

Balmain Public School's six striking teachers have returned to work following an undertaking by the State Education Department to do its utmost to provide a remedial teacher by the end of next month.

The domestic architect was not far behind in seeing the advantages of the new application. The era of timber panelling in bathrooms had arrived.

Other considerations were increased storage. The linen press was not getting any bigger.

Timber gave the versatility to provide this further storage space.

The choice lies between solid timber and waterproof plywood for the panelling and cupboards. For flat surfaces, such as the top of the vanity, glued laminated timber gives the wide widths required

and matches the whole timber theme.

As with all other materials the timber or plywood can only perform if a few simple precautions are observed.

If fixed to brickwork, place a polyethylene sheet between the brickwork and the battens. This will stop any takeup of moisture by the masonry. The plastic sheet is not necessary with timber framed construction, there is ample ventilation to evaporate any condensation.

Keep the wood up from contact with the floor, otherwise some end penetration can take place. This will not happen to the face.

A recessed kickboard in place of a skirting will hide inequalities between the floor and the bottom of the panelling and minimise damage caused by even careful cleaning.

Finish the face of the wood with a clear plastic coating rather than a
