

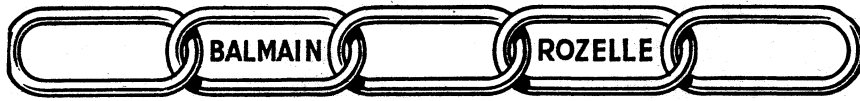

## Council Plan To Stop Street Parking Of Terminal's Cars

**Leichhardt Council last week decided to take action designed to prevent parking of cars by White Bay container terminal employees in Vincent, Grafton, Stephen and other streets in the vicinity.**

**This was done following a report that steps had been built recently within the terminal to provide pedestrian access from Stephen Street.**

A spokesman for the Maritime Services Board told The Link that the Board would not comment on the situation.

The decision to take action to protect local residents from the effects of car parking by terminal workers came from Council endorsement of a Mayoral Minute from Ald. N. Origlass (Balmain ward).

Ald. Origlass said it had come to his attention that steps had recently been built within the terminal providing pedestrian access from Stephen Street, Balmain, at the south-western corner of the dead end of the street below the area occupied by the liquid chemical storage depot occupied by Terminals Pty. Ltd.

### Purpose?

He said it seemed apparent that the purpose of this access was to enable employees at the container terminal to park their motor vehicles in Stephen and Vincent Streets and other streets in the area, and indeed on the vacant land on the south-eastern corner of Stephen and Vincent Streets owned by Terminals Pty. Ltd.

That company, said the Mayor, had undertaken to maintain this vacant land as a public children's playground during the period the company occupied its chemical tank farm on the other side of Stephen Street.

In view of the implied threats to the convenience, amenity and well-being of residents in Bal-

main, the Mayor considered that the following three actions be taken immediately:

1. **Protest in strongest possible terms to the M.S.B. against the erection of steps at the southern end of Stephen Street.**

These, he said, obviously intended to provide pedestrian access to the terminal, thereby encouraging parking of employees' vehicles in Balmain residential streets.

This would substitute for a facility that should have been incorporated in the terminal, and one that would have been insisted on by Council had the M.S.B. submitted a development application.

### Closure

2. **Effectively close off the southern end of Stephen Street by brickwork or other form of permanent construction to ensure that there is no access to or from the terminal at this location.**

3. **Obtain legal advice as to whether Council can force Terminals Pty. Ltd. to develop the vacant land it owns on the south-western corner of Stephen and Vincent Streets.**

This would be in accordance with its undertaking when development consent was granted to the company in respect to its liquid chemical depot.

If there were any doubt in that regard, the subject land be acquired by negotiation or, if necessary, resumption for development as a children's playground.

The Minute added:

"Council appreciates the parking problem affecting the terminal workers, but feels that they will see from the above that Council could not agree to its solution to the disadvantage of Vincent - Grafton - Stephen Streets' residents, especially in view of the fact that the Waterside Workers' Federation joined with Council in strong opposition to the location of the terminal — an attitude long since proved to be valid".

### "Illegal"

Ald. Origlass said that as the M.S.B. had failed to submit a development application for construction of the terminal above high water mark on land not owned by it on the "Appointed day" — June 27, 1951 — the present operation of the White Bay terminal was illegal.

In spite of Council's insistence that the Board honour its obligations

## BALMAIN PROBLEM —JOB SHORTAGE

Employment and local retailing in Balmain is suffering from a drop in waterfront work and the industry fears the Cockatoo Island Dockyard may completely shut down soon if a contract is not forthcoming.

**The secretary of the Painters' and Dockers' Union, Mr. I. Wyner, who is also a Balmain Ward alderman in the Leichhardt Municipal Council, said this week half the unemployed on his union lists came from the Leichhardt area.**

"We are very worried about it", he said.

"Of the 110 men we have out of work, there will be one quarter of them from Balmain itself, and another quarter from the Leichhardt Municipality alone.

"The rest come from various parts of the metropolitan area".

Other unions have also been hit hard with "put-offs" at Cockatoo and private waterfront firms in Balmain.

**The Boilermakers' and Blacksmiths' Association has seen a reduction in its membership at the dockyard from 240 to 32 in little more than a year, union organiser Mr Ray Engert said.**

Concern about the position has been expressed by the Federal Member for Sydney, Mr. Jim Cope, and the State Member for Balmain, Mr. Roger Degen.

Both are concerned that accurate unemployment figures for the Balmain area cannot be obtained from the Commonwealth Employment Service.

Mr. Wyner said the issue was complex but the Government had not taken any effective action:

• **Balmain firms who had sought Government assistance with a \$5 million plan to dredge the Parramatta River at Woolwich to cope with larger vessels had been given the "cold shoulder".**

• **There was delay about whether a "slave**

dock" contract would be awarded to Cockatoo Island Dockyard, but unless this was done 100 men would have to be put off — and the yard completely shut down.

• **No dock in Australia could handle new container ships for repairs or servicing.**

• **And overseas vessels, operating on the Australian trade, were sent overseas when repairs or servicing were necessary.**

"There are several inter-related problems about waterfront employment", he said. "There are some 50 overseas ships trading on the Australian coast. They don't give Australians any work at all".

These vessels were repaired either at Singapore, Panama or the United States.

"They skim the cream off the Australian trade but they give nothing in return. And repair and servicing makes up a lot of available work on the waterfront".

Mr. Wyner said another essential problem was a change in shipping.

"The present type of commercial vessel is being phased out of service", he said. "One line for instance, the Wilhelmsen Lines, now operate 26 'conventional' ships to Australia.

"These are to be phased out over the next

## Column NINE

### TERMINAL PARKING

There is reason for public concern at the gap in communication between the Maritime Services Board and Leichhardt Council over parking of White Bay terminal employees' cars in nearby Balmain streets.

If Council's fear is justified — that steps built on the terminal edge were to provide access to street car parking spots — its annoyance would be completely justified.

Such a problem, if faced by terminal employees, surely should have been foreseen by the M.S.B. when the terminal was built?

Council's strictness in requiring developers to provide off-street parking for traffic generated by developments is well known, and on the whole is essential.

This is so especially in an old suburb like Balmain, built before the motor age, where so many homes are without garages and where so many residents are forced to park in the streets.

The M.S.B. obviously has a responsibility to provide employee parking on its own premises and not to add to the problems faced by Balmain residents.

This question of out-of-town use of street parking spots in the inner suburbs of Sydney is a tender one, and is frequently solved by the placing of long-term restrictions on areas under pressure.

However, this would affect residents without home garages. And although residents have no legal right to street parking near their homes, public opinion gives them at least some priority.

The whole situation demands immediate discussions between the authorities involved — the M.S.B., Leichhardt Council and the traffic police.

## Leichhardt Oval Improvements For The Tigers

**Improvements estimated to cost \$30,000 will be made to No. 1 Oval, Leichhardt Park, to enable Balmain District Rugby League Football Club to return to it next year.**

Decision to that effect was made at last week's meeting of Leichhardt Council, which agreed that the cost would be borne equally by the club and the Council.

The question of granting a long term lease of the oval to the club will be considered at next week's meeting of Council.

The motion agreed to at last meeting was:

Council concurs with the aim of the Balmain District Rugby League Football Club to use No. 1 oval, Leichhardt Park, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays, and on two week nights from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. for training purposes—

Also to have exclusive catering rights at the oval during the period and also use of the car park on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays when it is not re-

quired for use by patrons of the Leichhardt Municipal Centre.

This will be subject to the payment of a rental of \$2,500 or 10 per cent of the gross takings of the club in respect of its use of the oval, whichever is the greater, on the basis of the following improvements to the oval and its buildings being completed before commencement of the season:

- Upgrading of existing toilets and construction of a women's toilet.
- Upgrading of the dressing rooms.
- Repairing and painting of seating of Nos. 1 and 2 grandstands.
- Repairing of perimeter seating.
- Repairing and painting of existing fences.
- Topdressing and repairing of the playing field where considered necessary.

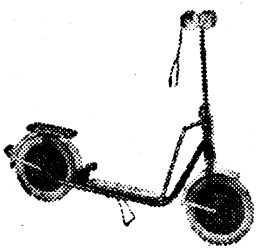
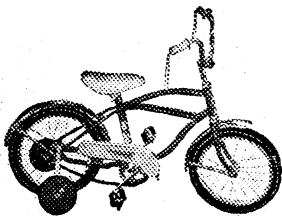
Cont. from Page 1 under the Local Government Act, it took advantage of its status as a Crown body to disregard Council and act illegally.

It was understood that in the development of the terminal, no provision was made for off-street parking of employees' and visitors' vehicles.

It was obvious, because of the queuing of laden and unladen vehicles in streets outside the terminal, little if any provision had been made within the terminal area for the standing of such vehicles, mainly of the heavy and articulated type awaiting loading and unloading.

During the construction of the terminal, added the Mayor, assurances had been given by the Board from time to time that, for security reasons, there would be only one access to and egress from the terminal — i.e., via Robert Street, so that Council could be assured that no container traffic would be using residential streets

six to eight months, being replaced by five container ships.

"These are 'floating boxes' of up to 100,000 or 150,000 tons and there is at present no dock in Australia capable of handling vessels of this size for repairs or servicing.

"Deputations to Canberra have not received any satisfaction about the establishment of such a dock in Australia".

Mr. Wyner said several Balmain waterfront firms had been worried by the lack of working space available.

"They conducted a survey at their own expense and found that by dredging a dock capable of handling vessels of at least 70,000 to 80,000 tons could be established at Woolwich", he said.

"However, when an approach was made to Canberra about it to get financial assistance — because the work would cost a lot, perhaps \$5 million — they got the 'cold shoulder'."

Canberra was also holding off a decision about whether a "slave dock" would be constructed at Cockatoo Island Dockyard.

Mr. Wyner said he had been informed by the manager in charge of production at Cockatoo Island Dockyard, Mr. R. Joselyn, that if this contract was not forthcoming, 100 of the present 1,000 men now employed there would have to be put off.

"If this happened, it would not be possible to continue operating the dockyard at all and it would have to shut down."

## Boarding Houses For Ex-Patients: Council's Report

The condition of boarding houses in Leichhardt Municipality used by former mental patients was reported on to Council at its last meeting by the Municipal Health Surveyor and Building Inspector, Mr. R. S. Williams.

The report had been sought by an alderman in view of publicity in Parliament and the Press.

Mr Williams said there were four such boarding houses in the municipality.

They were Lyndhurst, No. 1 Leichhardt Street, Leichhardt; No. 40 Denison Street, Rozelle; "Rob Boy", 25 Adolphus

Street, Balmain; and No. 123 Arundel Street, Glebe.

He said that No. 1 Leichhardt Street conformed to the requirements of Ordinance 42.

No. 40 Denison Street, conformed to that ordinance. However, instructions had been issued prior to Press statements to cleanse and renovate walls and ceilings of all rooms, corridors, stairways and common areas, and to paint them with approved washable paint of light colour.

That work had been completed.

Mr Williams said No. 25 Adolphus Street conformed to the requirements of Ordinance 42.

However, notices had been issued requiring the upgrading of amenities, repair or renewal of defective guttering and downpiping, and attention to an external wall.

That work had commenced and should be completed within four weeks (of date of report).

Regarding 123 Arundel Street, Glebe, Mr Williams said that on receipt of information that the premises were being used as a boarding house for patients discharged from psychiatric centres, an inspection was carried out and the proprietor advised to submit an application for registration.

In their present condition, he added, the premises did not conform to the requirements of Ordinance 42.

The matter of use had been referred to the Town Planner who had advised that a "Show cause" direction had been issued.

Mr Williams said the Press reference to No. 710 Darling Street, Rozelle, was incorrect in that the premises were not conducted as a boarding house and were not registered as such by Council.

## PRESIDENT OF R.S.L. ILL

The President of the Balmain - Rozelle R.S.L. Club, Mr. Tommy Hannan, has been admitted to the Balmain Hospital and will receive intensive care treatment for a few days.

It is not known how long he is likely to be in hospital.
