# Council Challenged —Put Nurse On Road For Less Than \$6,000

The Citizens' T.B. League President, Mr. Andrew Gilchrist, has accused the Leichhardt Council of saving social service costs at the expense of the League while refusing a reasonable grant.

"If the Council can provide a nurse for home attention for less than \$6,000 a year, they are better administrators than we are," he said.

Mr. Gilchrist said the Council would only give \$400 towards the service this year, although the service was presently within the confines of the Municipality.

Yet the State Minister for Health, Mr. Jago, had donated \$1,000 and by so doing, the League had been entitled to a corresponding grant of \$1,000 from the Commonwealth.

## Extend

The League's need for \$25,000 through Operation Compassion was to extend the service into Drummoyne Municipality and provide a third nurse.

"We have the pa-

tients waiting", he said.

However, local support had begun with a burst but had fallen off, and total contributions had only reached \$6,500, he said.

The League was making a further appeal to local people for support.

Meanwhile, it had been decided that charges would be made for calls on patients who benefited by the Commonwealth Government's \$14 a week grant.

## Services

This was given to elderly people who were living with their families but requiring the services of a nurse at home.

This charge was \$1 a visit. Latest costs for such visits were \$1.51 a visit in 1970-71.

Mr. Gilchrist said the League kept down costs with two nurses working part time and overlapping their days to ensure weekend services for needy patients.

## No Overtime

These nurses were not paid at overtime rates at the weekends.

Even so it cost \$6,000 a year to pay the nurse, provide a vehicle and medical attention and supplies.

In June Mr. Gilchrist and the League Secretary, Miss Robyne Sutton, "confronted" Council over the \$400 grant.

Ald. McIlveen made an unsuccessful attempt to get \$1,000 for the League.

Mr. Gilchrist and aldermen engaged in a heated debate over the grant, with Council saying the League had ignored requests for information and Mr. Gilchrist saying he was willing to meet with aldermen at any time on this issue.

Council decided against increasing the previous grant of \$400.

# Development Plans Attract Interest

The people of Balmain Peninsula can take a pat on the back for civic interest — they showed a good "roll-up" at the Rozelle-based exhibition of development alternatives for the Leichhardt Municipality.

Town Planner (Co-Ordinating) Miss Penelope Pike told The Link this week she was pleased with the attendance so far at the exhibitions at Annandale, Leichhardt and Rozelle.

"So far about 600 people have turned up, and we hope for as many as 500 filled-out questionnaires from these people," she said.

"Many also filled out their views in the comment books made available at the exhibition".

Miss Pike said some people had merely "come along to see if their property was affected".

But many others had been genuinely interested and had thanked staff at the exhibitions for the opportunity to view and comment on decisions affecting the municipality, she said.

The exhibitions will end on Saturday, August 11, when the Glebe Town Hall finishes its

showing.

Then the Town Planning Section staff will assess the results of questionnaires and the comment books.

## Let's Cook

## No Natural Gas Base For Balmain

The disused Balmain Colliery will not be utilised as a natural gas reservoir, the Balmain Association has learned.

"It would seem that our major fear about the colliery being used as a natural gas reservoir has, at long last, been allayed," the Association reports in its latest newsletter.

The Association has received a copy of the "Report and Findings of the Commissioner" of the Natural Gas Pipeline Inquiry.

This report states that the "disused Balmain Colliery had been investigated and rejected as a possible reservoir for natural gas."

However, the Association was still concerned

about:

- the routes of the distribution system after entering the city gate.
- and any above ground installations.

The Association is keeping in touch with the relevant authorities on this, and has also offered assistance in any environmental impact study carried out on urban areas so affected.

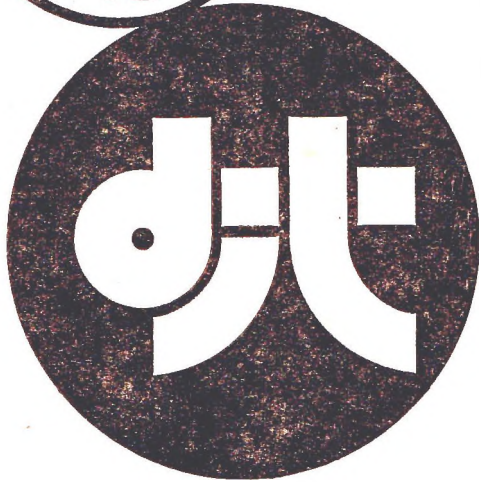

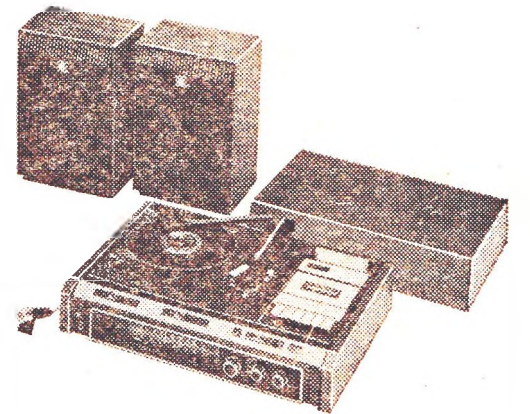

**Costs Problem—  
Boys' Union Tour  
To Fiji In Doubt**

The chance of local schoolboys taking part in a Rugby Union tour of Fiji shortly has struck a financial tangle.

Initially the boys were to have been boarded at a school hostel in Suva, but later information indicates it is to be demolished to make way for a school development programme.

Mr. Carl E. Hampson, of Rozelle Boys' High School, told The Link this week the schools of the Mid-Western Metropolitan Zone had attempted to keep costs an "internal matter."

"However, we feel that we have totally exhausted all avenues in this direction," he said.

"We must now appeal to commerce, industry and individuals for any financial assistance that may be forthcoming."

**Selection**

The tour is scheduled for the August-September secondary schools' break.

Twenty-five team members are to be decided at selection trials this week. Boys from Rozelle, Ibrox Park, Drummoyne, Newtown, Ashfield, Enmore, Fort Street and Tempe are under consideration.

"This venture is a 'first' for schoolboy rugby players and will afford invaluable experience for each and every lad fortunate enough to be finally selected as a member of the squad," Mr. Hampson said.

The target of \$7,500 was almost reached, but the extra cost of accommodation meant more help was needed.

Financing the tour had been a "major operation" at the respective schools since the beginning of the 1973 school year.

The boys had organised numerous social activities to raise funds, and similar activities had been arranged on a Zone basis.

"Community support, particularly at parent level, has really been overwhelming and we have almost reached our forecast target," he said.

But the latest news from Fiji could mean no tour, he said.

## Garden Corner

Howdy do, the early Spring-type weather has certainly sent old mother nature haywire again. So many flowers, orders, flowering shrubs all bursting into colour just a little too soon, but not to worry. This gives all gardeners a chance to plan and prepare for later months—gives them incentive too!

With this type of weather be it now or September, it's an idea to repot, prepare baskets, larger pots, window boxes and perhaps tubs. Ferns can be divided. Use a fresh light sandy soil or a good brand of potting mix. Have you any of the old fashioned, hardy bulbergias? At present they are starting to flower well. They look attractive in baskets because they contain the green all year round and mix well alongside other greenery. Don't forget your indoor gardens as well. A new bowl,

fresh potting mix, add stones or shells, a small garden ornament just to change the scene. Also, use a liquid or soluble plant food. It brings results. The Citrus need attention too, if in the ground, gently dig in the citrus food around the circumference of plant. If your citrus trees are in tubs, dig in the citrus food but be very careful not to use too much as the tree will shed its leaves.

Children like to garden and with holidays coming on, why not let them have a small plot of their own, or small pots, seeds, seedling plants, vegetables, herbs that they can care for. For little people planting, use an old salt shaker to disperse the seeds. Leave that section say 7 days then plant the rest. Just a hint — any fertilizer left over add it to the compost heap and keep the heap well raked. Barbara.
