

You Shop?

While offering parking-starved Balmain shoppers a tiny grain of comfort — in the long term only — the Deputy Mayor, Ald. Bray, appears to be anticipating later condemnation of possible inaction by Council in this vital matter.

This is in his declaration that there is less need for shopper parking in this municipality than in many others because many more people would be within walking distance of the shops.

What does Ald. Bray mean by "walking distance"?

If we know anything of housewives, they certainly will not walk more than a few minutes to shops and then back again with laden arms if the family car lies idle in the home garage. Why should they?

The Link concedes that home deliveries from some local stores would be greater than in quite a few other areas, but contests the accuracy of his inference that cars are not used---or not needed - by a considerable percentage of local shoppers.
