# HOME-OWNER PARKING?

Leichhardt Municipal Council is considering the introduction of "resident only parking"—which would regulate who could park in front of a house in a residential area.

The system is known as priority parking.

It means that the resident would have the priority to park in front of his house, and a sticker on his car would establish that priority. No one else could park there.

An extension of the plan would allow an outsider to park outside someone else's house if he were to pay something like about \$1 a day to the Council.

Leichhardt Town Planner, Mr. Arthur Kenna told The Link this week the money could be earmarked for provision of parking space in the future.

North Sydney and the City Council are also looking into the possibility of such a scheme.

However, they have received a rather cool reception from the Police Traffic Department whose responsibility it would be to enforce such a scheme.

Leichhardt Council is following closely developments in these two municipalities before it makes any positive steps itself. The City Council is expected to make a final decision on May 11.

If Leichhardt Council tries the scheme in the Balmain peninsula, it will co-operate Sergeant P. Hewson, who is in charge of traffic.

At this stage, he has not yet been approached.

The Link asked him what he thought of the idea.

"Things are tough enough already. It would certainly have its difficulties trying to enforce it", he said.

"This would mean a meeting between the powers that be, the Council that is, and the Superintendent of Police, and myself."

### Planner

Mr. McKenna said: "I think that eventually we'll have to face up to the problems of parking, especially in the shopping areas.

"So we're watching the position very closely in the other Councils.

"I say it's a good thing for the local residents. But there are many problems attached.

"We are treading very carefully at the moment. No decisions have been made. In fact we're waiting for the City Council's decision about whether they'll bring it in there, before we go any further".

Who would benefit from such a scheme, and who would possibly suffer?

In broad terms, it looks as though residents with a car but no off-street parking would gain. Shopkeepers and hoteliers, whose customers like to park outside, would probably suffer.

Shoppers and workers who naturally like to park close to where they are going would be frustrated. Indeed, where would they park at all if a large section of every street were marked off for residents only?

The Police Department would have a tremendously difficult new job on their hands trying to enforce the priority parking scheme.

"The fact is", says Mr. Arthur Cook, secretary of the City of Sydney parking advisory committee, "that Council administers off-street parking, and the police department must approve on-street parking.

"The registration of a car does not actually give anyone the right to park on a public street, only to drive on it", he says.

### Questions

Several more questions arise.

Firstly, have the Council and the Police Department between them the legislative right to proscribe who will park in public streets, and where?

Secondly, would the majority of ratepayers be happier with resident parking than with the present system?

The Link asked several residents what they think of the idea.

### Crazy

"I think it's crazy", said a mechanic who lives in Darling Street, near Birchgrove Road, and among a number of busy shops.

"I can always find somewhere to park not too far away. And what if you want to go and visit a mate and you can't park anywhere near his place?"

# Oldest Balmain Church Still Young At Heart

The oldest church in Balmain is also one of the liveliest.

This Sunday St. Mary's Church of England in Darling Street is celebrating the one hundred and twenty-fifth anniversary of its consecration.



The Archbishop, the Most Rev. Marcus Loane, will preach at the special anniversary service to be held at 3 p.m.

Representatives of the old and the new Balmain communities will all be there.

Even the organist, Mr. Alan Currie, will come back to play for the service — and he's being married in the church at 11 o'clock the day before!

"New blood in the church community is very strong", says the Rev. Hugh Voss, who has been minister of St. Mary's for about three and a half years.

"Among the members of the Church Council at the moment are two architects, two solicitors and an accountant".

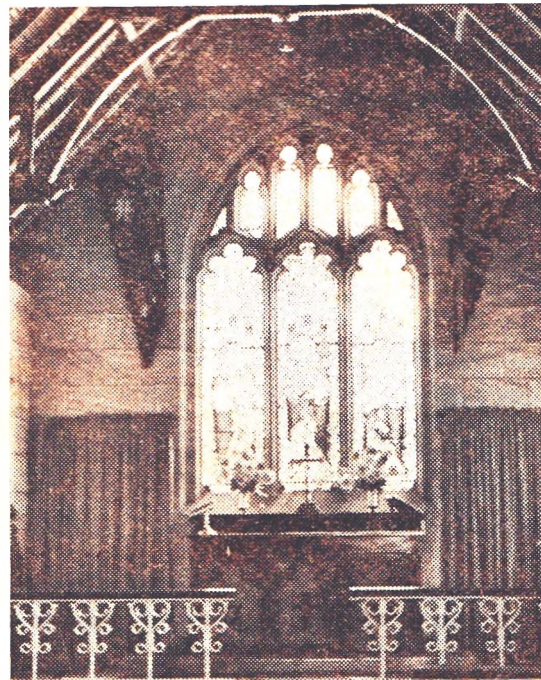
He is wonderfully proud of St. Mary's.

Way back in 1845 it was designed by Edmund Blacket, the famous architect who did all the best Gothic buildings in Sydney — including St. Andrew's Cathedral in town, and also the Great Hall at Sydney Uni.

In those days Balmain was a small seafaring community hardly changed from its original state when it was given to Dr. Fleet as a land grant.

Sailors, merchants,

convicts, boatmen and their women and children made up the first congregation of St. Mary's.

By 1850 they had already got themselves a splendid Hill organ, not a little pedal organ affair, but a full-blown pipe organ.

It is still being used today.

Continuing restoration work is done on it to keep it in good playing order.

The church's nave was extended in 1859. More recently the spire was

dismantled because it was considered unsafe. So for the time being St. Mary's is a church without a steeple.

But history it has in plenty. And a future too. The National Trust has classified it for preservation, and the congregation is keen.

The original baptismal register is still in use and probably will be for another fifty years, it is so enormous.

This important service at 3 p.m. on Sunday 10 May will be a landmark occasion.

## Sportsman Honoured

Once again a Balmain man has achieved top ranking in this State — this time in sport.

The news that Mr. Kevin Humphreys is to head the powerful N.S.W. Rugby League as president is welcomed by everyone in the district — after all, who doesn't follow the Tigers?

Only last month The Link reported the appointment of Mr. Arthur Dower as Chief Executive Officer at Balmain Hospital, replacing Mr. K. R. Boylan, who went on to become a commissioner in the new Health Commission. Both also have firm Balmain contacts.

The sport itself must gain from such an appointment — Mr. Humphreys has an outstanding reputation in Rugby League as a man and as an administrator.

The only unfortunate aspect of the move is that Mr. Humphreys will necessarily have to resign from his present stewardship of the Balmain Rugby League Football Club; his new position demands he be completely impartial.

But this will be somewhat alleviated by the early probability that Mr. Humphreys will take over the secretary / management of the Leagues' Club from Mr. "Latches" Robinson, one of League's greats who began his career with the Tigers in the 1920's.

No doubt, however, "Latches" will continue his association with the club.

Again, the football club secretaryship Mr. Humphreys must vacate is likely to be filled by another great Balmain player, Mr. Arthur Patton.

So perhaps it is not really a case of saying "Goodbye", but overall of saying "Hello".

## Out of Bed and into the Water!

The Sydney Shiverers are at it again — swimming exuberantly down at the Dawn Fraser Swimming Pool at Elkington Park while the rest of us are really shivering. Winner of the first event of the "winter" season was B. Pearce, followed by J. Arnold and K. Miranda.

For those who are a bit harder than the rest of us, here's a little information about the Shiverers, and how they came to Balmain.

They have 27 men members, 15 ladies and 14 children. Each Sunday at 11 am they get down at the pool and swim. hail, rain or (if everybody's lucky) shine.

The Domain Sydney Shiverers Amateur Swimming Club was formed in 1933 and they numbered among the regulars some of the stars of the time.

Here are some of them:

- F. Doyle, holder of the 100 yards freestyle Australian Title for 1925-26.

- B. Darke, who as a junior in 1952 (and at the tender age of 15 years) set five Australian records, including an amazing 19.25.1 sec. time for 1,650 yards freestyle.

- J. Devitt, who represented Australia at the 1965 Olympics in

Melbourne, coming second in the 100 metres freestyle; a member of the 1960 Olympic Rome 100 metres freestyle (winners) and in the same Games a member of the Australian Team 4x200 metres relay (third).

- K. Berry, who represented Australia in the 1964 Olympics and was first in the 200 metres butterfly.

- R. Casey, T.V. sporting commentator and club champion in 1949.

- and S. Battersby, who represented England in 1908 and 1912 in the Olympics.

YES. 1908! So now you know the calibre you are up against, no doubt you'll meet the challenge, and get down to the pool on Sunday. (Or maybe?) you'll roll over in bed.

But you'll never regret, if you are a true sportsman, that the group came to Balmain in 1967 when the Domain Baths were no longer available for winter use.

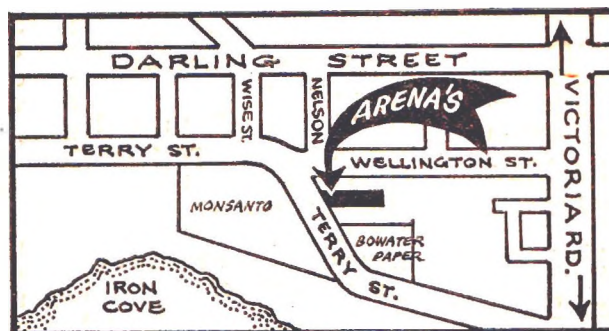
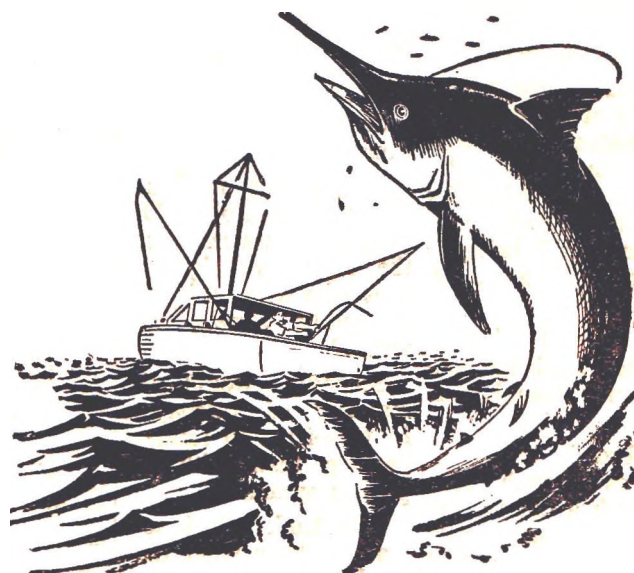

# Top R.F.L. Job Goes To Kevin Humphreys

Balmain Tigers' Club Secretary, Mr. Kevin Humphreys, will become No. 1 Executive of New South Wales football at a meeting at the R.F.L. Club, Sydney, next Monday night.

The 43-year-old chief of Balmain will be elected unopposed as president of the N.S.W. Rugby League.

His position became Secretary — laying the assured when on Monday night Mr. Alex Mackie, a vice-president of the N.S.W. League, officially declined nomination at an executive meeting.

Now observers expect a fresh approach to the problems of football administration in N.S.W.

The position became vacant when Mr. Bill Buckley, for years the guide of League football in this state, died two weeks ago.

Observers have no doubt Mr. Humphreys will also obtain the position of president of the Australian Rugby League, a position also held by Mr. Buckley when he died.

The appointment will mean Mr. Humphreys will resign as Balmain

Secretary — laying the position open here.

Most likely contender for the post is Mr. Arthur Patton, for many years assistant secretary.

The initial move by the general committee is expected to be the appointment of Mr. Patton as honorary secretary of Balmain Rugby League until the position is finally decided.

The odds are that he will get the position.

Other changes likely shortly at the club will be the retirement of Mr. "Latchem" Robinson as secretary/manager of the Balmain Leagues' Club.

"Latchem", known for most of his long life in Balmain Football, began his first-grade career with the club in 1924 — two weeks after his initial game he was selected for

the State side. By 1933 he had played some 100 games with the Tigers and in all totalled 12 matches representing the State.

Most likely successor to this position will be Mr. Humphreys, in addition to the new big job he is to enter.

Meanwhile, Balmain's loss is League's gain.

Mr. Humphreys' skill as a debater will assist the game's image. He is known as a "firm character" and will stand by his decisions.

His football career with the Tigers ranges from 1950 to 1957 in first grade League. His position was prop.

His official career with the club began in 1954 — he was still a playing team member at the time, and after retiring from active play he became chairman of the Balmain selectors.

Two years later he went on to the Balmain management committee, further taking on the position of honorary secretary of the club in 1965 and becoming full secretary the following year.

Mr. Humphreys has been Balmain delegate to the N.S.W. League for eight years and served on several committees, such as the executive committee.

corner in mostly-residential area said, "I prefer that people can park anywhere.

"I have trouble parking here myself but I park further up. It doesn't make any difference to me.

"If you go to the shop, or to see a friend, you need to park somewhere. Where?"

"My customers, of course, like to be able to park outside.

A young mother who lives close enough to the shops to walk to them nevertheless feels strongly in favour of the scheme.

### Favour

"We have one car which we park outside when we can", she said. "But our neighbouring family has two cars and two trucks which they park all along the street. As well as that there's a chappie here who sells trucks from here, trucks which he has parked in the street.

"There are two more trucks in the street, too, and the owner parks them on the footpath, fully loaded, and the footpath's caving in. We've already had that trouble in front of our place where a truck broke the path and the manhole grills".

Which brings up this question, how many vehicles can one family park with priority?

Another mother and business woman, who lives opposite a hotel, said, "I think it's a good idea".

"When I come home with the shopping on Thursday or Friday, which are the worst days, I have to park all the way around the block as often as not, and carry all the shopping from the car.

"If you were visiting people, then you'd just have to find somewhere else to park if priority applied outside their home.

"Parking is such a problem. People go and shop anywhere but in Balmain because they can't park. Town is as near as anywhere. Or Ryde. Or Roselands".

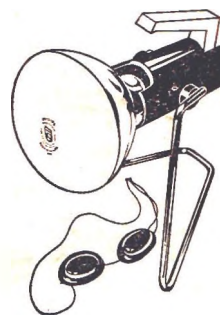

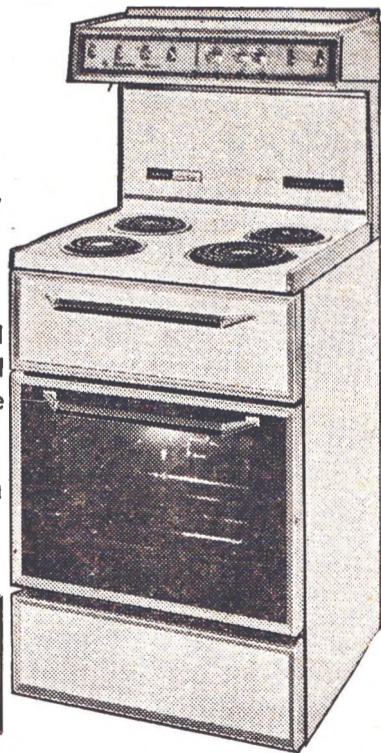

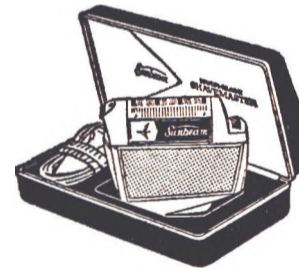
