Details were released this week by the Minister for Public Works, Mr Leon Punch.

A contract for \$1,386,737 has been let to the St. Leonards firm of McDonald Constructions Pty Ltd for design and construction work at Rozelle.

Residents' spokesmen told the meeting they had been informed that the Rozelle wharf was not in use and could cope with a limited number of containers within three months.

An increase in this number could be ac-complished within another three months.

Further, a portion of the Darling Harbour

A Smith St. resident clearing an over-grown proprietor of a pest control service, confirmed spiders were funnelwebs and arranged for one to be delivered to the Commonwealth Serum Laboratories at Crows Nest.

Mr Minty said he had never seen a funnelweb during his 14 years working as a pest exterminator in the Balmain

Spokesmen for The Australian Museum and the Serum Laboratories said that although fairly unusual, it was not impossible there were funnelwebs in Balmain.

arning to Local Residents

Both said they had no recent records of the spider in Balmain but said any sandstone area attracted funnelwebs and warned residents to watch out for them.

The funnelweb's poison and, because of its size, the large amount it can inject when it bites, makes it deadly

There is no antidote to the funnelweb's poison.

The spider is mostly found in the North Shore areas of Sydney, where it thrives, but has been discovered as far away as Nowra, Menai and even Kings Cross.

The last known death from a funnelweb bite was in Nowra about three years ago.

NO VACCINE

The spokesman for the serum laboratories said a potential problem for Balmain residents was the large amount of sandstone landscaping which has taken place in recent years.

"The likelihood of funnelwebs would be increased if any sandstone from the north shore or

in the landscaping," he

said.
"While all hospitals are supplied with vaccine for Red Back spider bites there is none for funnelwebs.

"They do have plastic display charts clearly identifying funnelwebs and anyone suspecting a bite should try to take the spider to the hospital to be identified," he said.

The laboratories will accept any spiders for identification at the office in Willoughby Rd., Crows Nest and give advice on funnelwebs.

They maintain a colony of 600 funnelwebs at Crows Nest and periodically milk them of venom to be sent to Melbourne for research into discovering an antidote.
