Town Planning Objectives Are Adopted

First major step in its new town planning policy was taken at last week's meeting of Leichhardt Council with adoption of draft objectives for the preparation of an outline plan for the municipality.

The objectives are for guiding development. They are designed to ensure that the expanding and blossoming aims, aspirations and needs of the people of the municipality are fostered and safeguarded.

It is intended that all objectives, policies and subsequent actions are governed by this purpose and will at all times be consistent with it.

Also they will be consistent with each other to the extent that existing laws and property rights are adequately reevaluated to permit the optimum objectives.

Five Aims

Five objectives are named:

1. Improve residential amenity, by conserving the natural and man-made assets of the municipality (i.e., buildings, views, waterfront) by encouraging suitable redevelopment in sympathy with existing land form and/or surrounding development, and by curbing industrial and other environmental nuisances.

2. Retain and encourage the diversity of peoples and activity characteristic to the mu-

nicipality which offer opportunities for employment, shopping and leisure.

3. Develop and co-ordinate the community facilities required to meet social needs effectively.

4. Improve the movement of traffic and transport within and serving the municipality consistent with environmental aims and present needs.

5. Translate possible courses of action into a definite programme of action planning, specifying what will be done first, the cost of such action, who will do it and over what period of time, and proposing revisions to the Leichhardt Planning Scheme where necessary, to conform with the foregoing proposed objectives, policies and actions.

Residential

Under each objective, policies for achieving it are given, together with possible courses of action.

Under the objective of improving residential amenity there are three policies:

• **Control of environmental nuisances.**—Encourage action to reduce noise and air and water pollution.

• **Conservation**—Seek to preserve buildings, structures and areas of social, scientific or historical interest, and to conserve and extend public access to and use of the waterfront.

• **Development**—Select suitable areas for redevelopment and encourage preservation and rehabilitation of suitable existing areas.

Diversity

Policies under the second objective, of retaining and encouraging the diversity of peoples and activity characteristic to the municipality are:

People.—Examine ways of ensuring a di-

versity of housing to cater for all age groups, ethnic groups and socio-economic groups.

Industry.—Encourage industry to be established and/or remain in the municipality where its presence does not conflict with environmental and traffic criteria.

Shopping—Adopt measures to encourage shopping facilities to serve the local population fully in terms of accessibility and in terms of the availability of choice of goods and services.

Leisure.—Encourage diverse social and service activities in residential and other areas which serve the local population and which are consistent with local amenity.

Policies under the third objective—development and co-ordination of community facilities—are:

Facilities

Health and Welfare.—Seek to develop co-ordinated health and welfare services by encouraging co-operation between all bodies concerned with health and welfare to avoid uneconomic duplication and to produce an integrated system designed to meet the needs of the community.

Child Welfare.—Seek to establish child welfare facilities within the overall community health and welfare services close to public transport, shops, schools, and other community facilities.

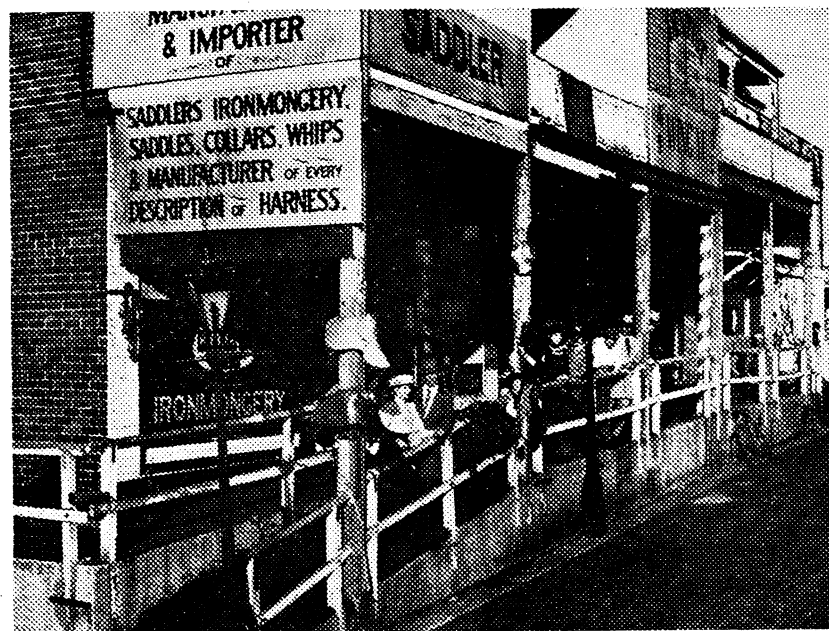
Libraries—Continue to work for the extension of library facilities in the municipality.

Parks, Playgrounds and open space.—Increase the provision of and access to and facilities in Parks, playgrounds and open space in the municipality.

Balmain Puts on New Face Greet Cousin From Fiji

Old Balmainians who can remember the "good old days" before World War One will find a few memories in these pictures, stills from the ABC's Norman Lindsay Festival presentation of *The Cousin From Fiji*, one of the early books written by the author-artist bohemian of the Australian literary world.

The Cousin From Fiji has been on view at 8 pm from Friday, September 8. Other works by Norman Lindsay to be shown during the festival include *A Curate in Bohemia*, *Redheap*, *Dust or Polish* and *Halfway to Anywhere*.

Norman Lindsay died in 1969 at the age of 90, a legend known around his Blue Mountains home as "The Sage of Springwood". Several of his early books are now available in paperback.

Under the fourth objective—improvement of traffic and transport—are the following policies:

Traffic.—Work for the segregation of conflicting types of traffic and for the segregation of through traffic from residential and shopping

areas.

Pedestrians—Seek to improve pedestrian movement in residential and shopping areas.

Public Transport.—Work for the extension and co-ordination of public transport facilities within and serving the municipality.

Expressways.—Work to discourage the construction of the presently designed system of radial expressways for metropolitan Sydney, particularly where it disrupts residential amenity and community cohesion within the municipality.

Free Swims For Children: Protest Rejected

Is it wise for the community to provide free swimming in a local pool for children?

Leichhardt Council says "Yes", but Mr A. S. Roberts, Vice-president of the Balmain Amateur Swimming Club, says "No" very firmly.

Council, however, has 8 years of age accompanied by either parent. Council decided to advise Mr Roberts as follows:

At its last meeting Council dealt with a letter from Mr Roberts protesting strongly against any decision to permit juvenile swimmers free entry into the Dawn Fraser Swimming Pool.

He said that if such a step were taken it would be made in the face of steeply rising supervision and maintenance costs.

It was psychologically wrong, he said, as young people failed to appreciate anything they got for nothing.

Also adventurous bands from adjoining suburbs could crowd ratepayers out of the pool while cashing in on a "free swimming bonanza".

The admission charge should be 5 cents, or at least the present 3 cents, and the only free concession might be granted to those children under

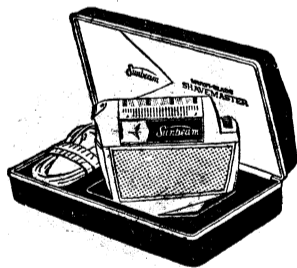

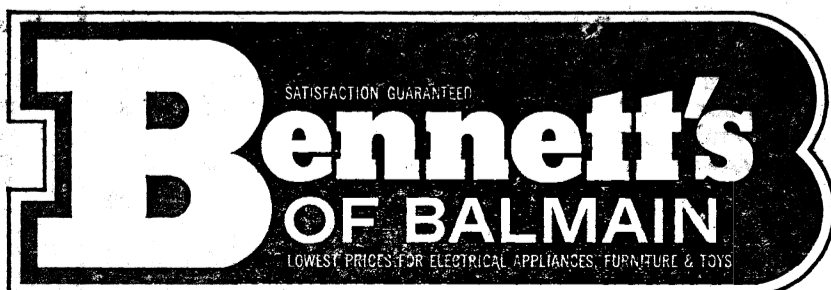

DISAGREEMENT ON DISTRICT TRAFFIC PROBLEMS

Three items affecting traffic in the Balmain-Rozelle area were before Leichhardt Council at its last meeting. In two of them Council disagreed with the views of the Police Traffic Branch.

The Police Traffic Branch told Council by letter that it did not consider practicable a Council suggestion that angle parking be established in National Street, Rozelle.

The suggestion was made in order to make more parking spaces available to shoppers.

The Branch said that the width of the carriage-way was 42 feet so that it was not practicable to introduce angle parking restrictions.

Long-term parked vehicles, it said, were depriving shoppers of an equitable share of kerbspace.

Consideration was being given to the introduction of one-hour waiting restrictions during business hours on both sides of National Street between Darling Street and National Lane.

A small section on the eastern side between points 20 ft and 35 ft

south of Darling Street could be left to accommodate the licensed fruit barrow.

The Branch also said that congestion was being experienced in Prosper and National Lanes because of their narrowness, and suggested additional parking restrictions in both streets.

Council has replied to the Branch urging reconsideration of its angle parking proposal, which it considered to be suitable for the street.

R.S.L. Club

Council's Engineer is investigating a report from the Police Traffic Branch of traffic problems in Darling Street, Balmain, outside the Balmain-Rozelle R.S.L. Club.

The police said that vehicles parked on the southern side of Darling Street, between Elliott and Little Arthur Streets, obstructed the visibility of pedestrians crossing the roadway in the vicinity.

They also obstructed the visibility of drivers of vehicles entering and leaving the parking areas of the club.

To improve conditions, the police proposed to introduce a standing restriction along the entire frontage of the club, and they sought Council's views on the proposal.

Park Signs

Leichhardt Council has decided to erect warning signs in Glassop Street approaching Elkington Park, following refusal of the Police Traffic Branch to erect them.

Council asked the Branch if signs could be placed warning drivers "Watch Out For Children" or "Slow Down At The Park".

Suitable sites were on the south side facing traffic travelling west-east of Hampton Street, and north side facing traffic travelling east-west of White Street.

The Police Traffic Branch replied that traffic conditions did not warrant the signs. Pedestrian signs in Glassop Street west of Punch Street and east of Young Street were adequate for present needs.

The Branch said, however, that no objection was raised to Council displaying warning signs similar to those displayed by other Councils at locations other than schools where children might be encountered.

CELEBRATIONS FOR CENTENARY WELL UNDER WAY

The special parade beginning three days of celebration of the Leichhardt Centenary Celebrations will be of great interest to all Leichhardt residents, Alderman E. McIlveen told *The Link* this week.

Celebrations will range over the weekend on September 30 to October 2.

"Highlights of the parade will be Cobb and Co., a Greek and an Italian cart", he said.

Ald. McIlveen said the Italian cart was called "Carretto Siciliano", which was a specialised decorated vehicle, especially imported from Italy and engaged by large firms for demonstration purposes.

"I believe one of the largest shopping centres in the Western Suburbs engaged this Italian vehicle for their gala opening", he said.

Also in the parade would be a hay car and floats from the Balmain and Leichhardt Swimming Clubs, the Leichhardt Rowing Club and P.G.H. Furniture and

Scotts Provisions, he said.

There would be marching girls, national groups (Italian and Greek), scouts, guides, cubs and brownies, soccer groups, Rugby League groups, rowing clubs and St. John's Ambulance, with the Police Boys' Club Band providing the music.

INTEREST

Ald. McIlveen said the procession would be of interest to all, and it was but the start of an exciting weekend.

The march begins from the Leichhardt Town Hall on Saturday, September 30, at 9 am, going on to the Leichhardt Oval, where a

day of games, demonstrations and displays has been arranged.

In the evening will be the pop concert featuring "Wendy Saddington and Copper Wine" and "Hot Rocket", a concert creating enormous interest among the younger people in Leichhardt, Ald. McIlveen said.

These groups were engaged to replace the earlier advertised groups, "Bakery" and "Stafford Bridge", as these had to break engagements due to unforeseen circumstances.

On Sunday, October 1, there would be church services commemorating the centenary, and a "special football match" on Leichhardt Oval in the afternoon.

Ald. McIlveen said

the activities for Monday, October 2, were water sports of all kinds, and these were "well in hand".

He said an art competition and a ball were also being arranged for later this year.

"All inquiries about the celebrations can be directed during business hours to Mr. K. Hardie at the Leichhardt Town Hall", he added. "All entry forms can be sent to him.

"And if you have not got your entry form yet, there are still some forms available at Leichhardt, Balmain, Annandale and Glebe Town Hall".

Added Ald. McIlveen: "Be sure and be there, and join in the fun".

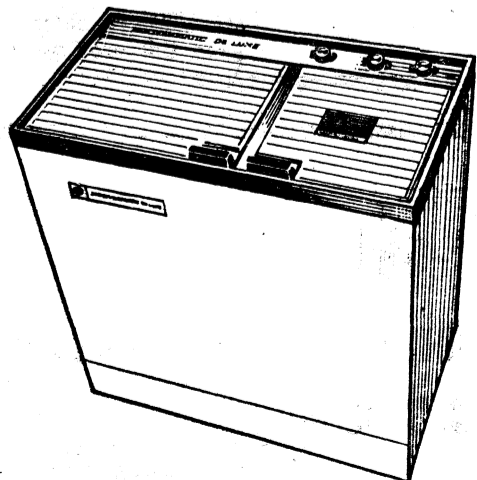

PENSIONERS SEEK OWN LOCAL CITIZEN-CENTRE

Balmain and Rozelle aged and invalid pensioners have begun a campaign to obtain a senior citizens' centre for the district.

Led by the Chairman, Mr. R. Snell, and the Secretary, Mr. J. Flood, of the newly formed Balmain-Rozelle Pensioners Centre Committee, the group is seeking a common centre for local pensioners.

They desire the centre to be "complete with the amenities necessary for relaxation and enjoyment in their declining years", as they state in a circulated letter seeking assistance from local organisations.

The committee has been formed from delegates of the Balmain and the Rozelle Branch of the Original Old Age and Invalid Pensioners' Association at branch meetings recently.

Talks shortly with the Balmain-Rozelle R.S.L. will decide if it is possible for the R.S.L. to make part of the new club premises available for the centre.

But if this is not found to be feasible, the committee will approach the Leichhardt Municipal Council for assistance.

They will ask the Council, which they say has already shown sympathy for their moves, to obtain subsidies for the use of a centre for Balmain and Rozelle pensioners.

Mr. Snell, Treasurer of the Balmain Branch, said this week he will strongly recommend that delegates be sent to the annual Old People's Exhibition at the Lower Town Hall, Sydney, from October 24 to 26.

He said the exhibition, arranged by the N.S.W. Council on the Ageing, would have available information extremely helpful to the committee in its bid to obtain a senior citizens' centre.

So far the committee has approached such local organisations as Rotary and Rotaract and the local churches and the R.S.L. for support. They hope galas and fetes may be arranged for funding of the centre.

The letter sent to these organisations says in part:
