Adoption Of New Code For Housing Indicated

A housing development code, which would restrict high rise home unit development to specific areas of the municipality, is expected to be adopted in principle at this week's meeting of Leichhardt Council.

The subject was on the agenda for consideration at last night's Council meeting, which commenced after this issue had gone to press.

It is anticipated that Council will adopt proposals for residential planning for the municipality drawn up in the light of the State Planning Authority's studies for Glebe and Balmain. It is also anticipated that the code will be taking consideration of suggestions made by the three district associations—the Balmain Association, Glebe Society, and Anandale Association.

The State Planning Authority, of course, is very much against high rise in certain sections of the municipality, especially on the waterfront.

Home unit development proposed in such areas, although these were zoned for such development, could be res-

tricted to possibly two storeys.

However, in other sections, regarded as suitable for intensive housing development, home unit development could go as high as five or six storeys.

Developers would justifiably say it would not be economic to develop generally on the waterfront to only a couple of storeys in height.

Factors

Nevertheless, the code is likely to keep in mind in those other areas such matters as overshadowing other residences, the blocking of views, and traffic considerations.

It is considered that Council would naturally desire room for manoeuvring in respect of any planning code governing home unit development.

The code would of course include such ques-

tions as siting, setback, design and erection of buildings.

Ald. Origlass said he hoped he would be able to secure authority from the State Planning Authority to release its studies to be examined at the Town Hall by any persons interested.

Police Broke Law With New Office, Council Declares

Establishment of the Balmain Police traffic office in the front part of offices and flats in Darling Street, Balmain, has constituted a breach of the Local Government Act, according to Leichhardt Council.

Council complains that the Police Department did not submit a development application in connection with the establishment, as required by Section X11A of the Local Government Act.

That the occupation, which would have generated additional traffic at the spot, was done without provision of off-street parking facilities, is a point worrying Council.

When this matter was considered at a recent Council meeting, a report was read from Council's solicitor, Mr V. M. Pike, that it was clear that the Crown must be bound by Part X11A of the Act, which requires lodgment of a development application.

Nevertheless it is an ambitious plan in a most important sphere, and deserves success and the co-operation of all concerned.

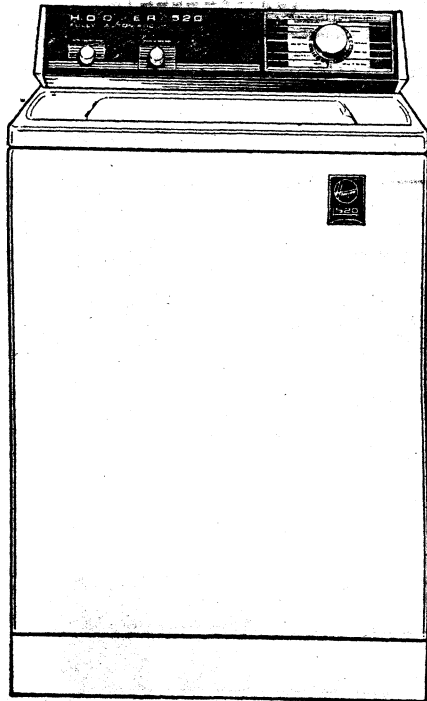

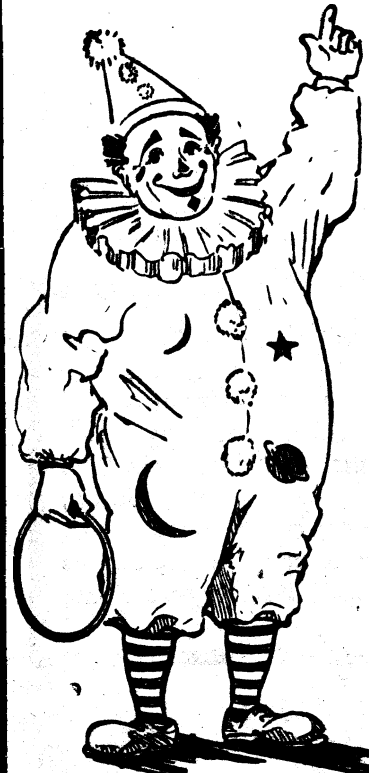

More Plans By Rotaract In Worthy Causes

The bright young men and women of Balmain Rotaract Club are on the march again with two new enterprises to help worthy causes and worthy people solve their problems. The club has \$250 to give away; and it has commenced compilation of a directory of welfare and social institutions and workers.

The first enterprise—a gift of \$250 to a worthy cause—was conceived when the Club was deciding what to do with the prize (consisting of a cheque for that amount) it received in the Sydney Jaycees' Better Community awards.

It was second prize in this competition, in which 36 service organisations (including prominent service bodies) submitted entries outlining their activities on behalf of the community.

The Balmain Rotaract Club described its recent activities in the field of assistance to ex-psychiatric patients.

Most Worthy

Miss Vicki Isberg, President of the Club, said they had decided to give away the \$250 to the winner of a similar scheme which it would conduct itself.

The money would be donated to "The most worthy specific object" involving expenditure of \$250 in and around Leichhardt Municipality.

The successful applicant will have to dem-

onstrate immediate or very early intention to spend the money on a community service object which will be judged according to its fulfilment of a community service need.

In such an area would be causes such as an essential machine for a hospital, P. & C. activities; Boy Scouts' work, etc.

Miss Isberg said that this did not necessarily mean that the object in the mind of the applicant would have to cost only \$250.

It could mean that this amount was required to complete a project for which some finance had already been raised.

Entries endorsed "Community award" should be sent to the Balmain Rotaract Club, P.O. Box 34, Balmain. They should outline details of the purpose the applicant has in mind.

Welfare Directory

The second new Rotaract project—a directory of welfare and social institutions—could be the first of its type to be made available to the public.

Aimed primarily towards helping migrants whose grasp of English is very poor, it is also intended to assist other persons with social problems.

The Club is working in conjunction with Mr. David Maxwell, a social worker at Callan Park Psychiatric Hospital, who has provided a good

deal of information in the required direction.

What is intended is the compilation and publication of a comprehensive list of professional, social and other workers who can be consulted by persons with social problems, with special accent on ability to speak other languages besides English.

In the professional field, it is intended to list medical men and chemists who can speak additional languages.

Problems

Problems specially in mind which the directory might help in tackling are drug addiction, alcoholism, and psychiatric problems.

Other subjects for listing would be international newspapers, religious institutions, and national social clubs.

The Rotaract Club believes that a circulation of about 5,000 of the directory would be needed.

Industrial concerns in the Balmain and Rozelle area are expected to be of help in circulating copies among their staff.

Miss Isberg said the Club would, before including names in the directory, seek permission of the persons concerned to have them published.

A lot of work was involved and a high standard would be aimed at. Hence the directory might not be completed before about next April.

Persons who would like to have their names listed could contact the Club.

NEW MOVE ON TOWN HALL

The moves by the former Leichhardt Council to build a new Town Hall in Leichhardt have been halted by the new Council.

Council decided, on a minute by the Mayor, Ald. N. Origlass, to defer property acquisitions related to a Civic Centre scheme.

Council's senior servants will enlist an experienced adviser on the feasibility and very approximate cost of treatment of the main hall section of the existing Town Hall.

The treatment would cater for the comfortable accommodation of the indoor staff due to its increase since the Glebe Ward was added to the municipality.

Building In Balmain

Mr. Wal Dickson's concern for Balmain, in respect of Leichhardt Council's policy regarding home unit development, is shared by the majority of residents, and in particular The Balmain Association.

I feel, however, that Mr. Dickson had missed the point. In its concern for the municipality, Council has seen fit to halt indiscriminate residential development pending an early inquiry into the needs of the area.

In doing this it has the full support of the State Planning Authority, which has recently produced studies of the Glebe and Balmain areas.

While the results of these studies have not yet been made public, we do know that they recommend ways of increasing population densities in the area, without the necessity of tearing down houses to make way for high rise development.

Too many people think that more flats produce more people.

Yet when people per acre in this type of development are compared with the number of people possible in a rejuvenated Balmain utilising sensibly what is already here, they cannot find that an increase in population can still be achieved that way.

The progress does not involve total rebuilding, and the new Council seems to recognise this.

The shopping centre needs a lift, and Mr. Dickson's plea for parking is one which we also make.

We believe that the provision of parking areas can be achieved without too much tearing down and resumption, and that Mr. Dickson's hope for a revitalised commercial centre can be realised without a continuation of the present type of flat development.

We at least have been given a progressive Council, which we are confident is giving full consideration to the points raised by Mr. Dickson in respect of the area's needs in relation to home development.

documents and maps and pore over learned records, the most exciting and most interesting way of presenting this column is certainly by speaking to some of the many amusing "Balmain characters"?

One such person is Mrs. Callendar, of Birchgrove Road, who has been living in the same house for over 60 years.

Asked had she lived in Balmain for a long time she replied that she was a comparative newcomer, having previously come all the way from Pymont.

She was present at the opening of the new Pymont Bridge in 1901, opened by the then State Governor, Sir Harry Rawson.

After the ceremonial cutting of the ribbon she dashed across the bridge ahead of the official party.

She remembers the 'flu epidemic of 1917, and with others of the kind, spent much time caring for victims of the 'flu era in the old drill hall in Evans Street, which was converted to a temporary hospital for the 'flu victims.

Interested in political affairs she was closely associated with the Labour Party which, incidentally, had its first meeting in New South Wales in 1891 when the Balmain Branch was formed.

She lived very near "Gentleman Jim" Storey, the Premier of

She remembers Billy Hughes, later to become Australia's Prime Minister, tramping the streets of Balmain and Pymont carrying a kerosene tin of hot coals, to be used for his soldering iron, plying his trade as an umbrella mender.

She remembers those employed in the shipyards and in the mine and remembers assisting the victims after the mine explosion in the early 1930's.

She has a high regard for Balmain's tradition of self respect and craftsman's pride.

Mrs. Callendar's family have sold their old home through us, and we are pleased to say the new owner will contribute to the vitality of the area.

A successful playwright and drama teacher, presently on a lecture tour of the United States, he will carry on Mrs. Callendar's traditions.

Chris Nixon, of Balmain, a young spastic, was presented with an Anthology of Contemporary Australian Poetry recently.

The senior lecturer in English Studies at Macquarie University, Mr A. Craig, visited The Spastic Centre at Allambie Heights to make the presentation of his book.

Chris, who is 24, has written over 150 poems in the past five years.

This is a very laborious task, as he cannot write. By means of a pointer attached to his head he can tap out his poems letter by letter on a typewriter.

Mr Craig said he was impressed by Chris's writing ability.

Like most spastics, Chris has great difficulty in mobility, and cannot attend seminars on writing. He, therefore, deeply

appreciated Mr Craig's visit.

While at The Centre, Mr Craig was interested to see the many ways in which spastics are being trained to overcome their disabilities and take a place in industry.

With the great increase in population, the number of spastics requiring treatment has risen proportionately and The Spastic Centre finds it is able to treat only 4 out of every 10 spastics.

The Centre is attempting to overcome this problem by its current "Action Appeal" aimed at raising \$1,000,000 by public subscription.

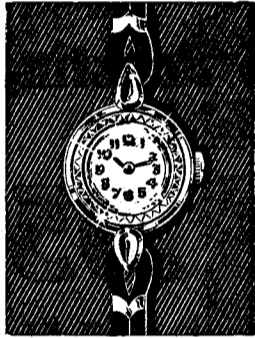

NEW CREATIVE CENTRE PLAN FOR BALMAIN

A group of young people, calling itself the Community Creative Centre, has put up to Leichhardt Council a proposal to turn into a creative centre for public use the area of land formerly used at Long Nose Point by the shipbuilding firm of Morrison & Sinclair Pty. Ltd.

The property has been purchased by the State Planning Authority, which aims at turning

the area into public parkland.

Four representatives of the Community Creative Centre attended the last meeting of Leichhardt Council, which permitted a representative to address the meeting, outlining their idea.

This had been put previously in the form of a letter to the Town Clerk, Mr. E. A. Bassett.

They pointed out that the site had buildings and basic facilities necessary to transform it into an exciting and productive centre.

By using this as a base, activities such as plays, concerts, projects and exhibitions of an experimental nature could be created at the centre.

These and other activities once planned and rehearsed might be taken into the community.

Pre-school activities such as children's theatre, art and music workshops could be provided, as well as other facilities to benefit people of all ages.

The group said that finance could be raised by the organisers within the Municipality.

Council decided to seek information from the State Planning Authority about its plans for the area.

The proposal was mentioned last week by Council representatives to the Chairman of the State Planning Authority, Mr Nigel Ashton.

They asked that demolition of all buildings on the site by the S.P.A. be halted until a decision was made on the group's proposal.

Other Plan

Meanwhile the Birchgrove Creative Leisure Centre—which is not connected with the group which approached Council—has sought permission from the S.P.A. to use the Longnose Point area as an adventure playground during the Xmas school holidays.

This would give children a much larger area than that at Ballast Point Road to express themselves.

Supplies of timber, hammers and nails could be made available for them to enable them to build their own structures.

The site also could possibly be used for boating activity of some type—perhaps building their own boats.

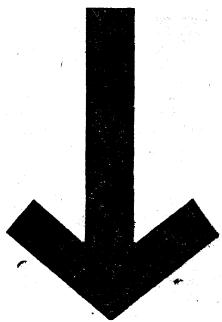
