

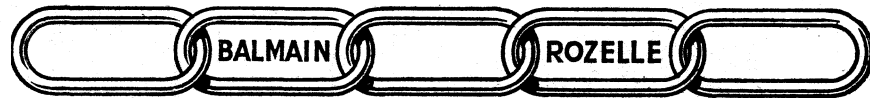

# Council's Plans Lower Values Of Land: New Valuation Urged

**Leichhardt Council is expected to approach the Valuer-General immediately, requesting urgent revaluation of properties zoned for home units in view of the substantial reduction of the value of such land caused by Council's home unit code proposals.**

A motion to that effect by the Deputy Mayor, Ald. P. O. Bray, was on the business paper for last night's regular meeting of Council.

The move arose from Ald. Bray's comment at last week's special meeting, when Council struck the foreshadowed rate of 1.5 cents in the dollar U.C.V.

Council also adopted the interim code for Residential 2 (b) building construction which, pending detailed surveys of environmental areas in the municipality, will restrict building to a .8 floor space ratio.

## Motion

Ald. Bray's notice of motion was:

• That Council advise the Valuer General of Council's moves regarding town planning and adoption of interim codes for erection of buildings in Residential 2 (b) areas.

• That he be advised that the immediate effect of these moves was to substantially reduce the value of land zoned as Residential 2 (b) under the Leichhardt Planning Scheme.

• So as to prevent unfair municipal rate and water rate burdens being placed on the owners of such properties, Council requests the Valuer General to urgently revalue for the year 1972 properties zoned residential 2 (b) in the Leichhardt Planning Scheme.

The varying effect of revaluation of properties upon the amounts of rates to be paid to both

the Council and the Water Board was stressed by several speakers at last Tuesday's Council meeting.

Some of these speakers were in the gallery, and spoke after a general invitation to do so was given by the Mayor, Ald. N. Origlass.

The Mayor said it would be impossible to strike a differential rate to cater for the differences in valuation increases.

## Amendment

An amendment calling for a rate of 1.3 cents was moved by Ald. L. Rodwell.

Ald. Rodwell said that with the recent revaluation of properties in the municipality the proposed rate of 1.5 cents would mean that all property owners would pay more this year than when Labor was in control of Council.

The lifting of the Main Roads levy and payroll tax would save this Council approximately \$250,000, yet Council was not passing these savings on to the ratepayer.

Thus Council was acting against the election promises and were contributing to the higher cost of living.

Ald. Rodwell said that property owners would not be happy with the increases and tenants would be faced with higher rents to offset the increase in rates paid to Council.

Ald. Casey seconded the amendment, which was defeated by eight

votes to three.

Discussing the amendment, the Mayor said that the estimates of expenditure on which the 1.5 cent rate had been based had already been passed.

To allow of a 1.3 cent rate it would be necessary to prune expenditure by about \$408,000.

The only way that could be done would be to eliminate bitumen surfacing of roads (\$105,000), save \$120,000 on road and footpath construction and reconstruction, \$85,000 on plant, and \$100,000 on the town planning reserve.

Ald. Origlass added that if Council did not face up to its responsibilities in such essential matters the Government would simply appoint an administrator, who would strike an appropriate rate without more ado.

## Estimates

Expenditure detailed in the estimates previously adopted totalled \$3,647,086.

This was made up of: General purposes \$243,760; public works \$1,320,800; health administration \$810,000; public services \$521,684; municipal property \$81,000; miscellaneous \$121,000; loan repayments \$197,000; capital \$351,842.

Interesting items in the expenditure estimates are:

Footpath grass maintenance—\$33,000.

Maintenance, replanting, etc., of street trees and grass plots—\$15,000.

## INTERIM CODE FOR FLATS IMPOSES TWO-STOREY LIMIT

*Interim codes were adopted at last week's special meeting of Leichhardt Council for residential flat buildings, boarding houses or hostels, and group dwellings, pending the prescription of the Leichhardt Planning Scheme and adoption of development control plans.*

In all cases the codes limit the floor space ratio to 0.8, and allotment coverage to 40 per cent.

They also limit the height of the building to two residential floors, with parking under, above ground level at any point before excavation. Alternatively, basement parking may be required by Council.

The code for residential flats includes the following provisions:

Minimum areas of flats shall be: Bachelor or bed-sitting room, 300 sq. ft. One b.r., 500; 2 b.r., 750; 3 b.r., 900 sq. ft.

walls (foreshores protection)—\$1,200.

Maintenance and repair of parks, recreation reserves, sporting ovals and playgrounds—\$205,000.

Clean-up campaign — \$24,000.

Welfare Centre—\$27,000.

Kindergarten — \$30,000.

Library—\$80,000.

Book purchase — \$42,000.

Baby Health Centre—\$5,000.

Reserve for reconstruction of Dawn Fraser swimming pool—\$10,000.

## Receipts

Among estimates of receipts are:

Welfare Centre meals —\$3,700. Meals on Wheels — \$1,800. Dept. of Social Services subsidy re Meals on Wheels —\$2,600.

Hilda Booter Kindergarten fees—\$5,400. Kindergarten subsidy — \$1,200.

Library subsidy—\$37,500.

Trade refuse removal charges—\$74,000.

Park rents and charges (playing rights, catering rights, hire charges, etc.) —\$10,000.

One off-street parking and/or garaging space not less than 18' x 8' in area shall be provided for each bachelor, one b.r. or 2 b.r. flat, and two such spaces for each 3 b.r. or larger flat for the exclusive use of residents of the building.

In addition, one off-street parking space shall be provided for every four flats in the building for the exclusive use of visitors.

An overall landscaping plan by a qualified landscape architect will have to be approved by Council, and landscaping shall be completed before the building is occupied.

The preamble says it is Council's intention that the existing scale and character of the Municipality be maintained until such time as comprehensive development control policies have been adopted which will encourage a wide range of building types and intensities of development in appropriate areas within the Municipality by means of population density control, which are compatible with land

form with existing buildings.

Council reserves the right by resolution at any time to vary the provisions of any code.

The interim code prepared by Council's Town Planner, Mr A. Kenna — which was not accepted by Council — provided for varying floor space ratios, allotment coverage and building heights, according to various environmental areas.

There were ten such areas in the Balmain and Rozelle wards, in which f.s.r. was 0.7 in six areas, 0.9 in three, and 1.5 in one.

Allotment coverage varied from 25 to 35 per cent; and heights of building from two floors in six areas, three floors in three areas; and no height limit in one (Darling Street).

## Column NINE

### Research On Environment

We sincerely hope there will be worthwhile results from the initial research programme into environmental matters to be carried out by tertiary institutions with State Government grants.

Two of the projects cover matters of special interest to Balmain residents.

These are environmental noise problems, and degree of noxious emissions and pollution of industrial and other human activities.

The announcement of the programme by the Minister for Environmental Control, Mr J. G. Beale, should arouse considerable interest among people working to solve the noise and smoke emission problems associated with the Balmain container terminals.

Leichhardt Council's Noise and Air Pollution Committees have voluminous information of value in both spheres, and this should certainly be made available to the persons in charge of the relevant projects.

Council's help could be offered in these projects immediately, to prevent its activities—and information—being overlooked.

The most important aspect of such a research programme, of course, is that it is on Government level, calling for co-operation without strings from other State Government sectors as well as Federal instrumentalities.

In the past, those working for a cleaner and quieter Balmain district have now and then stepped smartly into brick walls of Government indifference.

It is to be hoped that the reported lack of power to demand co-operation suffered by the new Minister has now been remedied, and that he will be able to demand action from both Government and private sectors when research indicates its necessity.

# LEISURE CENTRE AND ROTARACT TELL OF SERVICE PROJECTS

A busy year of community service lies ahead for two of Balmain's service organisations — the Creative Leisure Centre and the Rotaract Club. Programmes were outlined the other day by their spokesmen.

Mrs Robin Jones, organiser of the Birchgrove Creative Leisure Centre, advises that the Centre, at 29A Ballast Point Road, will re-open on Wednesday, February 2.

Hours will be as previously — Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons, from 3.30 p.m. to 6 p.m.

The ballet and folk dancing classes formerly conducted by Mrs M. Rebel will be relocated at the Centre, and a meeting will be held on Thursday, February 3, at 4.30 p.m. to make arrangements.

Two new activities are to commence.

It is planned to run a playgroup for children aged 3 to 5 from 10 a.m. to noon Mondays to Fridays.

The playgroup will be staffed by a supervisor and an assistant.

It is intended to allot responsibility for groups of five children to mothers on a roster basis, calling for attendance by each mother one morning a week.

Playgroup funds will be raised by a donation of \$1 a week for each child. Size of the group will be restricted to 30.

Interested mothers should meet at the Centre with their children at 10 a.m. next Wednesday, Feb. 2, or contact Mrs Jones (82-2727) after Jan. 29.

Mothers with children under three years of age will, as previously, be welcome at the Centre on Wednesday mornings.

Teenage and adult classes in painting and sketching and pottery will be planned at a meeting at the Centre on Thursday, Feb. 3, at 8 p.m.

It is anticipated that these classes will be held on Thursdays at 8 p.m.

Depending on the needs of students and the availability of teachers, additional groups may be arranged at convenient times.

The fee for these groups will be \$1 adults, 60 c. students.

## Rotaract Activities

Balmain Rotaract Club is at work on one of its latest community service activities — compilation of a directory of welfare and social institutions.

This is aimed primarily towards helping migrants whose grasp of English is very poor, but is intended also to assist other persons with social problems.

Balmain Rotaract President, Miss Vicki Isberg, hopes the directory will be completed by March.

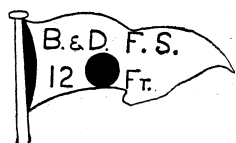
Meanwhile funds are being sought by the club to defray expenses in compilation. A fund-raising party was held last week, and a guessing competition is under way.

Miss Isberg said local schools had responded very well to the club's work in compiling a directory of employment in the Balmain district, and had secured copies of this to hand to their leaving pupils.

It will be assisted by other Rotaract Clubs, to provide a staff of 200 to answer telephone calls from the public for three hours on that day.

Other plans this year include outings for orphans, and redecoration of the Old Folks' room at Balmain Town Hall.

## CHEST X-RAY COMPULSORY

More than 30,000 residents of the State electoral district of Balmain who are over the age of 21 years are obliged by law to attend for a chest X-ray during the next few weeks.

Five mobile units from the Anti-Tuberculosis Association will be located throughout the district until February 29.

A list of locations, with dates and operating hours, is published in an advertisement in this issue.

In past years the incidence of T.B. has been consistently high in this area, and the Director of Tuberculosis, Dr K. W. H. Harris, is particularly anxious for a maximum response to the 1972 survey.

For this reason he proposes to enforce the Act in its entirety, and those who fail to attend could find themselves faced with a fine of up to \$200.

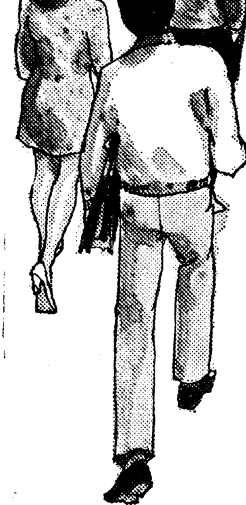
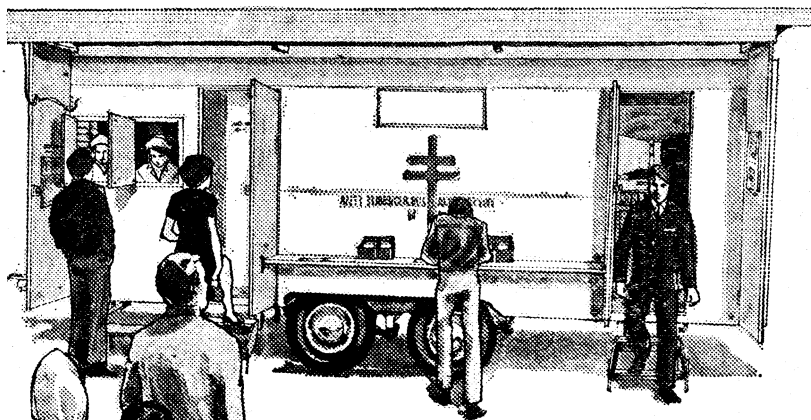

## Plans For Graving Dock In Balmain

Sydney Harbour Ferries Pty. Ltd. has submitted to Leichhardt Council plans for a \$320,000 graving dock for servicing floating craft on property at the extreme eastern end of Waterview Street, Balmain.

On behalf of the company, Parkhill & Freeman Pty. Ltd. submitted an interim development application for permission to construct the dock.

Council last week decided to seek a conference with the company to discuss the possible effects on the neighbourhood amenity before determining the application.

There are nine buildings now on the site—general office, amenities building, stores building, and joiners and shipwrights', blacksmiths', plumbers', boilermakers', machine and paint shops.

The company says that the premises have been used as a ship repair yard since about 1917.

Some modification to the existing machine, fitters' and boilermakers' workshops will be required to accommodate the proposed dock by reducing them in width by approximately 15 ft.

Working hours proposed are 7.30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays (overtime weekdays and week-ends only as required).

At present 64 people

are employed at the property. Ten additional ones will be required.

There may be some reduction of machinery now in the workshops. Two 8" centrifugal pumps will be installed in the pump house, which will be below ground.

There is provision for 34 spaces for off-street parking.

No residents will be displaced by the proposed development.

Council will seek a conference with the company in view of the possible injury to the neighbourhood amenity from the emission of noise and nuisance from rivetting steel, flashes from welding equipment, etc., and from movement of sheet metal and goods by road transport.

The Adventure Playground at Longnose Point, organised by the Creative Leisure Movement, has been quite successful, according to Mr Nick Masterman, committeeman, who has supervised the activities. The playground will operate until February 1.

Mr Masterman said the area had been used by a continuing stream of children from six years of age upwards, some with their parents, the daily average being about 20. He said the playground allowed the youngsters to let off steam in surroundings which were quite adventurous and challenging. They were able to play their own way without worrying about breaking things. No accidents had been reported.

Some parents had come with little boys and girls. Miss Vera Epstein, a qualified infants' teacher, had assisted with their supervision. Mr Masterman said the children had been very busy making things, and using them in their play. Little ones had built things out of cardboard boxes supplied by Balmain businessmen.

However, older children—aged 10 to 12—rejected the suggestion of the organisers that they build a miniature city inside the main building on the site. One group of 15 proceeded to indulge in a "war game" — making "weapons" out of the junk available, constructing fortresses, and then proceeding to the climax—releasing prisoners taken in the war.

The weapons included mock machine guns made out of wood, with handles added, and the sophistication of the finished products was described by Mr Masterman as "incredible". "I am not a lover of war games", he said. "But what could you do if you were to allow them to express themselves? It is not exactly what we wanted—but it was what they wanted".

Another group, of quiet children, brought hammers and occupied their energies in building other items.

Leichhardt Council will seek a conference with the Cockatoo Dockyard management in an effort to overcome residents' complaints about dock workers' parking in streets near Elliott Street wharf.

A resident had written to the Council complaining that dock workers were using an off-street parking area recently provided for residents.
