

There would be a significant worsening of traffic congestion in Glebe if only one bridge crossing existed over Johnston's Creek between Booth Street and Rozelle Bay.

At its meeting last week Council decided to notify the D.M.R. that it did not wish to proceed with the bridge as the cost, to be borne entirely by Council, was not commensurate with any likely benefit to Leichhardt Municipality.

Competing **Businesses**

Councils' normal sphere of activity embraces questions of residential amenity, zoning, traffic effects, and orthodox Local Government services.

But never should they seek to try to run our business world.

This would be adopting the role of "Big Brother" — and they just wouldn't last 24 hours afterwards.

We understand from the mover of the motion-which incidentally was carried unanimously - that it was simply a move to improve Council's knowledge of its own legal powers, and that it involved no ulterior motive.


