

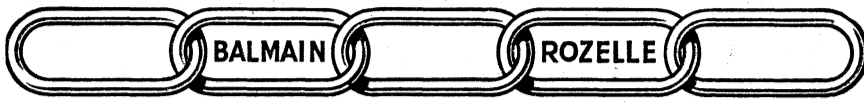

Detailed Study Of Living Areas Planned

Adoption by Leichhardt Council of an interim code for home unit construction — expected to have been effected at last night's special Council meeting — will restrict high-rise building until a permanent code has been worked out, possibly in three or four months, after a detailed study of environmental areas.

The interim code will "hold the fort" while environmental studies are being made for the purpose of evolving a permanent code.

Its intention is to prevent types of development in the intervening period which might clash with the perspectives held by Council.

The plan before last night's meeting was to adopt the interim code, and to work out the methods of making studies of the numerous different environmental areas in the municipality.

The detailed studies of each area now to be made by the Council are aimed at finding out precisely the residential conditions now existing in each, and how they would be affected by various types of building.

Other Councils, such as North Sydney, which have made such studies, have employed consultants to do the work.

Leichhardt Council will use its own salaried officers, but is expected to take advantage of the offers of assistance by the civic groups.

These are The Balmain Association, Glebe Society, Annandale Association, and the new

group being formed, the Lilyfield-Leichhardt Association.

This assistance would be voluntary.

It would be given by professional people associated with the civic groups. And it has been suggested that additional help would be forthcoming from University students who would include the work in their University projects.

Details

Mr W. Haesler, President of The Balmain Association, said the Association had undertaken to assist the Council with its study.

He thought it would take several months, and involve a complete survey of all the environmental areas.

Such a survey could embrace the condition of buildings now existing, topography, and the views available — especially those of the harbour from the land, and of the land from the harbour.

The survey would keep in mind, for instance, just how a building of a certain height and bulk would affect other buildings nearby in respect of shade and the view.

The Link asked Mr Haesler what The Bal-

main Association was seeking in respect of control of home units. What sort of suburb did the Association want Balmain to be?

"What we are trying to do", Mr Haesler replied, "is to have a pleasant, clean inner city residential area which retains the historic and friendly character that Balmain already has."

"We feel that both the new and the old can integrate here."

"Some people think we want to retain everything as it was. This is not true."

"We feel that both the new and the old can integrate here. However, 'All new' would simply destroy much of value."

"This would be wrong."

"Obviously social change must take place. The old Balmain was a village with a lot of interest in itself. That has dwindled over the years as industry moved in and people moved out."

"People are now moving back in."

"We want to revive the old spirit of Balmain, but this could not be effected if home units of the quantity and poor quality seen in some other Sydney suburbs are allowed to mushroom here".

LOCAL GIRL IN STUDY PROJECT IN INDONESIA

Miss Kim Loughlin, of Denison Street, Rozelle, is one of five young Australians selected to participate in a study project in Indonesia this year.

The project — "Development Research Project—Indonesia" — is being organised by an Australian group called International Development Action and the United Nations' Centre for Economic and Social Information.

Miss Loughlin is a 16-year-old fifth form student at the Australian International Independent School, North Ryde.

She speaks Indonesian, and has been involved in campaigns against racism, working with aboriginal secondary students in Redfern.

Kim also is a secondary student representative on the Sydney Campaign Against Inequalities in Education, convened by the Students' Representative Council at Sydney University.

The project will extend over 11 months.

In February and March members will undertake an orientation course in Australia, during which they will meet academics, businessmen and Government officials concerned with Indonesia.

During April, May and June the team will be in Indonesia investigating Indonesian Government development plans and the role of Australian aid, investment, trade, etc., in achieving the Government's objectives.

On their return they will participate in a 6-month educational campaign designed to let secondary and tertiary students, members of community groups and the churches hear about their findings in Indonesia.

Home Unit Code Study

The detailed study of living conditions by Leichhardt Council prior to adoption of a permanent code for home unit construction is a wise step.

The former Council's attitude was like that of so many other Councils in the Sydney area — piecemeal thinking and haphazard action without thought of an overall picture.

This produced a mixed policy, uncertainty among developers and the public, and occasional quarrels with the central planning authorities.

The study will at least put before Council a complete picture of existing conditions, without having to await detailed reports when development applications are being considered.

And it will enable full consideration of the facts to be given right away so that Council can lay down a co-ordinated policy in particular areas.

While the ultimate permanent code could possibly produce heart-burning among property owners and developers, if regarded as too restrictive, at least the public and developers should know where they stood.

Nothing so far has been said about residents' participation in the study.

A simple survey form dropped in residents' letter boxes would enable them to express their views now, without waiting until a development application offensive to them for a particular reason was being considered.

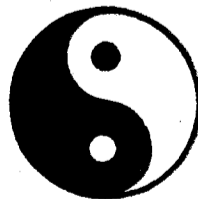

**Fear For Council's
 Future**

The Mayor, Ald. N. Origlass, hopes that Leichhardt Council will soon call a public meeting on the subject of the role of Local Government

This follows the State Government's formation of a special expert committee to conduct a full-scale review of the Local Government system.

Ald. Origlass forecasts that the committee will recommend amalgamation of existing municipalities with scant regard for community of interest or viability as new municipalities; and introduction of a Council-manager system.

In regard to municipality amalgamation, Ald. Origlass told The Link that he anticipated the committee would recommend that Leichhardt Municipality be amalgamated with other municipalities further west, ignoring the natural affinity of this area to the city.

"I feel it will want Leichhardt to expand outwards rather than to the city", he said. "But our natural affinity is with the city."

"However, the kind of development going on in the city from a residential point of view is to accommodate wealthy people and tourists, and to denude the city of service workers.

"The city requires an army of service workers who inhabit the inner suburbs, but the type of development going on tends to push these people 20 or 30 miles out."

"You must have an army of service workers attached to the city to make it function. However, with the way land values are going in the city proper I can't see much hope for them living there on their low wage rates".

Ald. Origlass felt it was the Government's intention to amalgamate municipalities on the score of economy.

"The main argument about economy", he said, "is that you are able with larger municipalities to employ much bigger and more modern plant."

"This question will have to be considered carefully in this area, because big plant may not be suitable for small streets".

Police Reject Safety Request

The Police Traffic Branch has rejected a request by a Balmain resident to improve pedestrians' safety at the Curtis Road - Rowntree Street and the Darling-Phillip Streets intersections, considering suggested measures to be unnecessary.

Leichhardt Council had forwarded to the Traffic Branch a letter from Mrs S. Roukema, of Phillip Street, suggesting installation of traffic lights or zebra crossings at the two intersections.

She reported that once she had seen a little girl nearly run over by a car going at full speed from the bottom of Rowntree Street towards the Town Hall.

The girl was coming from Birchgrove School and was crossing the road at Curtis Road.

The writer also reported that it was difficult to cross to the bus stop at Darling Street coming from Phillip Street because of the traffic and the presence of parked cars making it difficult to see what was on the road.

She suggested a ban on car parking at the corners of Curtis Road and Rowntree Street. At one corner, near the bus stop, a van was almost always parked, blocking visibility.

The Traffic Branch replied that stop signs in Curtis Road and unbroken separation lines in Rowntree Street suitably controlled traffic,

which was only light. Pedestrians were able to cross safely with the exercise of normal care, and parked vehicles did not unduly obstruct visibility.

At the Darling-Phillip Streets intersection traffic counts disclosed comparatively light pedestrian and vehicular movement, said the Branch.

Parking there presented no unusual problems and conditions were generally satisfactory.

COUNCILS CRITICISED ON LITTER

Local Government Councils who are not yet vigorously policing anti-litter laws will be directed to do so, the Minister for Environment Control, Mr J. G. Beale, said the other day.

Mr Beale said Councils were provided with strengthened anti-litter legislation in 1970. They were given power to impose on-the-spot fines on litterers.

The people of N.S.W. were given a period of grace before the laws were strongly enforced, but this period was now over.

Mr Beale said the Government was deter-

mined to see the State was cleaned up.

"We have a twopronged policy", he said.

"Firstly, the Government seeks the co-operation of all to get rid of unsightly litter. If co-operation fails, we will have to implement the second part—coercion".

Mr Beale said a number of Councils were doing very little about litter.

Councils who did not co-operate, he said, would be directed by the State Pollution Control Commission to appoint inspectors and to impose fines.

In Leichhardt

The Town Clerk of Leichhardt, Mr E. A. Bassett, said Leichhardt Council now employed three inspectors to police the anti-litter laws.

Prosecutions were being made regularly, especially for permitting the dropping of matter from overloaded lorries.

No on-the-spot fines, however, had been imposed yet.
