting donations to the Freedom From Hunger Campaign.

Boys from the school will visit homes in Balmain and Rozelle this Sunday to collect the envelopes which have already been distributed.

The collectors will be wearing identification stickers and will have official receipt books from which they will issue receipts for gift envelopes.

The effort will give residents of the area an opportunity to show their appreciation of the problem of hunger which faces so many people in the world.

The Freedom From Hunger Campaign points out that already two-thirds of the world's population are undernourished, and that the inevitable population explosion will double this figure by the end of the century.

ROTARACT CLUB WINS PRIZE FOR SERVICE

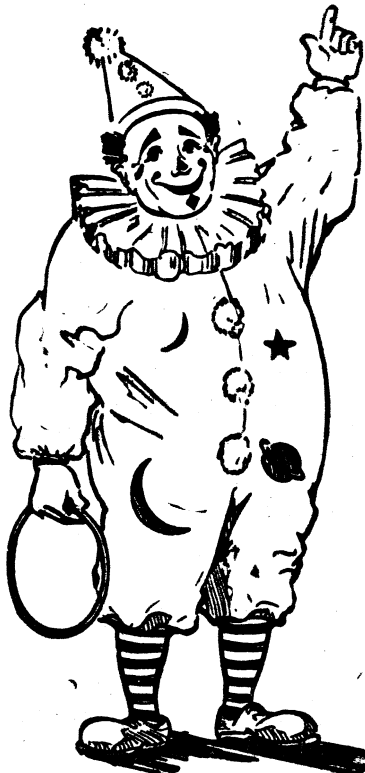

Woolworths Work For Opening Of Supermarket

Woolworths' opening staff have moved into their new Balmain supermarket building at Loyalty Square, Darling Street, to prepare for the store's opening on Thursday, October 7.

As the last of the builders, tradesmen and shopfitters apply their finishing touches, teams of stock assistants are unloading huge deliveries of merchandise.

Others are placing the goods into pre-arranged positions on the long rows of shelving.

The newly appointed manager, Mr Robert Keating, told The Link that at present the impression for the layman was one of great confusion. However, everything was moving into place.

Mr Keating recently completed six years of management at Woolworths' supermarket at Fairy Meadow, on the near South Coast.

He will be taking a special interest in the Balmain store's display of children's wear, as

his wife, Mary, presented him with their first daughter, Jody Maree, just seven weeks ago.

They are living at Carlingford.

"It is going to be touch and go to have everything ship-shape by October 7," Mr Keating

said. "However, I am confident Balmain shoppers will find it the most attractive supermarket they have ever seen".

He added that a Woolworths' supermarket was quite different from all others. It gave the shoppers not only a complete range of food-stuffs under the one roof, but also a wide selection of family clothing, household goods and general merchandise.

The company has its own free car park for customers at the rear of the supermarket. Entrance is from Palmer Street, off Beattie Street.

In the centre of the car park is a shopping cart corral, where customers may leave their shopping trolley after wheeling it from the store directly to their car.

Automatic sliding doorways provide entrance both from Darling Street and the rear of the car park, and these assist the maintenance of ideal air conditioning within the supermarket.

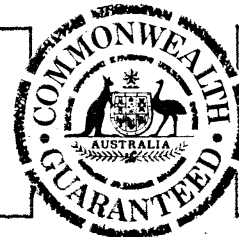
